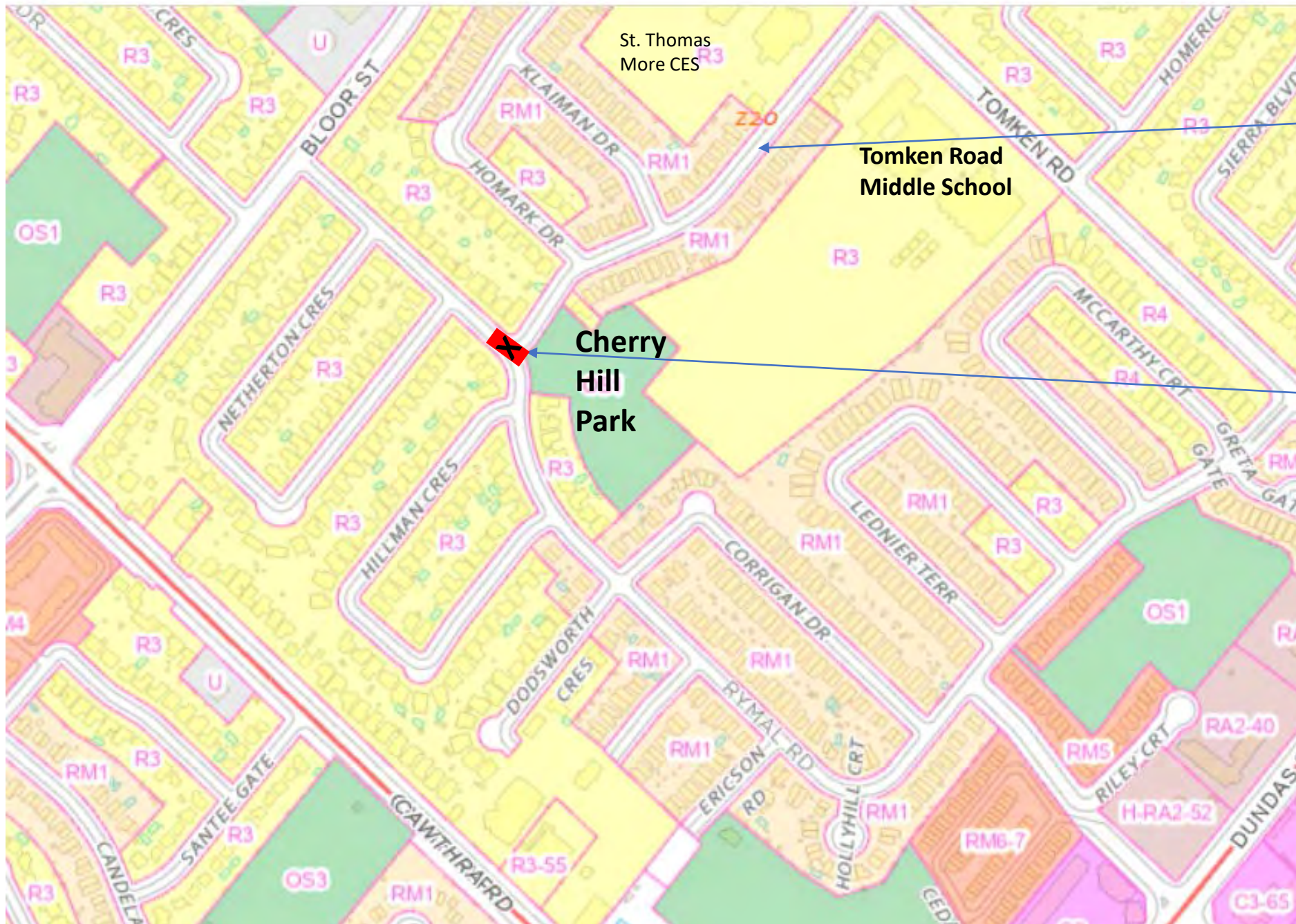

ISSUE: No Stopping at the 3-way  sign at Rymal Rd. & Flagship Dr.

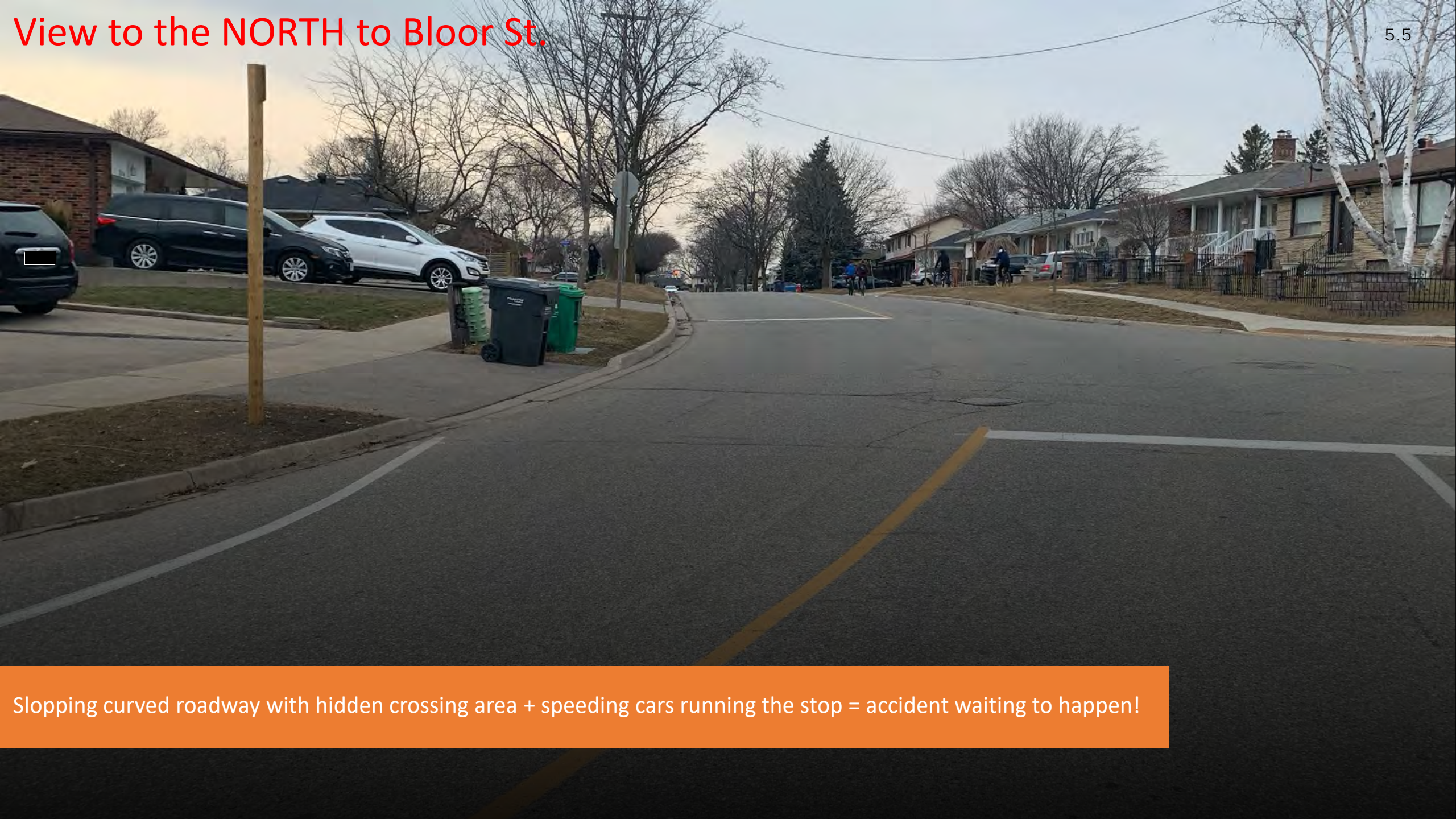
View to the SOUTH east

View to the NORTH to Bloor St.

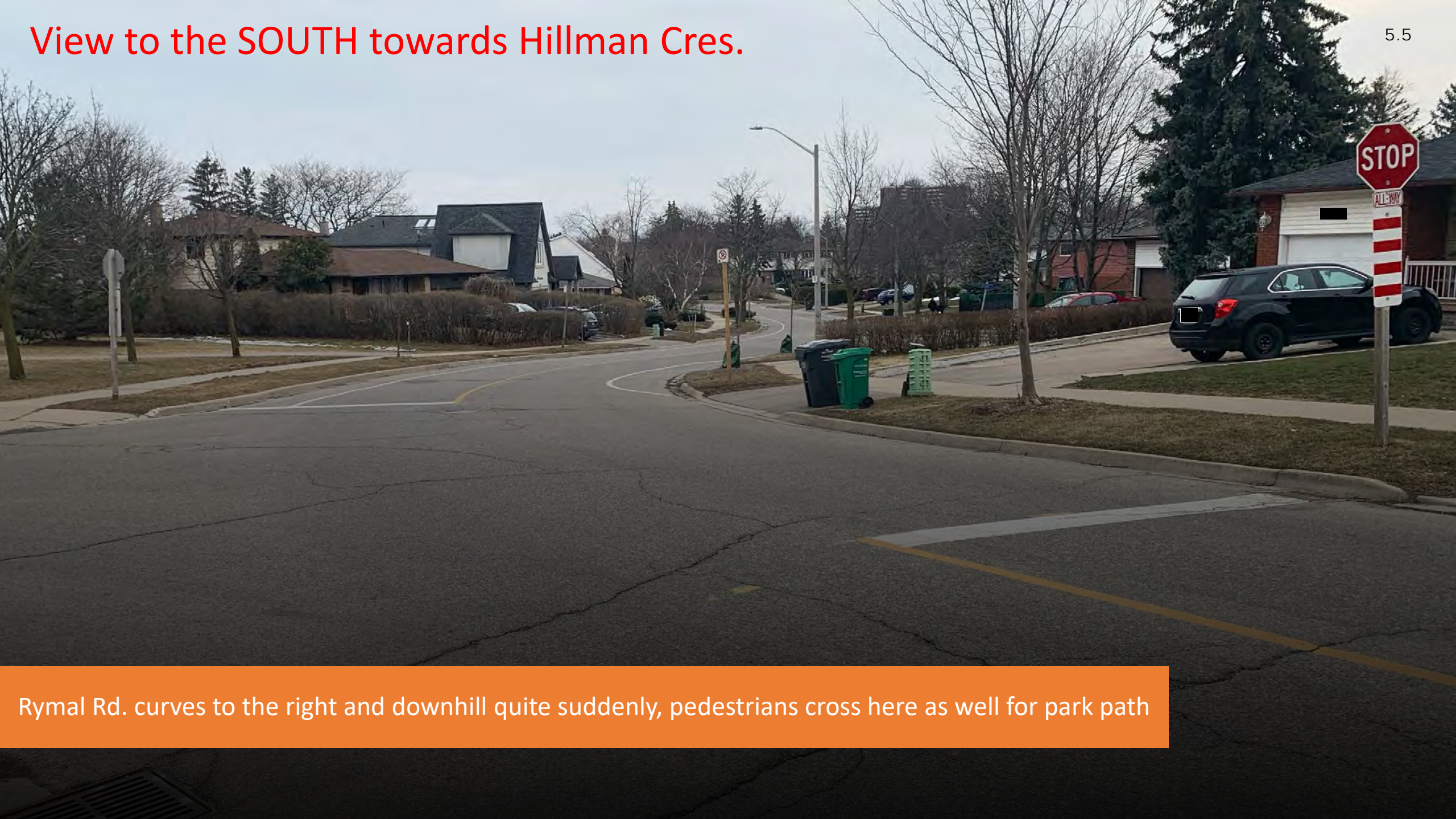

Neighbourhood is heavily skewed to families with small children and park usage has increased because of COVID


1. Community video showing the STOP sign concerns at Rymal & Flagship was sent to council and we would appreciate you viewing the live action NON-STOP insanity. STOP sign is merely a suggestion on Rymal and needs to be addressed.

2. Community Petition Results:

- **35 Residences** on Rymal Road from Bloor St. to Hillman Cres. were contacted.
- 80% of these residents agree that **speeding is a major problem**, and that action needs to be taken, before a serious accident or major injury occurs.
- **80% (27 residents) support traffic calming measures on this stretch.**
- In addition to the speed and non-stopping of vehicles at the neighbourhood stop signs, it has been noticed, by several residents, that there is also a **noticeable** increase in traffic using Rymal Road south as a detour, presumably to access Tomken Road towards Dundas.
Specifically, after the traffic lights were installed at the Bloor/Rymal corner.
