MiWay 2022 and 2023 Bus Procurement, Subject to ICIP-MIS-01 Funding Approval

Recommendation

- 1. That the report entitled "MiWay 2022 and 2023 Bus Procurement, Subject to ICIP-MIS-01 Funding Approval" dated September 20, 2021 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works be approved.
- 2. That the funds of \$183,400,000 be pre-authorized, subject to ICIP Funding Approval, to allow the 2022 and 2023 procurement of 2nd Generation Hybrid-Electric buses by competitive procurement as outlined in the corporate report dated September 20, 2021 entitled "MiWay 2022 and 2023 Bus Procurement, Subject to ICIP-MIS-01 Funding Approval" from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works and that the City of Mississauga contributes 26.7% of total project costs, while the Federal and Provincial government will fund the remaining total project costs (40.0% and 33.3% respectively).

Executive Summary

- The ICIP-MIS-01 (Bus Replacement Program) will provide much needed funding to allow MiWay to replace roughly MiWay public transit buses between 2021 and 2027.
- MiWay is seeking budget approval to move forward with the two-year procurement of 2nd
 Generation Hybrid-Electric buses which has been proven within the transit industry to
 reduce emissions and increased fuel efficiency compared to diesel buses. The multi-year
 procurement will allow MiWay the advantage of economies of scale for price advantages.
- As part of the two year bus procurement between 2022 and 2023, MiWay is expected to replace 165 buses which equates to 34% of its total fleet. There will be another (82) buses the following year in 2024.
- MiWay is seeking pre-approval of \$183,400,000 to purchase buses over a two year period (2022 and 2023). Mississauga will need to contribute 26.7% of total project costs, while the Federal and Provincial government will fund the remaining total project costs (40.0% and 33.3% respectively). The municipal portion of funds is equal to \$48,912,780.

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Background

Hybrid-Electric Bus Procurement

On September 4th 2019, Council authorized the pre-approval of \$13,200,000 for the 2020 Capital Budget to purchase Eleven (11) Sixty-Foot Express Growth Buses with 2nd Generation Hybrid-Electric propulsion technology. At the time, this would allow MiWay to gain operational experience ahead of the larger multi-year procurement. This will also allow the City to apply and receive ICIP funding that would alleviate some of the City's financial pressure. As of September 2021, MiWay has been operating their forty-foot hybrid-electric buses for two years, their sixty-foot hybrid-electric buses for one year, and have an additional (5) sixty-foot local hybrid-electric buses on order to be delivered by October 2021. With recent operational experience with these buses, MiWay is seeing great benefits of this technology from a fuel savings, GHG reduction, and reliability perspective, and are confident that hybrid-electric buses are a feasible stepping stone for MiWay's journey to a fully zero-emission transit fleet.

Transit Bus Fleet Replacement Schedule

As part of the two year procurement between 2022 and 2023, MiWay is expected to replace 165 buses which equates to 34% of its total fleet. There will be another (82) buses in 2024.

The replacement of the 2003 and 2005 New Flyers have already been deferred due to the anticipation of the ICIP funding announcement, as well as decreased capital expenditures due to COVID. As a result, these buses have been operating for 3 years past their expected life and are receiving 21% more maintenance to remain serviceable. This indicates we are already seeing serviceability issues that will now accelerate due exceedance of life cycle. Currently, MiWay has parked (28) buses due to extensive engine, transmission, and/or structural issues, which have been deemed as cost-ineffective to repair. With projected service increases over the coming months and years, MiWay will need to replace these buses as soon as possible to maintain service levels.

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The key advantage of a multi-year procurement is economies of scale prices since this will be a larger than typical order for MiWay. At the same time, this would allow OEMs to better plan for design and production schedules if orders are committed in advance, which would reduce risks of delivery delays. Prices will also be locked in throughout the duration of the multi-year procurement contract, therefore municipal capital budgets will be better informed of expected costs in the coming years.

Facility Infrastructure Requirements - Central Parkway (CP) Garage

As per the Climate Change Action Plan, in order for the City to meet the interim target of 40% reduction in GHG's compared to 1990 levels, as well as the target of 80% by 2050, MiWay has committed to only purchasing hybrid-electric buses going forward. In order to operate these buses out of the main bus facility, MiWay is currently undertaking a facility modification project at the Central Parkway (CP) bus storage garage to accommodate hybrid-electric buses which are taller than diesel buses. The facility modification project will raise the ductwork and associated mechanical infrastructure to accommodate the taller buses. This project has already commenced and is expected to be completed by early 2022.

Comments

ICIP Funding Approval for MIS-01 – Bus Replacement Program

The Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) is a ten-year federal infrastructure program designed to create long-term economic growth, build inclusive, sustainable and resilient communities and support a low-carbon economy. Through ICIP, the Federal government is providing \$33B in federal infrastructure funding to cost-share projects. On July 22, 2019, the Government of Ontario launched the ICIP Public Transit funding stream for inside the GTHA. Under the Public Transit Stream, funding allocations to municipalities and Metrolinx were established using a ridership formula. The City of Mississauga was allocated \$339M in federal funding and \$282.5M in provincial funding with a required City cost share of \$226M. Although an allocation has been provided, the ICIP Public Transit Stream is application based.

In October 2019, following Council approval, the City of Mississauga submitted applications for funding consideration in order to utilize the full funding allocation. As a result of MiWay's application submission, the ICIP-MIS-01 (Bus Replacement Program) is pending approval by the Ministry of Transportation, which will provide much needed funding to allow MiWay to purchase and replace aging public transit buses from now until 2027.

As part of the ICIP-MIS-01 (Bus Replacement Program), the total funding amount for the purchase of MiWay buses is \$359,700,000 between 2021 and 2027. Mississauga will need to contribute 26.7% of total project costs, while the Federal government will fund 40%, and the Provincial government will fund the remaining 33.3% of project costs. The table below shows the funding sources, % contribution, and total funding amounts that were approved.

Strategic Plan

The introduction of FCEBs would contribute to two strategic goals: **Move** (Develop Environmental Responsibility) and **Green** (Lead and Encourage Environmentally Responsible Approaches). Mississauga has been proactive in sustainability and climate change governance for over two decades. This includes joining the FCM Partners for Climate Protection program in 1999, integrating climate change and environmental considerations into the City's Strategic Plan in 2009, developing the City's Living Green Master Plan, integrating climate change considerations into its Official Plan in 2012, and becoming a signatory to the Global Covenant of Mayors for Climate and Energy (coalition of 10,000 Cities) in 2017.

Financial Impact

MiWay is seeking pre-approval of \$183,400,000, subject to ICIP Funding Approval, to purchase buses over a two year period (2022 and 2023). The 2022 Business Plan & Budget has the following budget request for 2022-2023 bus replacement program and the funding sources which are being requested for pre-approval through this Corporate Report.

The municipal portion of \$48,912,780 is funded with Tax Debt account 37778.

Historically, it takes on average twelve months for buses to be delivered to the City of Mississauga, therefore it is important that the funds are pre-approved ahead of the 2022 Business Plan & Budget in order to receive the buses in an appropriate timeframe.

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Conclusion

The ICIP-MIS-01 (Bus Replacement Program) is a much needed investment in public transit for the City of Mississauga. The purchase of hybrid-electric buses to replace aging diesel buses that have well surpassed their useful lives will lead to transit improvement outcomes including improved capacity of public transit infrastructure, and improved quality, safety, and access of our transit system.

If council pre-approves the funds required to purchase public transit buses and an ICIP Funding announcement is made soon, this will enable MiWay to catch up on previously deferred bus replacements. Replacing diesel buses with cleaner, fuel efficient, and proven hybrid-electric buses will mark a milestone for the City's commitment to a cleaner propulsion technology.

MiWay Fare Strategy - 2022

Recommendation

- 1. That the MiWay fees and charges, as outlined in Appendix 1 attached to the Corporate Report dated September 2, 2021 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works entitled "MiWay Fare Strategy 2022" be approved.
- 2. That a consolidated fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2022, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish new, revised, and existing MiWay fees and charges, effective for the Transportation and Works Department as outlined in the Corporate Report dated September 2, 2021 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works entitled, "MiWay Fare Strategy 2022".

Executive Summary

- MiWay's ridership and fare revenues are gradually recovering but full recovery to 2019 levels is expected to take several years.
- MiWay's priority for the remainder of 2021 and into 2022 is to ensure that the transit system remains a safe and reliable travel option for all and to gain back lost ridership by restoring confidence in our service.
- MiWay's 2022 fare strategy focus is on ridership recovery and to balance value for money paid. A fare increase is not the best approach of restoring our fare revenue amidst the COVID-19 pandemic.

 Amidst the recovery phase of COVID-19, MiWay is recommending no increase to regular fares in 2022. Staff recommend a reduction to the Adult PRESTO monthly pass price from \$135 to \$131. Other changes include U-Pass (UTM Student pass) rate changes to reflect current agreement, extending the Senior off-peak \$1 cash fare to PRESTO by using the time of use payment option. Charter service rates and Transitway access & onstreet infrastructure permit review fees will be adjusted to reflect inflation.

- Fare products (Senior Photo ID and U-Pass discount applied in 2021) that are no longer required will be removed from the by-law. PRESTO loyalty program will be added to the by-law following internal audit recommendation.
- The year to date revenue as of August 31, 2021, is \$26M compared to \$54M in 2019 which is 48% of the 2019 year to date revenues. MiWay anticipates 2021 revenue recovery to reach 57% and then 75% in 2022 of the 2019 levels. Revenue shortfalls of \$39M and \$23M are expected for 2021 and 2022, respectively.

Background

The COVID-19 pandemic abruptly disrupted life in Mississauga for its residents, its businesses, its visitors, and the city government and the services it provides. Through 2021, provincial reopening phases and new lockdowns has resulted in fluctuating ridership demand and significantly impacted MiWay revenues.

The priority for MiWay is to ensure the transit system remains a safe and reliable travel option for all, and to gain back lost ridership by restoring confidence in our service. Following the provincial re-opening phases, the city is re-opening to support business and economic recovery. MiWay customers are coming back and the pace of the city's recovery is being closely monitored.

MiWay generated \$90M in revenues in 2019 before COVID-19 pandemic. We will use 2019 revenues as the benchmark to which MiWay is referring to as we continue to work towards full recovery of ridership and revenue.

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In 2020, annual revenue shortfall was \$48M and MiWay anticipates 2021 revenue recovery to reach 57% with expected revenue loss of \$39M and to reach 75% of revenue recovery in 2022 with \$23M expected revenue loss. However, unknowns and uncertainties around student and commuter ridership markets and the possibility of changing restrictions on businesses and travel still remain a major concern while we're going through the 4th wave of COVID-19.

On November 25, 2020, Council enacted By-law 0251-2020, implementing the 2021 MiWay fares, fees and charges. This MiWay Fare Strategy report sets out the MiWay transit fares, fees and changes for 2022 and if approved, it will be added into the consolidated User Fees and Charges By-law.

Comments

The recovery of transit ridership and fare revenue to pre-COVID-19 level is expected to be gradual. MiWay continues to closely monitor the fare collection and ridership trend to better understand changing travel demand, measure the pace and the degree of recovery across the city in order to more accurately forecast the future needs and revise plans to operate transit.

As operating costs increases each year, a fare increase is also recommended yearly to help offset baseline budget increases due to inflationary pressures and operational requirements. However, under the COVID-19 pandemic and the recovery phase, the negative financial impact is unavoidable and MiWay's primary focus is on ridership recovery, a fare increase is not the best approach of restoring our fare revenue. Recovering lost revenue to manage deficit and increase overall revenue for the City must come from riders returning to the system while striving to balance value (service provided) for money paid (customer).

MiWay continues to promote PRESTO card utilization to support paperless and contactless payment as a safe and convenient way to pay fare. This encourages to minimize cash fare collection. Currently, MiWay fares collected is approximately 85% from PRESTO, 11% from cash and 4% from other pass and ticket products.

Accordingly, MiWay is recommending no regular fare increase effective January 1, 2022, except changes to the following:

- Adult PRESTO Monthly Pass Price Reduction
- Senior off peak \$1 fare
- U-Pass (UTM Student pass) rates
- Charter service rates
- Mississauga Transitway Access fee and MiWay Stop Infrastructure Permit Review fee
- Removal of fare products that are no longer required
- Adding PRESTO loyalty program to fees and charges

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Adult PRESTO Monthly Pass Price Reduction

MiWay recommends that effective April 01, 2022, Adult PRESTO Monthly Pass price decrease by \$4 to \$131. During the COVID-19 pandemic, travel needs for regular customers with commuter pattern (traveling weekday peak periods) have changed and demand decreased.

Thus, MiWay has lost monthly pass users at a higher rate when compared to non-monthly pass users. A PRESTO monthly pass price reduction from \$135 to \$131 would provide better value to our loyal customers who opted out from monthly passes during the pandemic and attract them back to monthly commitment to MiWay during the recovery phase. No change to Senior PRESTO monthly pass price is recommended.

This change also supports fare integration objectives with Brampton Transit in anticipation of future Hurontario LRT service. Brampton Transit's Monthly Pass price has been \$128 for over the last two years.

An increase in the total sales of the Adult PRESTO Monthly Pass is anticipated and this is expected to offset any potential revenue loss from the price reduction.

As a result of the reduction in price for Adult PRESTO Monthly Pass, effective April 01, 2022 Discounted Adult PRESTO Monthly Pass supporting Affordable Transit Program in partnership with Peel Region will be also reduced from \$67.50 to \$65.50 as this price is set at 50% of Adult PRESTO Monthly Pass.

Senior Off-Peak \$1 Fare

In 2017, Council approved the implementation of the senior \$1 cash fare during off-peak hours (Weekdays from 8:30am to 3:30pm and after 7pm, and all day Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays) to encourage and support seniors by offering an affordable transit fare option.

With completion of upgrade to all PRESTO devices in MiWay fleet, MiWay is able to introduce time of use fare payment to PRESTO in spring of 2022. This will allow our buses to accept the off peak \$1 fare using PRESTO senior cards in addition to the existing \$1 cash fare option. As a result, MiWay is recommending to change the name from Senior \$1 Cash Fare to Senior Off-Peak \$1 Fare. A potential revenue loss of about \$135K is expected from current senior PRESTO customers who will now benefit from \$1 off peak fare via PRESTO as opposed to paying the regular senior fare of \$2.10.

This would encourage more seniors to switch from paying cash fare to paying PRESTO fare and reduce number of cash transactions and thereby support the Corporate Cashless City Initiative. In addition, MiWay is currently undertaking a review of future fare payment options through PRESTO open payment and e-ticketing solutions to promote non-cash payment and improve customer experience of purchasing and paying fare when using MiWay.

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U-Pass - UTM Student Pass

In February 2020, UTM and the City of Mississauga re-negotiated the agreement and the new three-year agreement effective September 1, 2020, has been fully executed. Due to COVID-19 pandemic and as was approved by Council, the following changes have taken place to the U-Pass program: 2020 and 2021 Summer U-Pass program was cancelled, discount of \$15 per eligible students for 2020 Fall U-Pass program, additional discount of \$79.77 per eligible students for 2021 Winter U-Pass program. However, 2021 Fall/Winter U-Pass program started without any changes or discounts on September 01, 2021 as per agreement.

The new U-Pass fee for fall/winter and summer terms of 2022 as per the U-Pass agreement are provided in the table below.

MiWay Charter Service Rate

MiWay is recommending a 0.8% fee increase to help offset baseline hourly operating cost (Operator's hourly rate and Bus operating maintenance cost) increases due to inflationary pressures. The changes are provided in the table below.

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Mississauga Transitway Access fee and MiWay Stop Infrastructure Permit Review fee

MiWay is recommending a 0.8% fee increase to help offset baseline hourly operating cost increases due to inflationary pressures. The changes are provided in the table below.

Removal of Fare Products

MiWay is recommending removing two (2) fare products from 2022 Transit Fares.

- Senior Photo ID Card new and replacement this elimination is due to low demand and other available forms of Government issued ID.
- Discounted U-Pass 8 month fee (effective September 18, 2020) this was a one-time discount fee to eligible students of the 2020/2021 Fall/Winter U-Pass program.

PRESTO Loyalty Program

MiWay introduced PRESTO in 2011 and rolled out the PRESTO loyalty program in 2012 to encourage customers to pay fare via PRESTO. This loyalty program was approved by Council however, it was not included in the Fees and Charges By-Law back in 2011. Following internal audit recommendation, MiWay is including the PRESTO loyalty program into the 2022 Fees and Charges By-Law.

The terms of the loyal program is that when you pay with PRESTO for 12 rides during one-week (Monday to Sunday), you ride free on MiWay for the remainder of the week. About 0.5% of MiWay PRESTO customers benefit from this loyalty program.

The current and recommended Mississauga fare pricing listed in Appendix 1 is consistent in most categories when compared with other GTHA transit systems. A comparison of GTHA transit fares is provided in Appendix 2.

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Strategic Plan

The growth and investment in transit contributes to the strategic pillar of Developing a Transit Oriented City and the strategic goals of:

- Build a Reliable and Convenient System
- Ensuring Youth, Older Adults and New Immigrants Thrive
- Ensuring Affordability and Accessibility
- Attract and Retain Youth

Financial Impact

No significant revenue impact is expected from the fee changes proposed in the 2022 Fare Strategy report as it is aimed at recovery of ridership. Revenue recovery continues to be gradual as riders are coming back slowly to MiWay and revenue shortfall from the COVID-19 impact is unavoidable.

MiWay anticipates revenues will achieve 57% of 2019 levels by the end of 2021 and 75% by end of 2022. Revenue shortfall of \$39M and \$23M is expected for 2021 and 2022, respectively. \$23M revenue shortfall for 2022 also includes potential \$135K revenue loss from introducing Senior off peak \$1 fare using PRESTO senior cards.

Conclusion

Following Federal and Provincial re-opening schedule, the City is re-opening to support business and economic recovery and customers are slowly coming back to the transit system. The year to date as of August 31, 2021 revenue was \$26M compared to \$54M in 2019 which is 48% of the 2019 year to date revenues. MiWay continues to closely monitor fare collection and ridership trends to prepare for the recovery and be more strategic.

MiWay's priority for the remainder of 2021 and into 2022 is to ensure the transit system remains a safe and reliable travel option for all and to gain back lost ridership by restoring confidence in our service to continue pursuing sustainable growth.

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During this recovery phase of COVID-19, MiWay is recommending no increase to regular fares in 2022 except Adult PRESTO Monthly Pass reduction from \$135 to \$131.Other fee changes include U-Pass (UTM Student pass) rate changes as per the agreement, extending the Senior off peak \$1 fare via PRESTO using time of use payment function from PRESTO device upgrade, Charter service rates, Transitway Access Permit fee and MiWay Stop Infrastructure Permit Review fee adjustments for inflation.

Fare products (Senior Photo ID and U-Pass discount applied in 2021) that are no longer required will be removed from the By-law and PRESTO loyalty program will be added to the by-law following internal audit recommendation.

- That the Transportation and Works Department fees and charges, as outlined in Appendix 1 and Appendix 2, attached to the Corporate Report dated September 13, 2021 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works entitled "2022 Transportation and Works Fees and Charges" be approved.
- 2. That a by-law be enacted to make the necessary amendments to Schedule B-2 of the User Fees and Charges By-law 0251-2020, as amended, in order to reflect direct costs as they are charged for works undertaken by the City on behalf of a third party for engineering, construction, maintenance, traffic and street lighting works, including payroll burden (35%), as set out in the Corporate Report dated September 13, 2021 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works entitled, "2022 Transportation and Works Fees and Charges".
- 3. That a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2022, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish new, revised, and existing fees and charges for the Transportation and Works Department as outlined in the Corporate Report dated September 13, 2021 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works entitled, "2022 Transportation and Works Fees and Charges."

Executive Summary

- This report is the annual review of fees and charges for the Roads, Regulatory and Stormwater Service Areas in the Transportation and Works department.
- Review and revisions have been made to the current fees and charges to reflect increased costs and to ensure fees are comparable to fees charged in surrounding municipalities.

 Maintenance on existing fees and charges includes renaming existing fees, new fees, deletion of existing fees and some fees being split into two or more to reflect work required, and in some cases utilizing cost recovery methodology based on the direct cost plus administration fee.

 The Enforcement Division is improving the process to simplify the updating of the fees and charges that are in 14 different regulatory by-laws, by removing the fees from the regulatory / licensing by-laws and consolidating all applicable fees and charges into the 2022 User Fees & Charges By-law.

Background

Each year, the Transportation and Works Department undertakes a review of the fees and charges charged under the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25. The fees and charges include fees for administrative and other services/products provided by the department.

Fees and charges provide revenue to support services which provide benefits to specific individuals and organizations, rather than all residents. Ensuring fees and charges increase to maintain cost recovery ratios and cover cost increases helps to reduce pressure on the City's tax levy requirements. If fees do not increase to cover costs, tax support for the program or service must increase and is paid by all residents rather than those that benefit from the services.

On November 25, 2020, Council enacted By-law 0251-2020, implementing the 2021 Transportation and Works fees. This report sets out the proposed fees and charges for 2022. The 2022 fees and charges, if approved through this report, will be included as part of a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

Comments

Transportation and Works fees and charges have been thoroughly reviewed and revisions have been made to reflect increased costs. In general, fees and charges have been increased by the rate of inflation which has been estimated at 0.8%. This rate may be slightly higher when amounts are rounded to whole numbers. Municipal benchmarking comparisons have been conducted for the current/proposed fees and are comparable to fees charged in surrounding municipalities.

Fee increases or new fees are generally as a result of increased administrative and production costs or new services provided.

It should be noted that no changes are being proposed to the deposit amounts outlined in the Schedule "A" Road Occupancy Permit By-law 0173-2020 and the Schedule "A" of Lot Grading and Municipal Services Protection Deposit By-law 0172-2020.

Works Operations and Maintenance Division – Maintenance Contracts

- Construct Concrete Headwall (300 mm 450 mm pipe diameter) \$508.80 per square metre
- New Headwall Construction (no culvert works) Fee has been split into two fees to reflect work required.
- New Block Headwall Construction (up to 300 mm pipe diameter) (no culvert works) -\$680.52 per square metre
- New Concrete Headwall Construction (300 mm to 450 mm diameter pipe diameter) (no culvert works) - \$508.80 per square metre

Traffic Management and Municipal Parking Division – Traffic Management

The following three new fees have been created to recover the cost of staff time needed to handle Third Party Pole Attachments:

- Third party small sized attachment to the streetlight pole (installation application) -\$2,000 per attachment
- Third party small sized attachment to the streetlight pole annual maintenance fee \$250 per attachment
- Third party small-sized attachment to a new streetlight pole (where an existing streetlight pole does not meet the requirements) fee is charged based on the direct cost plus administration fee as indicated in the attached Appendix 2.

The proposed revisions and justifications are set out in Appendix 1 included with this report.

New Headwall Construction (no culvert works) Fee, \$1000.00 per headwall has been deleted and split into two fees: (1) New Block Headwall Construction (up to 300 mm pipe diameter (no culvert works) - \$680.52 per square meter; and (2) New Concrete Headwall Construction (300 mm to 450 mm diameter pipe diameter) (no culvert works) - \$508.80 per square meter to better reflect the worked required.

Traffic Management and Municipal Parking Division - Traffic Management

Under Road Occupancy Permit under subsection b): Special Events or Filming (i) Signs - \$32.00 per sign and (ii) Crew Time - \$94.00 per hour, have been deleted and replaced with an Advanced Road Closure Signage fee and is charged based on the direct cost plus administration fee (maximum administration Fee is \$367.90).

Other Changes:

Enforcement fees and charges have been thoroughly reviewed and revisions have been made to reflect operational standards. In general, the licensing fees and charges for the Enforcement Division are located in 14 different regulatory by-laws. In order to improve the process for the annual fees and charges review and benchmarking, the Division will remove the fees from the regulatory / licensing by-laws and consolidate all applicable fees and charges into the 2022 User Fees & Charges By-law as identified in the attached Appendix 1. - Complex Construction Road Occupancy Permit to Complex Construction-Road Occupancy Permit Application
- Road Occupancy Permit Connections to Road Occupancy Permit Application Connections
- PUCC circulations (Utility- Municipal Consent) all applicants to PUCC Applications (Utility- Municipal Consent) - all applicants

Traffic Management and Municipal Parking - Traffic Management

Under Road Occupancy Permit: Special Events or Filming (i) Signs and (ii) Crew Time have been combined under Sub-section b) Advanced Road Closure Signage and 2022 proposed fee is direct cost to reflect the actual costs of work for the maximum fee of \$367.90.

Transportation and Works – Charges to External or Internal Parties for Engineering, Construction, Maintenance, Traffic and Street Lighting Works

Schedule "B-2" of the Transportation and Works Fees and Charges (Charges to External or Internal Parties for Engineering, Construction, Maintenance, Traffic and Street Lighting Works) has been amended to include reference to Street Lighting Works undertaken by the Transportation and Works Department on behalf of External or Internal Parties. Section 5 of Schedule B-2 has also been amended to include reference to Street Lighting Works, which is intended to capture work performed by the City for third parties for street lighting pole small cell attachments.

Payroll Burden for City Labour Direct Costs which is charged for works undertaken by the City has been re-adjusted to 35% from 60%. Upon review, Transportation and Works has identified that a 60% payroll burden is limited in application to contract work undertaken by contractors on behalf of the City, where the payroll burden has already been incorporated into the contract price and should not be applied to City Labour costs.

Other amendments to Schedule B-2 are recommended to clean up language and to ensure that the Schedule accurately reflects how charges are applied to Internal and External parties. It is recommended that the current Fees and Charges By-law 0251-2020, which is in force until December 31, 2021, also be amended to incorporate these updates and to reflect a 35% payroll burden for City Labour Direct Costs.

All of the changes are incorporated in the attached Appendix 2.

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Financial Impact

The additional revenue being generated through the revised and new Transportation and Works fees and charges proposed in Appendix 1 will be incorporated in the 2022 departmental budget submission. The impact of the revised and new fees on the 2022 budget will be offset by increased costs. The proposed fees are expected to generate approximately \$133,900 in additional revenue.

Conclusion

The annual review of Transportation and Works fees and charges has resulted in a few deletions, revisions, housekeeping changes (including name changes) and a limited amount of new fees to cover increased costs.

Fee Exemptions

A Person with a service animal or therapy animal may be exempt from Licensing Fees in the Schedule "B-1".

To be granted this exemption for a service animal, the Manager shall require proof of training from an animal service training agency which can include but not be limited to services accommodating the blind and hearing impaired.

To be granted this exemption for a therapy animal, the Manager shall require medical documentation from a licensed medical physician recommending use of a therapy animal.

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Appendix 2

SCHEDULE "B-2" Transportation and Works Fees and Charges

CHARGES TO EXTERNAL OR INTERNAL PARTIES FOR ENGINEERING, CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, TRAFFIC AND STREET LIGHTING WORKS

1. General

- **a.** Payment of all fees and charges may be made by Visa, MasterCard, American Express, debit card, bank draft or certified cheque, The full pament for the total of refundable deposits and non-refundable fees combined must be made by bank draft or certified cheques only. Uncertified cheques will not be accepted.
- **b.** No discounts will apply for early payment of any fee set out in Schedules "B-2" to this By-law.
- c. The City's current Road Occupancy Permit By-law and Lot Grading and Municipal Services Protection Deposit By-law set out the deposits that are payable in respect of permits for construction on land abutting a highway or for construction that may affect drainage or grading.

2. Application of Schedule "B-2"

Schedule "B" applies to engineering, construction and maintenance, traffic and street lighting works undertaken by the Transportation and Works Department on behalf of External or Internal Parties.

Internal or External Parties shall be charged with costs, which include the Direct Costs (as defined below) of works performed either by City forces or by contractors working on behalf of the City, plus an Administration Fee (as defined below).

3. Charges for Engineering Works

Charges associated with Engineering Works include, but are not limited to, work performed on behalf of External or Internal Parties, such as project management, design, survey, inspection and material testing activities in conjunction with the construction of roads, bridges, sewers and watercourse works.

4. Charges for Construction and Maintenance Works

Charges associated with Construction and Maintenance Works include, but are not limited to, work performed on behalf of External or Internal Parties, such as asphalt, concrete and sod restoration works related to utility and development works, turning lanes, island extensions, sidewalks, access modifications ("curb cuts/culvert extensions"), road modifications for developers, railway crossing restoration work, and newspaper pad installation work; as well as installation of signs and pavement markings.

5. Charges for Traffic and Street lighting Works

Charges associated with Traffic and Street lighting Works include but are not limited to work performed on behalf of External or Internal Parties, such as traffic signal modifications for developers, and street lighting pole small cell attachments for third parties.

6. Direct Costs

The "Direct Costs" for works undertaken by City and/or contract forces are calculated as set out below.

If the City is using contract forces:

If the City is using City forces, all applicable Direct Costs added together:

7. Administration Fee

An "Administration Fee" is applied as a percentage of Direct Costs to compensate the City for indirect costs for works performed on behalf of External or Internal Parties which may include, but are not limited to, some or all of the following:

- Preparing and tendering projects;
- Functional and detailed design;
- Surveying and inspection for works maintenance activities;
- Reinstatement of disturbed areas;
- Overall project management;
- Administrative functions such as invoicing, issuance of permits and other administrative duties.

8. Total Charge

"Total Charge" for works performed means the Direct Costs and the Administration Fee as well as applicable tax and is established as follows:

Refer to the Excise Tax Act, Schedule V (Exempt Supplies), Part VI (Public Sector Bodies), Sections 21 and 22.

When supplied by a municipality, the following services are exempt from Harmonized Sales Tax (HST), regardless of who is being charged:

- a) Installing, replacing, repairing or removing street or road signs or barriers, street or traffic lights or property similar to any of the foregoing.
- b) Removing snow, ice or water.
- c) Removing, cutting, pruning, treating or planting vegetation.
- d) Repairing or maintaining roads, streets, sidewalks or similar or adjacent property.
- e) Installing accesses or egresses.
- f) Installing, repairing, maintaining or interrupting the operation of a water distribution, sewerage or drainage system.

9. Reduction of Administration Fee:

Notwithstanding any of the above, it may be appropriate to reduce the Administration Fee on a project-specific basis. This may occur only in circumstances where necessary, such as when City staff is unable to complete any of the administrative functions (see Item #6).

A reduction to the Administration Fee of under \$50,000 requires the signature of the responsible Director.

A reduction to the Administration Fee of \$50,000 or more requires the signature of the Commissioner of Transportation and Works or their designate.

Justification for the reduction shall be documented, approved by signature (as stipulated in the previous paragraph), and placed in the project file.

2022 Recreation Program Fees and Rental Rates

Recommendation

- That the Recreation rental rates incorporating new, revised and existing charges for Meeting Rooms, Food Services and Banquets, Garry W. Morden Training Centre, Pools, sundries and minor centres, effective January 1, 2022 through to December 31, 2022 (as outlined in Appendix 1 attached to the Corporate Report Dated August 6, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2022 Recreation Program Fees and Rental Rates") be approved.
- 2. That the Recreation rental rates incorporating new, revised and existing charges for Arenas, Gyms and Indoor Artificial Turf, effective May 1, 2022 through to April 30, 2023 (as outlined in Appendix 3 attached to the Corporate Report dated August 6, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2022 Recreation Programs Fees and Rental Rates") be approved.
- 3. That the Recreation program fees incorporating new, revised and existing charges for Recreation programs, effective the start date of spring 2022 recreation program through to the end date of winter session 2023 (as outlined in Appendix 5 attached to the Corporate Report dated August 6, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2022 Recreation Programs Fees and Rental Rates") be approved.
- 4. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0251-2020, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2021.
- 5. That a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2022, which will include the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish the new, revised, and existing Recreation program fees and rental rates, as outlined in Appendix 1, Appendix 3 and Appendix 5 of the Corporate Report dated, August 6, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2022 Recreation Programs Fees and Rental Rates."

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6. That the program fees and rental rates currently listed in Schedule "E-2" (Recreation Rental Rates – Arenas, Gyms and Indoor Artificial Turf) and Schedule "E-3" (Recreation Program Fees and Charges) of User Fees and Charges By-law 0251-2020 which are applicable to April 30, 2022 or the end date of the Winter 2022 recreation program, be incorporated to the new consolidated fees and charges by-law.

Executive Summary

- Recreation program fees and rental rate increases are reviewed and analyzed annually in response to increased costs, current demand and market conditions.
- Price increases are recommended for those programs and lines of business that can absorb the increase without negatively affecting participation or revenue.
- Price recommendations are based on the following factors; cost recovery, the
 availability of affordable offerings, service sustainability, customer feedback, and market
 conditions. As a result of these recommendations, Recreation is expected to drive
 incremental revenues of \$874,100 in 2022.

Background

On an annual basis the fees charged for Recreation offerings are reviewed and, in accordance with the Municipal Act, 2001, adjustments for program fees, rentals, and memberships are recommended to Council for approval. This report sets out the proposed fees and charges for 2022. The 2022 fees and charges, if approved through this report, will be incorporated into a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

User fees are one of two principle sources of funding for Recreation services; property taxes being the other. As a result, any cost not directly recovered through user fees is, by definition, subsidized through property taxes. This is true of all municipal programs and services and must be understood when setting user fees. If individual rates and user fees fail to keep pace with the costs associated with delivering a given program or service, then that cost must be recovered through increases in the property taxes of all residents.

The guiding principles and assumptions for Recreation's pricing was established in accordance with the Pricing Study, a comprehensive document that was approved in principle by the Budget Committee. This document dictates that fees should be established based on a combination of factors including: cost recovery; affordability of programs and services to generate the greatest societal benefit; fees ensure that desired services are sustainable; and that fees for services that are the same as those provided by the community will be guided by the market.

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Comments

Fee and rate changes are recommended after significant analysis is completed to determine demand and market sensitivity to price. Potential fee increases first focused on a base increase of 3% in order to recover a portion of increased labour and operational costs. Further increases were identified for offerings that are not aligned with external benchmarking and/or offerings where demand analysis demonstrates an opportunity to alter price to drive more utilization. On average, the price increase for all lines of business equates to 3%.

Price increases have been identified for the majority of rentals, memberships and programs for the lines of business. The recommended pricing changes specific to each lines of business are outlined below. Because the existing program fees and rental rates listed in Schedules "E-2" and "E-3" of the User Fees and Charges By-law 0251-2020, as amended, extend into 2022, those program fees and rental rates will also be included in the new consolidated user fees and charges by-law to cover the period until the remaining 2022 program fees and rental rates are in effect.

Aquatics

Analysis of pricing in the Aquatics Line of Business determined that increases in Aquatics programs, memberships, rentals and pay as you go fees can be sustained in 2022. In some cases programs need to be increased above the average 3% due to either increases in the length of the program, increased operating costs and/or certification fees. The total estimated revenue increase for the Aquatics line of business is \$185,400 for 2022.

Arenas

In order to accommodate rising labour and operating costs for arenas, it is proposed that all ice rates receive an average increase of 3%. The fee changes for the Arena line of business is expected to generate an additional \$262,250 in budgeted revenue for 2022.

Community Programs & Camps

Community Programs and Camps generate a significant volume of participation and support our mandate of delivering community-based affordable recreation opportunities for residents. Benchmarking and local market analysis has confirmed that the City's Community Programs and Camps can sustain a 3% increase. The recommended increases are projected to drive an additional \$99,980 in revenue for 2022.

Fitness & Seniors' Centre

Fitness customers are extremely price sensitive due to the availability of a number of private fitness centres in the community. After analysis and benchmarking, staff is recommending an average 3% increase. The estimated revenue increase for the Fitness line of business is \$92,530 and the Seniors' Centre is \$3,660 for 2022.

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Food Services

To recover increased costs, a 3% increase was applied to the banquet rentals rates to keep pace with inflation and to remain competitive. In 2021, the LOB introduced new block rates (5, 8 and 12 hour rates). Based on this recent change, the increases for the Food Services line of business are anticipated to generate an incremental \$300 in 2022.

Golf

The golf industry has trended toward standardizing promotional pricing and discount packages in an attempt to gain market advantage. To compete with industry trends, BraeBen and Lakeview staff has conducted market research to recommend price points that align to benchmarking and position the courses to remain competitive. These price changes are expected to generate a revenue increase of \$97,980 in 2022.

Indoor Artificial Turf

To recover increased costs while remaining competitive, price changes were applied to the majority of the rental fees with an impact equivalent to a 3% overall rate increase. These increases are expected to drive \$15,000 in additional revenue for 2022.

Room Rentals

The Room Rentals Line of Business has experienced a positive trend in revenue and hours booked. The 3% rate increases in the Room Rentals line of business is projected to generate additional revenue of \$90,570 in 2022.

Sport Leagues

Based on the competitive landscape, an average rate increase of 1.9% was applied for an expected 2022 revenue impact of \$19,600.

Therapeutic

Therapeutic is still a developing line of business and it is important to continue to offer programs at price points which encourage increased participation in order to help grow the Therapeutic market. Therapeutic offerings are recommended to generate an incremental \$6,830 in 2022.

Financial Impact

As a result of Recreation's comprehensive annual user fee review including inflation, market price comparisons, benchmarking and an examination of the impact of historic price changes on volume, the fee recommendations in this report are expected to drive incremental annualized revenues totalling approximately \$874,100.

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Conclusion

Recreation programs and activities help to build strong communities and assist residents in living healthy and active lives. The 2019 Citizens Satisfaction Survey indicates that 85% of residents express high or very high satisfaction with recreation services.

Recreation program fees must be balanced to ensure affordability, particularly for core services and at risk populations, while limiting reliance on the general tax base. The recommended rates and fees respond to market demand and attempt to drive increased participation while generating incremental revenue.

General Notes:

- Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) not included in rates.
- The City Manager or Commissioner of Community Services or the Director of Recreation, as applicable, or his or her designate, may approve a new fee, waive a fee, approve promotional pricing, and/or discounts on any Recreation fee in accordance with the general criteria for any such waiver, reduction or variation.
- Payment by cash, debit card, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, money order, certified cheque, cheques (if event is later than 14 days from booking) accepted
- Indoor special events including Food Services and Banquet locations may be booked 2 years in advance. The rental rate applied will be the current rate plus 5%
- For Banquet events booked over 2 years in advance, 2.5% will be applied to the hourly rate.
- Corporate Policy 04-01-05 shall govern payment terms for all Facility rentals and refunds.
- For purchase for resale items for food, beverage and retail sales pricing is determined by the Manager, Food Services using the cost to purchase an item plus the cost of good sold percentage, established in accordance with the divisional standard operating procedure. Exceptions to cost of goods sold pricing must be approved by District Manager.
- Proof of Insurance is required when booking a City facility, including bookings that are provided at no cost under the Community Group Registry Program.

 The City provides access to a general liability insurance policy that is paid for solely by the renter and is available at reasonable rates on a per rental basis.

User Group Definitions:

Affiliate Fees correspond to:

• Any registered community group that has been approved for inclusion in the Community Group Registry Program (CGRP) and has been approved for the affiliated rental rate category.

Community Fees correspond to:

• Any registered community group that has been approved for inclusion in the Community Group Registry Program (CGRP) and has been approved for the community rental rate category.

Resident Fees correspond to:

- · Any individual whose principal address is in Mississauga (temporary absences for reasons such as vacation do not affect residence status), or
- A student who is registered in an educational institution in Mississauga and who lives and attends school in Mississauga for a period of at least eight months during the calendar year, or
- A non-CGRP Not-for-Profit organization, whose principal address is in Mississauga, that is a corporation or an unincorporated association formed for the purpose of providing services, activities, programs and opportunities that improve or benefit one or more communities, is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors or trustees, does not generate revenue to be distributed amongst its members, directors, officers or trustees, as the case may be, for their financial gain, and turns back any revenue remaining after expenditures into the organization to further its aims and activities, or
- · A business in Mississauga, that permits time with no intent to gain financially as a result of the activity, or
- A non-resident who is the principal owner of a business in Mississauga, that permits time with no intent to gain financially as a result of the activity.

Non Resident Fees correspond to:

- · Any individual whose principal address is outside of Mississauga, or
- Any business whose principal address is outside of Mississauga, that permits time with no intent to gain financially as a result of the activity.

Commercial Fees correspond to:

• Any individual or business, that permits time with the intent to gain financially as a result of the activity.

Meeting Room - Minimum Booking Requirements

- Rates are based on an hourly fee unless otherwise noted. Minimum booking periods are required for some facility uses as indicated below:
- Room Category C minimum booking period is 3 hours unless booked less than 30 days for gym activities.
- Room Category D minimum booking period is 1 hour.
- Room Category B and C, Saturday 1pm to Sunday 1am, minimum booking period is 7 hours.
- Room Category A at standalone Libraries minimum booking period is 1 hour.
- Exceptions to minimum number of hours for room booking periods to be approved by Manager of the facility to drive utilization (i.e. last minute availability)
- A non-prime bulk discount of 45% is applied to all groups booking more than 500 rental hours on weekdays between 7:00am and 6:00pm.
- A flat administrative surcharge of \$50 for Category B, and \$100 for Category C applies for all bookings longer than 3.5 hours. Any non-prime rental that is eligible for the bulk discount shall not be charged the administrative surcharge.
- Meetings of official city business held by ward councillors at a community centre in their ward are booked at no charge. If specialized facilities are required to be opened for the meeting, standard charges apply.
- City Staff can receive free facility space for city business except when;
- -The meeting is booked on behalf of another group.
- -The booking is requested at a community hall/banquet facility.
- -The booking is for staff retirement events.
- -The affiliated/internal room rental rate applies for all exceptions noted above. For City business, an account number must be provided at the time of bookings. Appropriate charges will apply for food and sundry services.
- 33% Holiday rate applied for statutory holidays for all facilities and additionally December 31 after 6:00pm for all Social events (including food services banquet facilities). Opening must be approved by the Manager of the facility.
- Requests for gym equipment, pool inflatable etc. have \$26.00 charge per contract.
- School boards and government agencies will benefit from the affiliated rate. (moved from Meeting Room Affiliated Groups)

Meeting Rooms - Category P

• Room Category P refers to Premium spaces currently including the Time Out Lounge lobby at PFFC, Hall of Fame lobby at PFFC and boardrooms at Lakeview and BraeBen Golf Courses.

Meeting Rooms - Category S - Storage spaces/cabinets

- Storage includes shared storages and kitchen cabinets
- Category S minimum booking commitment is one year and paid in advance
- No charge for Affiliated Older Adult groups

Meeting Room - Community Group Registry Program (CGRP):

- Eligible Registered groups may receive no charge meeting room rentals as per Corporate Policy 08-01-01, for organization monthly board meetings and AGM.
- Minimum booking periods and administrative surcharges will apply as approved through the Recreation Rental Rates and Fees bylaw.
- In the event a group neglects to cancel a free room booking or does not show up for booked dates, a financial penalty of 50% of the affiliated room rental rate will be applied.
- Registered Older Adult Providers and Clubs may be eligible for no charge weekday use for facility space, based on available older adult space, in accordance with established guidelines.
- Registered Older Adult Providers and Clubs are charged 20% off the regular affiliated room rental rate during evenings and weekends. July and August use is subject to availability.

Pool Rentals:

- Lifeguard staff costs charged separately for pool rentals based on attendance.
- Mississauga Fire and Emergency Services receives free pool rental for training sessions. Lifeguard staff costs still apply.
- Half Leisure Pool bookings may be made at half of full pool rate.
- •The commercial rate applies to rentals booked by organizations, teams or individuals who operate on a for-profit basis and are booking the pool for profit purposes. Swim teams, clubs and private schools, which are charging the participants/swimmers only the fees required to cover the cost of the rental are charged Resident rental rates.

Garry W Morden Notes:

- Burn building live fire includes; ignition materials, use of field shelter and one (1) staff member to act as facility liaison.
- Driving track Includes use of field shelter and one (1) staff member to act as facility liaison.
- Except where noted separately, an additional fee of \$500/day will be added to all rental fees to cover facility wages per day.
- Instructor Fees = \$500 per instructor per day.
- Propane Fees = Cost + 10%.
- Normal Business Hours 08:00-16:30hrs.
- Additional staffing hours will be charged for events held outside regular business hours.
- Where eligible, the half day (4 hr.) rental rate is 50% of the full day rental rate.
- The Director of Recreation, The Chief of Fire & Emergency Services or their designate has the authority to approve price packaging and discounts.

Food Services & Banquet Notes:

- There is a minimum charge of \$750 before taxes and gratuity for full service food and beverage. Manager of Food Services can waive the fees in order to drive utilization (i.e. last minute availability).
- Minimum spend per person by meal time for external events -
- \$12.00 for Breakfast
- \$19.00 for Lunch
- \$20.00 for Cocktail reception
- \$39.00 for Dinner
- For golf tournaments where there is full service food and beverage contracts room rental charges will not apply.
- For banquet facilities and LIVE Cuisine restaurant three room rental options 5 hour, 8 hour and 12 hours in duration apply. These times are to be inclusive of all set up and tear down expenses.
- For internal rentals, minimum 3 hour booking applies.
- Due to fluctuations in wholesale food costs, catering package prices are subject to change without notice. Quoted prices are guaranteed no more than 3 months prior to the event.

Other Rentals:

- Walking track can only be booked in conjunction with the rental of the gymnasium at Carmen Corbasson only.
- Parking lot rental fees are applicable for all special events that utilize the parking lot space for more than its prescribed use.

Elections Exceptions:

- Provincial elections receive free space for polling stations (as per the elections act R.S.O 1990, Chapter E.6)
- Federal elections pay \$100 per polling stations (as per the Canada Elections Act, S.C 2000, c.a)

2022 Parks, Forestry & Environment Fees and Charges

Recommendation

- 1. That the Parks, Forestry & Environment fees and charges, as outlined in Appendix 1, Appendix 2, and Appendix 3 attached to the Corporate Report dated July 29, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2022 Parks, Forestry and Environment Fees and Charges" be approved.
- 2. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0251-2020, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2021.
- 3. That a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2022, which will include the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish the new, revised, and existing fees and charges for the Parks, Forestry and Environment division as outlined in Appendix 1, Appendix 2 and Appendix 3 attached to the Corporate Report dated July 29, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled, "2022 Parks, Forestry and Environment Fees and Charges".

Executive Summary

- Fees for Parks, Forestry and Environment services include rates for park permits, requested tree maintenance, sports fields, cemeteries, marinas and associated services provided for specific residents, individuals and organizations.
- Parks, Forestry and Environment fees and charges are reviewed annually to recover increased costs and respond to market conditions.
- Incremental revenues of \$162,000 are forecasted as a result of the proposed fee changes.

Background

On an annual basis in accordance with the *Municipal Act 2001, SO 2001, c.25*, Parks, Forestry and Environment reviews the rental rates for City-owned and operated facilities including parks, sports fields, cemeteries and marinas, along with additional fees for Parks, Forestry and Environment services provided to specific residents, individuals and organizations.

Ensuring that fees and charges maintain cost recovery reduces the burden on the City's tax requirements. If fees do not increase to cover increased costs, tax support for rentals and services must increase and the costs to administer are left to all taxpayers instead of those who directly benefit from the service. The 2022 fees and charges, if approved through this report, will be added into a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

Comments

As part of the draft 2022-2025 Corporate Business Plan Update and 2021 Budget development process, staff have reviewed the fees and charges for Parks, Forestry and Environment services with the objective of ensuring that recommended price increases maintain cost recovery without affecting demand. Staff reviews current market rates, utilization and demand for rentals and services, user and staff feedback, and prior increases to determine specific pricing changes. The recommended pricing changes to Parks, Forestry and Environment services are outlined below.

Parks

Fees for the rental of park facilities and associated services help offset the costs to maintain 3,178 hectares (7,853 acres) of City-owned parkland and open space, and for services to individual park users. In order to maintain cost recovery, rate increases are required to offset increased operating costs for materials, vehicles, equipment and labour. Fee increases of 3% are recommended for parks rental rates, vendor permits and associated services to offset inflationary costs. Historical increases for parks rental fees and associated services have not detrimentally impacted demand for facility use. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 1.

Marinas

The majority of the fees for marina rentals and services are recommended for 3% increase to recover the inflationary costs to deliver services. Further reviews and benchmarking has resulted in a recommended increase to daily slip rentals over a two year period (2022-2023) at between 4.5 to 9.5% annually. It is recommended to increase daily slip rentals for both Lakefront Promenade Marina and Credit Village Marina to align with benchmarking of other similar marinas.

Through the 2021 Fees and Charges a 7% increase was applied to charter fees at Credit Village Marina as they are currently lower than recreational user fees at the same location.

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This was planned as 7% per year over two years to apply a phased approach to increasing the fees. The second year of this phased approach has been applied to 2022 fees.

With the increases proposed, fees at the marina will remain competitive. Revenues for Marina rentals and services are expected to remain on target in 2022 as previous increases have not impact demand for these services. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 1.

Park Planning and Development

The majority of fees related to Park Planning and Development are recommended to remain unchanged, as greenbelt and park processing fees are charged as a percentage of works completed. Additional fees are recommended to have a 3% increase to offset inflationary costs. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 1.

Forestry

Fees charged for Forestry services include on-demand tree works, tree permits and tree replacement costs as well as streetscape processing fees. To offset increased costs for contractor services, vehicles, equipment, materials and labour for requested services, an increase of 3% is recommended for most fees. A 12% increase is recommended for each additional tree request as part of a Tree Removal Permit and/or Permission to ensure operational costs are fully recovered for each additional tree requiring application review and multiple site inspections. Historically, increases to fees for Forestry Services have not detrimentally impacted revenues. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 1.

Cemeteries

Under the Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002 S.O 2002, c.33 the City is required to maintain abandoned and municipally owned Cemeteries in a state of good repair. Lot sales, interment fees and other service charges are used towards offsetting annual operating costs for the ongoing care of 11 municipally owned or maintained cemeteries. A portion of the total fees charged for burial rights is placed in a reserve fund, where interest collected is used towards the perpetual care and maintenance of cemeteries owned and maintained by the City.

For most fees, staff is proposing rate increases of 3% to recover increased costs and to ensure that fees are consistent with market rates across the GTA, with the exception of any veteran fees which remain unchanged.

Historically, increases to fees for Cemetery Services have not detrimentally impacted revenues. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 2.

Sports Fields

Parks Operations maintains 373 sports fields across the City to support permitting for major and minor baseball, cricket, soccer, football, rugby, volleyball and artificial fields. Pricing for sports fields is founded on the principle that in order to maintain service sustainability, sports fields should endeavour to maintain or incrementally increase their cost recovery rate year over year.

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Over the last several years, staff have consulted with most outdoor sports field users both individually and through the Outdoor Sports Field User Network on user fees to receive feedback and support for rental fees prior to Budget Committee's consideration.

A rate increase of 3% is proposed to recover increased costs for 2020 and anticipated for 2021. Proposed changes have been reviewed and supported by the Outdoor Sports Field User Network as reasonable and would not have detrimental impacts to participation rates or demand for City facilities. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 3.

Looking to 2023 Fees and Charges, sports fields rates are currently under a comprehensive review with a revised cost recovery and benchmarking model being developed. City staff will work with the Outdoor Sports Field User Network throughout late 2021 and 2022 to receive feedback and develop a strategy for rolling out a schedule for introducing revised fees in 2023. Previous changes made through 2021 Fees and Charges in preparation for this review include the redefining of minor and major fields and the addition of a category of major fields for Cricket users to align with other sports.

New Fees

Marina Slip Fees- Non Resident

New fees are being recommended for marina slips to introduce non-resident fees using the traditional resident/non-resident ratio used for other non-resident fees across the division (10% surcharge). Introducing non-resident fees supports recovering operational costs from users outside of the existing City tax payers. The financial impact of this change would be up to a \$20,000 increase in slip revenues.

Currently, 45% of seasonal slip holders are non-residents and would be impacted by this change. Given some of the longstanding relationships between the City and these users, Parks, Forestry and Environment is proposing a one-year grace period for current non-resident slip holders to advise them and prepare them for the change. Any new non-resident slips holders as of 2022 would have the non-resident fee applied immediately.

The introduction of non-resident slip fees is not expected to detrimentally impact revenues based on demand for marina slips and existing competitive pricing.

This fee can be found in Appendix 1.

Financial Impact

As a result of the projected increases, a \$162,000 revenue budget increase is proposed in the 2022-2025 Budget and Business Plan.

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Conclusion

Fee increases assist Parks, Forestry and Environment in offsetting increased annual operating costs including labour, equipment, materials and supplies for the ongoing care and maintenance of City owned open space assets. The proposed fees for Parks, Forestry and Environment have been adjusted to assist in maintaining user demand for rentals, along with maintaining cost recovery for on-demand services to reduce the pressure on the tax levy.

- Park permit fees may be waived for occasional park use by schools, not for profit community youth groups, conservation authorities, rate payers groups, Port Credit Yacht Club's Annual Racing Series official finish line and groups working in partnership with staff on weekdays (Monday to Friday) only.
- Park access permit fees may be waived for Conservation Authorities and the Region of Peel.
- Photography and park permits may be booked within the following timelines:
 - Residents & Community Groups: up to 10 months in advance
- Non-Residents and Commercial: up to 2 months in advance
- The 2 adjacent shelters at Lakeside Park (Area A, Area B) are considered 1 area for park permit fee considerations.
- Standard Park fees also apply to Streetsville Village Square in addition to fees specific to this location.
- Richard's Memorial Park may be booked annually by the Sheasby family for a World Peace Celebration at no charge.
- Seasonal Park Permit is intended for shared use of park space, not exclusive use of park or commercial activities.
- For delivery and pickup of picnic tables and/or waste receptacles related to park permit fees, the total per load can be a combination of Picnic Tables (max. 9) and/or Waste/Recycling Receptacles (max. 6 with picnic tables, max. 20 without picnic tables)
- Meetings of official City business held by the ward councillors at a community centre in their ward are booked at no charge. If specialized requirements are needed at the location, standard charges apply.
- City staff can receive free meeting space at Parks for city business except when:
 - The meeting is booked on behalf of another group
 - The booking is requested at a community centre/banquet facility
 - The booking is for staff retirement events
 - The standard park permit rate and additional standard fees apply for all exceptions noted above. For City business, an account number must be provided at the time of booking.

Marina Fee Notes:

- Lakefront Promenade Buddy Pass: Provides ability for transient use of Credit Village Marina, available Sunday noon to Friday Noon.
- Marina fees can be waived for conservation authorities requiring waterfront access.
- Marina fees can be waived for Coast Guard and Police requiring waterfront access.
- Late payment charge is effective the day after the payment is due on any outstanding fees.

- 2. That the Culture Education Program fees incorporating new, revised and existing charges for Culture School Education programs from September 1, 2021 through to August 31, 2022, as outlined in Appendix 2 attached to the Corporate Report dated July 30, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2022 Culture Programs Fees and Rental Rates" be approved.
- 3. That the Culture rental rates incorporating new, revised and existing charges for Culture rental rates and services, as outlined in Appendix 3 attached to the Corporate Report dated July 30, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2022 Culture Programs Fees and Rental Rates" be approved.
- 4. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0251-2020, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2021.

Executive Summary

- Culture program fees and rental rates are reviewed and analyzed annually in response
 to increased costs, current demand and market conditions. Price recommendations are
 based on cost recovery, availability of affordable offerings, utilizations trends, market
 rate analysis, customer and staff feedback.
- Fees for Paramount Fine Foods Centre have been added to align with the transfer of services from Recreation to Culture Division.
- After one year of City management of the Living Arts Centre, additional review and streamlining of operations has resulted in the update of fees for resident artists, facility rentals, technical services and other services.
- A new fee model has been introduced for the Living Arts Centre's Birthday Parties and Corporate Workshops.
- Other housekeeping changes to fees have been made to improve clarity, transparency and ensure consistency and compliance.

Background

On an annual basis, fees charged for Culture programs offered by the City are reviewed and, in accordance with the *Municipal Act, 2001*, adjustments for the following year's fees and rental rates are recommended to Council for approval. This report sets out the proposed fees and rental rates for 2022. The 2022 fees and rental rates, when approved through this report, will be added into one consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

Program fees for registered programs and pay-as-you-go programs are managed in accordance with the Recreation fee cycle (spring to winter) to maintain marketing and billing alignment. School Education Programs fees are managed in accordance with the school year calendar (September to August). All other Culture fees are managed in accordance with a calendar year cycle (January to December) to align with the annual operating budget.

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Comments

Fee and rate changes are only recommended after significant analysis to determine demand and market sensitivity to price. Fee increases are recommended for those programs and lines of business that can absorb the increase without negatively affecting participation or revenue.

The criteria to determine whether a price change is identified includes: market rate analysis, benchmarking, utilization trends, percentage changes from the prior year, and feedback from customers and staff. The recommended housekeeping and pricing changes specific to various lines of business are outlined below.

Paramount Fine Foods Centre Events

With the transfer of Paramount Fine Foods Centre Event operations from the Recreation Division to the Culture Division in September 2020, fees are now included in Culture Division's fees and charges. Fees were aligned, where possible, to ensure consistency in the areas of box office and front of house as a result of the twinning of the operations for the Paramount Fine Foods Centre Events and the Living Arts Centre. In response to increased demand for outdoor event spaces, new fees for parking lot events are proposed in addition to a booking set-up fee and a portable sound system fee to support these events (See Appendix 3: 2022 Culture Rental and Service Fees and Charges).

Living Arts Centre

Since September 2020, the Culture Division has been managing the operations of the Living Arts Centre. Additional review of operations and further integration with existing Culture Division lines of businesses has resulted in revisions, additions and deletion of fees. Resident Artist fees were updated to further streamline the administration of the program (See Appendix 3: 2022 Culture Rental and Service Fees and Charges).

The Resident Artist Program fee structure has been aligned to comply with City standards and related studio fees streamlined to simplify them and better coincide with regular City practices.

New room rental fees are also being introduced to be consistent with the practice of providing affiliates with discounted rental fees. Affiliate groups will be removed from existing rental fees and provided with a discounted rate where one did not previously exist. Fees were also aligned in the areas of box office and front of house.

Living Arts Centre – Technical and Equipment

Staff completed a review and comparison of the technical and equipment fees at the Living Arts Centre with existing Culture Technical Fees. Some fees have been reduced, others eliminated and new interim fees introduced to align with City standards (See Appendix 3: 2022 Culture Rental and Service Fees and Charges).

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In addition, affiliate groups will be provided a 25 per cent discount on Technical and Equipment Fees charged to not-for-profit, community, private and commercial groups. All technical fees will need a further review to ensure alignment across all Culture facilities. This work will be completed and included as part of the 2023 Fees and Charges process.

Registered Programs

An analysis of program fees was conducted that included benchmarking with Toronto, Oakville, Brampton and Visual Arts Mississauga. In comparison, analysis revealed certain price categories for Culture programs were priced at the higher-end. A priority for this line of business is to ensure entry-level programs are provided that are affordable and accessible. To ensure programs remain competitive, no change is proposed to Culture Programs Categories E and F as well as Culture Camps Category G. These changes will ensure cost recovery, improve affordability and provide increased access (See Appendix 5: 2022 Registered Program Benchmarking).

Programs - Birthday Party and Corporate Workshops

With plans to reintroduce Birthday Party and Corporate Workshops at the Living Arts Centre, these lines of business underwent a fulsome review. The review examined historical offerings, delivery model and fees, which were then, benchmarked with other arts organizations and external companies offering similar programs. The goal was to develop a diverse menu of programs and to integrate these offerings into Culture's current delivery model and fee structure; this allowed for groupings to be categorized based on similar objectives and associated operational costs (See Appendix 4: 2022 General Programs, Camps and Workshop Categories).

New fees are proposed for unique programs such as Glass, Theatre Production and Collaborative Corporate Workshops. Birthday Party and Corporate Workshop fees are based on specified number of participants with the option of adding additional participants as needed.

Maja Prentice Theatre

The City of Mississauga assumed the interim management and operations of the Maja Prentice Theatre in April 2021 when the not-for-profit Mississauga Theatre Alliance ended their Management and Operating Agreement. Two new interim fees have been approved by the Director of Culture and added based on current user needs to be effective immediately: rental of storage space at Maja Prentice Theatre (to ensure uninterrupted operations during the transition period) and a filming fee to allow for filming.

Housekeeping

The majority of fees for Registered Education Programs, Creative Industries, Small Arms Inspection Building, Museums of Mississauga, Meadowvale Theatre and Celebration Square have been updated and adjusted to recover costs of service delivery and/or to align with rates within the industry and other City service areas. Additionally, where required, fee titles were

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revised for clarity by adding associated fee units or specific user groups. New Education Program fees are being introduced at the Museums of Mississauga.

Financial Impact

Most changes to Culture's fees and charges are the result of housekeeping recommendations and include inflationary increases based on cost recovery. As a result of the proposed increases, an \$80,000 revenue budget increase is forecast in the 2022-2025 Budget.

Conclusion

The recommended fee and rental rate adjustments continue to focus on achieving an appropriate balance between user fees and property tax funding. Program fees are based on the philosophy that the user should 'share' the cost for participating in Culture programs. Paramount Fine Foods Events fees have been reviewed and included within Culture Division's fee structure for 2021-22.

Cultural programs and activities help to build strong communities, celebrate our heritage and contribute to the vibrancy of life in Mississauga. Cultural program and rental rates must ensure a proper balance between affordability, particularly for core services and 'at risk' populations, while limiting the reliance on the general tax base.

The fee and rental rate changes that have been proposed for 2022 attempt to maintain a balance between affordability and cost recovery for Culture programming and services.

- 13. Additional fee may be applied for School Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) Events for Keynote speaker. This fee fluctuates based on performer and is charged back to the school board for the full fee for the performance.
- 14. School workshops booked for Grades JK-3 will have a minimum charge equal to 18 participants. School workshops booked for Grades 4 and above will have a minimum charge equal to 20 participants.
- 15. Adults/teachers will be free of charge when accompanying a school group for a School Workshop Program.
- 16. There is a minimum of 2 workshops required for School Outreach Workshop bookings. School Outreach workshops booked for Grades JK-3 will have a maximum of 30 participants per workshop. School Outreach workshops booked for Grades 4 and above will have a maximum of 40 participants per workshop.
- 17. SHSM School Event Administration fee is only charged for full day SHSM School Events. If an event is booked only the SHSM School Event Administration fee is charged. For all other school bookings the School Booking Admin/Change fee is applied.
- 18. SHSM Workshops are priced based on cost recovery for specific workshops. Workshops in SHSM School Event Workshop Category A include: Audition Prep, Stage Combat, Photo Transfer and Mixed Media. Workshops in SHSM School Event Workshop Category B include Flameworking, Glass Blowing, Digital Arts, Ceramics, Mural Art, Afro Fusion Dance, DJ'ing, Drumming, Screen Printing, Special Effects Make-Up, Hip Hop, Broadway Jazz Dance, Digital Photography, Felting, Portfolio Prep and Vocal. Workshops in SHSM School Event Workshop Category C include: Theatre Technical Production.
- 19. Virtual school workshops minimum charge of 18 participants and max participant of 30.

DEFINITIONS

New Graduate Artist Residency Emerging Artist without an established body of work (limited or no exhibition and sales history). Have graduated from post-secondary institution within the last 2 years.

Resident Artist Emerging and Mid-Career Artists (Practicing Artist for 1 - 8 years) and have developed and continue to develop a body of work (active exhibition and competitive sales history).

Post Residency Rental Established professional artists as defined by Ontario Arts Council. (Practicing Artist for 8 years + or have an extensive exhibition and sales history).

Late Use Charge Charged in addition to staffing when event or client exceeds agreed upon end-time as stated in contract.

GENERAL NOTES

- 1. Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) is not included.
- 2. Corporate Policy 04-01-05 shall govern payment and refund of Facility Rental Fees.
- 3. From time to time, the Director of Culture may approve a new fee, waive a fee, approve promotional pricing and/or discounts on any Culture fee in accordance with the general criteria for any such waiver, reduction or variation.
- 4. When Culture equipment or facilities are not returned in a satisfactory state by rental clients, cost of damages will be charged plus an additional 10% of the total damages cost.
- 5. Meetings of official City business held by ward councillors at Culture facilities in their ward are booked at no charge. If specialized facilities are required to be opened for the meeting, staff charges will apply. Specialized facilities are defined as Small Arms Inspection Building, Meadowvale Theatre, Museums, Living Arts Centre and Paramount Fine Foods Centre.
- 6. City Staff can receive free meeting space at Culture Facilities for City business. If specialized facilities are required to be opened for the meeting, staff charges will apply. Specialized facilities are defined as Small Arms Inspection Building, Meadowvale Theatre, Museums. For City business, an account number must be provided at the time of booking. Appropriate charges will apply for food and sundry services, Leadership Team and Extended Leadership Team meetings are booked at no charge during standard business hours regardless of location or condition of use.
- 7. Staffing fees are charged in addition to rental permit fees.
- 8. When booking an indoor photography permit, access to outdoor space for photography is also granted free of charge. If an outdoor photography permit has been purchased it does not include indoor access even in the event of inclement weather. There will be no outdoor photography permitted at Meadowvale Theatre.
- 9. School boards and government agencies will benefit from the affiliated rate.
- 10. Eligible Registered groups may receive no charge meeting room rentals as per Corporate Policy 08-01-01, for organization monthly board meetings up to a maximum of twelve and one Annual General Meeting for the purpose of operating the association. The LAC meeting room space may be utilized for this purpose with the written consent of the Manager, Living Arts Centre and Paramount Fine Foods Centre.

 In the event a group neglects to cancel a free room booking or does not show up for booked dates, a financial penalty of 50% of the affiliated room rental will be applied.

MISSISSAUGA CELEBRATION SQUARE

- 11. Celebration Square Large Events may book the Glass Pavilion at no extra charge.
- 12. City staff may book Mississauga Celebration Square (MCS) and the Glass Pavilion with no permit fee for City business except when the meeting or event is booked on behalf of another group or the booking is for staff recognition events. The Admin Fee still applies. Leadership Team and Extended Leadership Team meetings are booked at no charge during standard business hours regardless of location or condition of use.

MEADOWVALE THEATRE

- 13. The Meadowvale Theatre Cleaning Fee will be charged to rental groups when Meadowvale Theatre is not returned in a satisfactory state as outlined in the MT General Housekeeping Guidelines.
- 14. When client's schedule does not allow for adequate staffing breaks, a scheduling penalty of \$20, plus HST, per staff, per infraction will be charged.
- 15. Non-Mississauga residents shall be charged the rate for Private Groups.
- 16. Community Access Fund is not charged for Meetings or Competition Rentals that do not use Box Office Services.

Culture - Fees Effective January 1, 2022 - December 31, 2022

17. Use Of Support Person - If a patron with a disability is assisted by a support person, they will be granted the same access to all public areas of Meadowvale Theatre. For ticketed performances support persons are expected to have a ticket to enter the theatre. Patrons should contact the Box Office for more information or to order tickets. Support persons are admitted to the theatre free of charge.

TECHNICAL SERVICES

- 18. When additional equipment is rented on behalf of the client, the cost of rentals will be charged plus an additional 10% of the total rental cost.
- 19. Any consumables related to Technical Services will be charged at cost to the client.

MUSEUMS OF MISSISSAUGA AND SMALL ARMS INSPECTION BUILDING

- 20. Staffing fees are charged in addition to indoor and outdoor rental permit fees when the facility is booked outside of public hours. Public hours are posted on the City of Mississauga website.
- 21. An additional cleaning fee will be charged to rental groups when the venue is not returned in a satisfactory state.
- 22. The daily rental rate for Affiliated/Community/Not-for-Profit Groups/ Arts and Culture Activities is in effect to increase use and provide appropriate access to the SAIB for arts and culture purposes. Corporate Policy 08-05-01 "Culture in the City of Mississauga" lays the foundation for initiatives that support growth and development of arts and culture. Guiding principles of the policy speak to the importance of fostering creative industries and support sustained cultural community activity. Arts and Culture activities are defined in the CSC knowledge base for SAIB and include literary events, visual and/or performing art events or activities that promote arts and culture.

CREATIVE INDUSTRIES

- 23. For film contracts that displace current users, the film client will pay for the cost recovery. If a private rental must be cancelled, the cost to re-book is covered by the film client. Additionally, if a City run program is cancelled, the cost to refund the customers is covered by the film client.
- 24. If an unpaid approved permit is cancelled by the client, a cancellation fee of 15% of the full fee would apply as per the standard City of Mississauga Film Permit Terms and Conditions. A cancellation fee is not applicable to expedited permits. Cancelled expedited permits must be paid in full.
- 25. If a permit has been approved and paid for there will be no refund of fees.
- 26. Where a facility is both an arena and a heritage property, the higher rate shall apply.
- 27. Community Centre Filming and LAC General Filming Fee applies to the primary filming location space/room. Any additional rooms are charged at the corporate/commercial rate + 10%.
- 28. There will be no half-day filming, prep or wrap rate for Living Arts Centre Hammerson Hall, RBC Theatre and Parking Level P2. The full day rate for these spaces will apply.
- 29. Average film shoot is a 12 hour day. Half day is 6 hours or less.

LIVING ARTS CENTRE

- 30. For short-term project based residencies of 2 5 months in duration, 10% will be added to the regular residency fee.
- 31. A \$150.00 deposit will be required upon signing of resident artists contracts and will be cashed should the Artist not meet their contractual obligations (cleanliness of studio spaces and meeting attendance).
- 32. LAC Community Exhibition Fee includes installation, de-installation, curation, marketing, lighting. This fee applies to Group Exhibitions and is not applied to LAC Curated shows or juried exhibitions. Food services are extra for exhibition openings.
- 32. Box Office conditions will be subject to change pending changes to operating model.
- 34. Resident Artist program has priority when selecting new applicants to the program. New Graduate Artist Residencies and Post Residency Rentals are only given if there is studio availability after Resident Artist applications have been completed.
- 35. New Graduate Artist Residency program is a maximum two year program.
- 36. Time in the glass studio must be booked for a 6 hour consecutive timeslot.
- 37. When additional equipment is rented on behalf of the client, the cost of rentals will be charged plus an additional 10% of the total rental cost.
- 38. Affiliated Groups will receive a 25% discount on the Living Arts Centre Technical and Equipment Fees (not for profit, community, private and commercial)/
- 39. Director's Lounge can only be booked with permission of Manager, LAC and PFFC.

Culture - Fees Effective January 1, 2022 - December 31, 2022

- 40. Debit fees are charged at 2.25% for clients charging for tickets through the box office.
- 41. Credit cards fees are charged at 3% for clients charging for tickets through the box office.
- 42. Additional kiln cycles will be charged based on an hourly batch rate starting with a minimum of 20 hours per month. Additional hours above 20 per month will be charged in batches of 20 hours. A 10% surcharge will be applied for hours above 80 to accommodate smooth operations of the studio space.
- 43. Resident Artist additional kiln cycles must be purchased in 20 hour increments. The number of increments available to purchase is at the discretion of Culture staff base on studio operations and equipment scheduling.
- 44. LAC Glass Artist Residency Materials will be charged in batch increments of 15 pounds (i.e.. 15, 30, 45, 60). To calculate per month batch fee batch, the batch pound fee will be multiplied by the requested batch increment, multiplied by the number of weeks and divided by the total months per residency duration (i.e. 12 months).

PARAMOUNT FINE FOODS CENTRE

- 45. Main Bowl can be booked two years in advance, all other bookable spaces follow the booking timelines established within policy. Fees will be quoted at current prices at time of booking, however final invoices will be updated based on approved fees and charges at time of event.
- 46. Ice rentals in the PFFC Arena may be booked for use at the standard arena rental rates at a minimum 3 hours when space allows (Facility Manager approval required).
- 47. The Box Office Set-Up Fee is a \$500 flat fee, plus additional fees set by the ticketing vendor.
- 48. Internal bookings will be charged the affiliated rate and cost for any reimbursable expenses.
- 49. Labour costs for any staff in addition to those included based on the size of the event will be charged the maximum staff rate identified on the Part-time Rate schedule + 17%, minimum 3 hours (including extra staff required for clean-up).
- 50. Event agreements may include chargeback for costs incurred for labour and services. Labour will be charged at the established hourly rate +20% (fringe & vacation), minimum of 3 per staff hours.
- 51. Paramount tenants will be charged the Facility Capital Surcharge subject to executed agreements.
- 52. When additional equipment is rented on behalf of the client, the cost of rentals will be charged plus an additional 10% of the total rental cost.
- 53. PFFC Parking Lot special events lot is separated into 10 bookable areas and each area is charged the associated parking lot rental fee. The number of lots needed for an event will be determined by staff.
- 54. A late use charge (per hour) is 10% of rental rate.
- 55. Ticketmaster sets their own fees, which are either charged to the City or patron. (These fees are outlined in the City's contract with Ticketmaster)
- 56. Credit card bump fees box office is charging the additional service charge, however Ticketmaster will provide the exact amount and this will be charged to the customer.

Recommendation

- That the Fire & Emergency Services fees and charges, as outlined in Appendix 1 attached to the Corporate Report dated July 15, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2022 Fire & Emergency Services Fees and Charges" be approved.
- 2. That User Fees and Charges By-Law 0251-2020, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2021.
- 3. That a new consolidated fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2022, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish, revised and existing fees and charges for Fire & Emergency Services as outlined in the Corporate Report dated July 15, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2022 Fire & Emergency Services Fees and Charges".

Executive Summary

- The fees charged for motor vehicle collisions and other specialty calls are based on the Ministry of Transportation (MTO) fee schedule.
- The MTO has raised their billable rates by 0.7%. Fees for those incidents have been adjusted to reflect the increase.
- MFES will be reverting back to an in house evaluation process for firefighter recruitment.
- A new candidate application fee has been added that will offset recruitment and testing costs.
- The anticipated increase resulting from the changes is approximately \$11,000.00.

Background

By-Law 0251-2020, stipulates that Mississauga Fire & Emergency Services (MFES) establishes certain services where fees will be charged for the purposes of cost recovery. These fees and charges allow MFES to recover the costs of such things as labour and consumable materials for certain types of incidents. The 2022 Fees and Charges, if approved through this report, will be added into a new consolidated fees and charges by-law.

Comments

The proposed fee changes to existing fees outlined in Appendix 1 have been adjusted to more accurately reflect the cost of delivering these specific services.

The fees charged for motor vehicle collisions and other specialty calls are based on the Ministry of Transportation (MTO) fee schedule. The MTO has raised their billable rates by 0.7%. Fees for those incidents have been adjusted to reflect the increase.

In 2015 MFES moved away from an in house evaluation program and began using the Ontario Fire Administration Incorporated (OFAI) - Candidate Testing Services to screen candidates. After 5 years of using this service, MFES has re-evaluated the program and is recommending returning to an internal evaluation. The process will consist of an on-line application, a skills inventory assessment, a written aptitude test and a swim test. Successful candidates will then be sent to York University for medical and physical testing. The added benefits of an internal process is that MFES staff have greater exposure to each of the candidates and it provides MFES with more control over each component of the process. Candidates will be charged an application fee of \$180 plus HST to offset recruitment administration and testing costs.

Financial Impact

The increase in existing fees is based on cost recovery for service and an increase in the Ministry of Transportation rates. This is expected to result in an increase of approximately \$11,000.00 annually.

Conclusion

The fee adjustments outlined in Appendix 1 are a result of a complete review of all MFES fees and charges. These adjustments have been made to address administrative costs and operational changes. It also provides MFES the ability to recovery costs and will reduce the impact on MFES resources and operating budget.

That a consolidated fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2022, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish the new, revised, and existing Library fees and charges as outlined in the Corporate Report dated August 3, 2021 from the Acting Commissioner of Community Services entitled, "2022 Library Fees and Charges".

Executive Summary

- The Library reviews fees and charges annually for the Library Board and Council's approval.
- The Library is recommending the elimination of overdue fines to align with the "best practice" trend in the public library sector, including neighbouring libraries such as Brampton, Hamilton, Toronto and Vaughn.
- The elimination of overdue fines will promote equitable access to library services and also support community recovery coming out of the pandemic.
- The remainder of the Library's fees and charges remain unchanged from 2019.

Background

The Mississauga Public Library Board (Board) reviews fees and charges annually, making adjustments as necessary. These include cost recovery fees as appropriate, establishing charges for new services and eliminating charges for services that are no longer offered. The resulting Fees and Charges Schedule is then considered by Council, and if approved, is included in the City-wide Fees and Charges By-law.

The Mississauga Library's 2021 Schedule for fees and charges was approved by the Board on May 15, 2019. The 2019 rates remain in effect due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In 2019, the City of Mississauga (City) conducted a Fees and Charges By-law Green Belt project, which generated recommendations that impacted the Library. Specifically, it was determined that the Library's Fees & Charges Schedule should be incorporated with the rest of the City's fees and charges to increase efficiencies and provide residents with consistency across Divisions.

The Library's preliminary 2022 Fees and Charges Schedule (Appendix 1) was considered and approved by the Board at the June 16, 2021 Board meeting.

Comments

Over the last few years, there has been a trend in the North American public library sector to eliminate fines for overdue material. An environmental scan shows that many Ontario libraries are following suit, including but not limited to, Toronto, London, Ottawa, Vaughan, Hamilton and Brampton. Moving in this direction would not only ensure that the Mississauga Library is aligned with the other leading library systems in the province, but also supports the philosophical mandate to provide equitable access to services that has long been championed by the Board. The Community Engagement Study conducted in 2018 clearly demonstrated that even the possibility of accruing fines is a significant obstacle for some Mississauga residents, creating a barrier for those who are not able or willing to assume the financial risk of incurring overdue fines.

There are other factors that support the timing of this decision. Many of our customers have been transitioning from exclusively borrowing print material to accessing digital resources. Since there are no fines incurred from digital items, the amount of revenue we generate from overdue print material is decreasing organically. The COVID-19 pandemic expedited this process as many customers who were previously reticent began using digital products, having no alternative during the stay-at-home order period. This, coupled with the lack of fine revenue we were able to generate during the pandemic, sets the stage for making the change now.

Financial Impact

The elimination of fines revenue would result in a projected \$509,000 budget pressure for 2022 offset by savings resulting from the Hazel McCallion Central Library closure and a nominal levy adjustment over two years.

While the COVID-19 pandemic has created many financial pressures for the City and its residents, the elimination of fines would help demonstrate Council's commitment to community recovery.

Conclusion

The Board reviews fees and charges annually, making adjustments as necessary. These include cost recovery fees as appropriate, establishing charges for new services and eliminating charges for services that are no longer offered. Staff conducted analysis which determined that many comparator libraries are removing fines and customers are using more library offerings which do not incur fines. Given these trends, and to ensure equal access to the Library for all, this report recommends the elimination of overdue fines for library materials. All other fees and charges remain unchanged.

Executive Summary

- Fees related to the *Planning Act* include rates for minor variances, zoning certificates, development and design applications, site plan inspections;
- The Planning Act fees and charges are reviewed annually to recover increased costs and respond to market conditions;
- This report sets out the proposed Fees and Charges for 2022;
- The City of Mississauga is currently completing a comprehensive review of the Planning
 Act Processing Fees and Charges, and a recommendation report to Budget Committee is
 expected in January of 2022 followed by an amending fees by-law to support
 implementation of the comprehensive review.

Background

Each year the City undertakes a review of the fees and charges collected under the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13, as amended. The *Planning Act* Processing Fees and Charges include fees for services and activities provided by the City departments involved with processing planning related applications (i.e. Development & Design, Transportation & Infrastructure Planning, Legislative Services - Committee of Adjustment, etc)

The City of Mississauga is currently completing a comprehensive review of the Planning Act Processing Fees and Charges. The study is expected to be completed by the end of the year and a recommendation report to Budget Committee is expected in January of 2022 followed by an amending fees by-law to support implementation of the new fee schedule.

Recognizing that the new planning fees will not be in place at the start of the business cycle, this report proposes an interim cost of living fee increase. The fees will subsequently be adjusted based upon the results of the study at the conclusion of the study. This report sets out the proposed Fees and Charges for 2022. The 2022 Fees and Charges, if approved, will be added into a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

Comments

A fee increase of 0.8% to the majority of application fees related to the Planning Act as identified in the accompanying table (Appendix 1) is recommended.

Increases, or new fees, are generally intended to account for increases in the consumer price index, new services provided, and the increased administrative and production costs related to the service.

There are no new fees introduced for 2022.

Financial Impact

The revenues generated from the proposed changes to the fees and charges collected under the *Planning Act* have been included in the 2021 Budget.

Conclusion

The fee adjustments outlined in Appendix 1 are a result of a complete review of all Planning Act processing fees and charges.

The proposed changes to the *Planning Act* Processing Fees and Charges for 2022 included in Appendix 1 will result in improved cost recovery.

Recommendation

- That the General Fees and Charges outlined in Appendix 1 attached to the Corporate report dated August 30, 2021 from the Commissioner of Corporate Services entitled "2022 General Fees and Charges" be approved.
- 2. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0251-2020, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2021.
- 3. That a consolidated fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2022, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish new, revised and existing fees and charges for the 2022 General Fees and Charges as outlined in the Corporate Report dated August 30, 2021 from the Commissioner of Corporate Services entitled, "2022 General Fees and Charges".

Executive Summary

- Fees for Corporate Services includes variety of fees which include meeting room rentals, inspections, audio visual technicians, zoning applications, licenses, certifications, court transcripts and business consultation inclusive of seminars and events for small businesses.
- Corporate Services fees and charges are reviewed annually to recover increased costs and respond to market conditions;
- No budget impact from changes in fees and charges.

Background

Each year, as part of the Business Plan and Budget development process, City staff review fees and charges charged under the *Municipal Act, 2001*, SO 2001, c.25. The General Fees and Charges include fees for general administrative services provided across departments. Fees and charges provide revenue to support services, which provide benefits to specific individuals and organizations, rather than all residents. By ensuring that fees and charges increase to maintain cost recovery ratios and cover cost increases, pressure on the City's tax levy requirements is reduced. If fees do not increase to cover costs, tax support for the program or service must increase and be paid by all residents rather than those who benefit from the service.

This report sets out the proposed fees and charges for 2022. The 2022 fees and charges, if approved through this report, will be added into a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

Comments

As part of the draft 2022-2025 Business Plan and Budget development process, staff reviewed the existing fees and charges and is recommending revisions to the General Fees and Charges By-laws. The proposed revisions to this By-law are set out in Appendix 1 to this report.

The majority of the proposed changes to existing fees are regular annual increases generally resulting from increased service costs or increases based on benchmarking with other municipalities.

The following fees are being introduced or significantly increased in 2022:

- 1) Legal Services:
 - NEW Consent to Enter Agreement Fee: This is a new fee that will be charged for the preparation, review and registration by Realty Service Staff for consent to enter agreements. The fee will be established at \$267 per agreement to align with the average fee charged by other comparable municipalities. The current budget does not need to be adjusted, as the revenue generated will be subjective to amount of agreements each year.
 - Applications for Site Plan and Rezoning: This fee has increased by \$168 as it
 was identified that these rates were out of date and were updated to reflect the
 current staff time involved for reviewing and drafting of these items. The current
 budget does not need to be adjusted, as the revenue generated will be subjective
 to amount of applications each year.
 - Encroachment Agreements prepared by Legal Services Staff: This fee has
 increased by \$128 as it was identified that these rates were out of date and were
 updated to reflect the current staff time involved for reviewing and drafting of
 these items. The current budget does not need to be adjusted, as the revenue
 generated will be subjective to amount of agreements each year.

• Development Charge Deferral or Credit Agreement: This fee has increased by \$128 as it was identified that these rates were out of date and were updated to reflect the current staff time involved for reviewing and drafting of these items. The current budget does not need to be adjusted, as the revenue generated will be subjective to amount of agreements each year. The Development Charge Deferral Agreement fee will not apply to Development Charges Payment or Prepayment Agreements referred to in Corporate Policy 04-01-08. This policy was approved by Council in February 2021 to implement new processes for development charge interest rates and statutory deferred payments. Staff will continue to monitor and review the application of this policy and report back to Council should any changes be warranted.

Committee of Adjustment: This fee has increased by \$128 as it was identified
that these rates were out of date and were updated to reflect the current staff
time involved for reviewing and drafting of these items. The current budget does
not need to be adjusted, as the revenue generated will be subjective to amount
of adjustments each year.

The following fees are being deleted or significantly decreased in 2021:

- 1) <u>Building:</u> The Following fees are being removed as this service is no longer provided. The budget does not to be adjusted as this fee has not be charged since 2017.
 - Private Sewage System Information Letters: Duplicate Sets of Drawings (Counter)
 - Printing plans from hard copy, microfiche and digital records: Early Review of House Model Drawings
 - Special Request for Access to Off Site Records and Drawings

2) Information Technology:

Paper product services within Fees and Charges By-Law were provided to print maps as the public didn't have the software or printing capabilities to do themselves. However with the widespread adoption of PDFs the public can print themselves or take the files to a print shop. As well, there is overall decrease in demand for paper products as users have embraced digital data. The City's Open Data policy is the mechanism designed to provide mapping data to the public, this has resulted in removing the below items from the Fees and Charges By-law. The fees below were rarely requested, so no significant impact on budget.

- City Street Index (Listing)
- City Street Index (Vector- All Roads, Majors Roads, Local Roads, Single Roads)
- Property Maps selectable scale (36" B&W)

Financial Impact

The recommended 2022 General Fees and Charges have no financial impact on 2022 budget. The Revenues generated from the proposed changes to the Fees and Charges collected under the Planning Act have been included in the 2022 Budget.

Conclusion

The annual review of general fees and charges has resulted in a number of recommended fee adjustments to address service costs and service levels.

Recommendation

- 1. That the report entitled "2021 Complement Adjustments" from the Commissioner of Corporate Services and Chief Financial Officer dated September 27, 2021 be received.
- 2. That effective November 1, 2021 a total of 15 contract positions be adjusted to permanent full time status, as shown in Appendix 1 2021 Complement Adjustments.

Background

To accommodate workload, several business units across the corporation have been relying on contract staff for several years to deliver what has become a normal volume of work. Many of these staff are funded from multi-year capital projects, and are able to continue working with the City on other upcoming or ongoing projects as their original assignments end. This reduces turnover and the cost of recruitment as new projects are approved that require staffing.

These complement adjustments will maintain current service levels, create workforce stability and mitigate business continuity issues and operational risks.

Staff in contract positions that are renewed, such that they accumulate service with the City, have the same right to Employment Standards and Common Law notice of termination and severance as those in permanent positions.

Comments

The concept of hiring contract staff was to manage special projects and/or temporary spikes in volume of work. However some business units are now managing what has become a normal workload through continuous use of contract staff. Reliance on contract staff to deliver core business creates operational risks.

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The areas affected by these changes are as follows:

• <u>Contract positions in Human Resources</u>: support for continued rollout of Success Factor modules and other technology tools including covid screening require ongoing staffing.

- <u>Contract position in Communications</u>: a position needed for ongoing work and maintenance of the City's website and the modernization of all related pages.
- Contract positions in Information Technology: these capital funded positions have been filled by staff whose skill set can be used for ongoing and future projects, funded by those capital budgets.

Financial Impact

There is no impact on the 2022 budget as these positions are funded.

Conclusion

An annual review is conducted to assess the status of longer-term contract staff. This review has determined that there are a number of positions that should be converted to permanent, based on ongoing and future projects. This will provide continuity and retention of quality staff on key City initiatives.

- That 5 new projects with a gross and net budget totalling \$2,237,603.12 be created and funded. These projects include PN21268 - New Fire Station 125 - Tenth Line and Battleford
 - Design and Construction, PN21110 Mavis South Sign Shop & Buildings Renos, PN21489
 - Public Art Installations, PN21404 Ward 9 Park Improvements, PN21562 MAX;
- 4. That a new Reserve Fund entitled "Tax-Funded Planning and Studies" (#33122) be created to fund various studies such as master plans and other action plan;

Executive Summary

Operating Summary, excluding Stormwater

As of June 30, 2021, the City is forecasting an operating shortfall of \$64.5 million or 6.7 per cent of the gross operating budget. Funding from the Safe Restart and COVID-19 Recovery Funding for Municipalities funding programs is sufficient to offset this anticipated shortfall, resulting in a forecast zero variance for 2021.

Capital Summary, excluding Stormwater

Recommended adjustments to the capital program will result in a revised net capital program of \$1,473.8 million to 972 active projects.

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- 85 projects are recommended for closure
- \$4 million is being returned to various reserve funds

Stormwater Financial Summary

Operating Summary:

As of June 30, 2021, the Stormwater operating program is forecasting a year-end favourable variance in the amount of \$1.1 million due to lower exemption/credit applications including declines in subsidy applications for the sump pump program. Any surplus at year-end will be transferred to the Stormwater Pipe Reserve Fund.

Capital Summary:

Recommended adjustments to the capital program will result in a revised net capital program of \$141.7 million with 98 active projects. 6 projects are recommended for closure. \$5.1 million is being returned to the Reserve Funds.

Financial Impact

PART 1: OPERATING RESULTS AS AT JUNE 30, 2021

Mississauga, as part of the Region of Peel, was given the green light to enter Stage 3 of Ontario's framework for reopening our Province in July. This was exciting news for our businesses and communities including opening the doors to our residents who have been looking forward to using our City facilities, libraries, community centres, playgrounds and more. As we welcome our residents and visitors back, our year-end forecast reflects the impacts felt due to restrictions on facilities and capacity limits imposed by the province.

As we look beyond into the fall we look forward to further safe reopening with restrictions partially or entirely lifted accompanied by clear provincial guidance and improved economic strengthening.

Based on actual results as at June 30, 2021, staff forecast the City will end the year with an anticipated shortfall of \$64.5 million or 6.7 per cent of the gross budget. Thanks to the Federal and Provincial support in the form of Safe Restart and COVID-19 Recovery Funding for Municipalities, which is expected to offset this anticipated shortfall. Table 1 summarizes the forecasted Year-End operating budget variances by Service Area, and identifies how these are anticipated to be managed using Safe Restart funding. The major areas of variance from the budget are highlighted below, with further details provided in Appendix 1-1 Operating Details by Service Area.

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Year-End Operating Result Highlights by Service:

MiWay

MiWay service is forecasting a year-end net deficit of \$42.8 million.

- An unfavourable forecast of approx. \$43.3 million is mainly due to lower ridership as a direct result of COVID-19 operating impacts. This forecast assumes that by December 31st MiWay would regain approximately 50% of transit ridership.
- Offset by a net favourable forecast of \$0.5 million attributed to \$2.0 million in forecasted labour savings related to vacancies offset by \$1.5 million in higher non-labour expenses mainly due to higher-than-budgeted fuel costs.

Recreation

- Recreation service is forecasting a year-end net deficit of \$7.7 million:
 - Unfavourable revenue forecast of \$38.2 million is a direct result of facility closures and observation of social-distancing protocols and public health restrictions due to COVID-19.
 - Offset by a favourable labour forecast of \$21.2 million mostly in temporary labour driven by savings due to minimal program offerings, unfilled positions.
 - Further offset by favourable non-labour forecast of \$9.3 million due to lower-thanexpected utilities costs, contractor costs, and materials/supplies costs resulting from facility closures as a result of COVID-19 impacts on operations.

Regulatory Services

- Regulatory Services is forecasting a year-end net deficit of \$6.6 million:
 - Unfavourable revenue forecast of \$7.4 million is mainly driven by decreases in parking revenues, Transportation Network Company (TNC) licensing fees and business/mobile licensing fees. This was a direct result of business closures and maintenance of public health safety regulations due to COVID-19.
 - Offset by a combined favourable forecast of \$0.8 million in expenses. The savings in labour of \$0.3 million and \$0.5 million in non-labour are directly related to COVID-19 impacts to operations.

Culture

- Culture is forecasting a year-end net deficit of \$2.7 million:
 - Unfavourable revenue forecast of \$8.9 million are a direct result of programs and events being cancelled or modified due to COVID-19 impacts.
 - Offset by a combined favourable forecast of \$6.2 million in expenses. The savings of \$4.3 million in non-labour expenses are due to the reduction in cleaning services, logistics and security due to the cancellation/modification of events related to COVID-19 impacts on operations. The remaining \$1.9 million savings are primarily driven by temporary labour and full-time vacancies.

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Legislative Services

Legislative Services is forecasting a year-end net deficit of \$2.7 million:

- Unfavourable revenue forecast of \$4.0 million is mainly due to the limited trials and closure of the Courthouse resulting from COVID-19 Provincial shutdowns.
- Offset by a combined favourable forecast of \$1.3 million in expenses. The savings of \$0.8 million in labour and \$0.5 million in non-labour are a direct result of the COVID-19 impacts on judiciary services.

Roads

- Roads is forecasting a year-end net deficit of \$2.3 million:
 - Unfavourable revenue forecast of \$1 million is mainly due to the low utilization of paid parking during the closure of businesses and the impacts on operations as a result of COVID-19 including impacts on revenue due to the delay of the Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) program.
 - Offset by a favourable combined non-labour forecast of \$0.3 million due to late start of the ASE program and other utility savings throughout the service.
 - Further offset by a net unfavourable labour forecast of \$1.6 million mainly due to labour recovery shortfalls of \$2.5 million offset by \$0.9 million in savings for various vacant positions and layoffs due to the operating impacts of COVID-19.

Parks Forestry & Environment

- Parks Forestry & Environment is forecasting a year-end net deficit of \$2.0 million:
 - Unfavourable revenue forecast of \$1.2 million primarily as a result of reduced revenues from lease agreements, utilization of sports field amenities and parks permits due to COVID-19 restrictions and impacts on operations.
 - Unfavourable non-labour forecast of \$1.5 million primarily driven by additional occupancy and vehicle requirements for social distancing, PPE, additional comfort stations and cleaning requirements as a result of COVID-19 impacts on operations.
 - Offset by a favourable labour forecast of \$0.7 million due to retirements, vacant positions and delays in hiring as a result of COVID-19 impacts on operations.

Land Development Services

- Land Development Services is forecasting a year-end net surplus of \$2.0 million:
 - Favourable revenue forecast of \$4.2 million is mainly due to an increase in volume of applications for building permit, development and rezoning fees driven by a strong housing market. In accordance with the City's reserve policy, these revenue surpluses will be recommended for transfer to the Reserves at year end to offset any future

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- revenue shortfalls. As such, the surplus of \$4.3 million will not contribute to the overall City bottom line.
- A combined unfavourable forecast of \$2.2 million is a result of transfer of building permit revenue to the Building Permit Revenue Stabilization Reserve, labour vacancies and higher-than-expected labour recoveries

Other Service Areas

- All remaining services are forecasting a year-end net surplus of \$0.2 million.
 - The net favourable forecast is primarily a result of savings from vacant full-time positions and delays in seasonal hiring due to COVID-19 impacts on operations. Also the City was able to reduce its discretionary spending on utilities and supplies as operations were scaled back.

Year-End Analysis from a COVID Perspective

We are currently experiencing a fourth wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. The use of City services continues to fluctuate, and potential COVID-related impacts can vary significantly for the rest of the year. Staff continue to model best-case, worst-case and anticipated scenarios when analyzing possible deficits. The 2021 projected year-end deficit of \$64.5 million reflects the anticipated scenario. The deficit is primarily due to reduced revenues, particularly in the MiWay, Recreation and Regulatory Services service areas. City staff have continued measures to mitigate the financial impact of COVID-19 where possible, including continued hiring delays, temporary staff layoffs where facilities have been closed, and aggressively managing costs.

Table 2 provides a summary of the City's projected financial position, and identifies the best-case, worst-case and anticipated scenarios. The information in this table is summarized in three categories: the direct impact of COVID-19, such as the loss of revenues due to closing of recreation facilities and reduced use of transit; the mitigating actions taken by City staff to reduce the impacts of COVID-19; and, business-as-usual surpluses and deficits that further affect the City's bottom line. Funding from the Safe Restart and COVID-19 Recovery Funding for Municipalities funding programs is sufficient to offset the projected shortfall in each scenario.

2021 Operating Budget Adjustments

According to the Budget Control Bylaw, all inter-program adjustments require Council authorization. These are normal process adjustments and reallocate budget funds from one program/account to another. Appendix 1-3, Operating Budget Adjustments by Service Area, provides details on operating budget movements which require approval by Council. These adjustments have minimal changes to the City's net operating budget.

PART 2: CAPITAL STATUS

As required under the City's Budget Control Bylaw, a Capital works-in-progress review must be prepared at least twice a year for Council. Included in this review is the on-going monitoring, evaluation and identification of projects to be closed, funds being returned to reserves, and projects requiring additional funding.

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As of June 30, 2021, the City has an approved capital program of \$1,477.8 million. Staff recommends returning \$4 million to various reserves and reserve funds from various projects. This results in a revised net capital program totalling \$1,473.8 million.

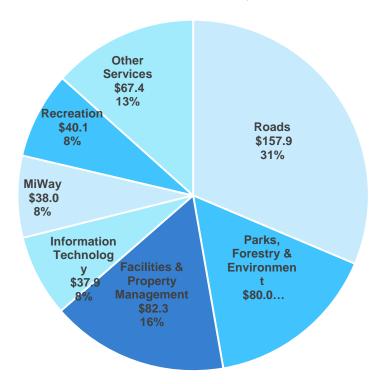
Of the \$1,473.8 million total:

- \$970.2 million or 66% has been spent
- \$503.6 million is to be incurred

Other Services includes: Mississauga Library, Land Development Services, Fire & Emergency Services, Business Services, Legislative Services, Culture, City Manager's Office

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City staff continues to evaluate older projects and return unspent funds. Of the \$503.6 million still to be incurred, 10% pertain to projects from 2016 and prior. Of the remaining 90% are from 2017 to 2021. The list below accounts some of major projects still in progress:

- \$43.4 million for various land acquisitions
- \$41.6 million for roadway rehabilitation
- \$21.5 million for various road property acquisitions
- \$18.8 million for the Central Library Redevelopment
- \$13.9 million for Burnhamthorpe Community Center Indoor Pool Redevelopment
- \$14.2 million for Cycling Program
- \$9.8 million for Goreway Drive Rail Grade Separation
- \$9.4 million for Square One Drive Amacon Driveway to Rathburn Road West
- \$7.5 million for New Fire Station 124 Dundas & Cawthra Land, Design and Construction
- \$6.5 million for Downtown Transitway Connection and Terminal
- \$6.4 million for Malton Community Hub
- \$6.0 million for Arena Renewal Paramount Fine Foods Centre
- \$5.7 million for Meadowvale Theater Renovation.

The review has resulted in \$4 million being returned as a result of all budget adjustments, transfers and project closures. The majority of the funds are being returned to the Federal Gas Tax Reserve Fund and Development Charges.

The following are highlights for significant funding adjustment requests, or for significant accomplishments of completed projects:

Fire

- PN19269 (CMFS00045) New Fire Station 123 Burnhamthorpe/Winston Churchill Design & Construction is returning \$0.7 million. Fire will be reprioritizing the new stations being built, swapping the timing of builds for Station 125 and Station 123. Station 125 will now be built prior to Station 123. As a result the remaining funds in 19269 will be returned and this project will be closed for the time being, to be repurposed to fund station 125's construction. Station 123 build will now begin in 2023 as per the current 10 year capital plan.
- New PN21268 (CMFS00145) New Fire Station 125 Tenth Line and Battleford, Design and Construction is requesting \$0.7 million. Fire will be reprioritizing the new stations being built, swapping the timing of builds for Station 125 and Station 123. Station 125 will now be built prior to Station 123. As a result the remaining funds in PN19269 will be returned and this project will be closed for the time being, to be repurposed to fund station 125's construction. Station 123 build will now begin in 2023 as per the current 10 year capital plan.

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Culture

New PN21489 (CMCL009707) Public Art Installations is requesting \$0.2 million in section 37 funds. Funds have been received and will be allocated towards a new project PN21489 to facilitate the installation of public art along the Waterfront Trail.

Parks, Forestry & Environment

- PN17381 (CMPF006451) Shoreline Damage Repair is closing and returning \$0.7 million.
 The original budget request was based on consultant's feasibility assessment and review which was higher than actual construction tender prices.
- PN20309 (CMPF008397) Land Acquisition Parkland (F-563) is requesting \$0.4 million.
 Additional funds requested are to cover site clean up cost and applicable taxes.
- NEW PN21404 (CMPF009816) Parks is requesting \$0.5 million to allocate section 37 funds towards various Park improvements including new park benches, outdoor fitness equipment, playground and trail improvements.
- PN21407 (CMPF008459) Urban Forest Management is requesting \$0.5 million to reduce the priority and service request backlog by December 2021.

Recreation

- PN15431 (CMPF04255) Park 459 Development (Churchill Meadows CC & Sports Park) is requesting \$0.3 million for final changes to complete the project.
 - PN16436 (CMPF04275) Community Parks P459 Indoor Pool (Churchill Meadows CC & Sports Park) is requesting \$0.3 million
 - The additional funding for both projects will be used to cover extra expenses incurred due to COVID related delays. Anticipated soft opening to the public is mid September 2021. Project completion is tentatively scheduled for December 2022.
- PN19426 (CMRC00092) BraeBen Golf Course Irrigation System— is requesting \$0.4 million for the project. The original budget for the supply and installation of a new irrigation system and pumping system was submitted by the irrigation consultant on May 20, 2019 and then further revised on December 16, 2019. Since this time there have been significant cost increases in material caused by pandemic production shutdowns in the U.S. The irrigation design has been scaled back and the procurement was value engineered to mitigate these cost increases. However there is still a \$0.4 million shortfall to complete the project.

Information Technology

 PN19558 (CPIT007120) SuccessFactors Sustainment Services is in progress and requesting \$0.2 million. All SF modules were successfully implemented driving many new efficiencies, the project is shifting to sustainment focus. These funds are required to complete the project in September, 2021. Budget Committee 2021/09/15 11 **8.12**

F&PM

 PN18702 (CPFP006451) Mechanical Renewal – Clarkson Depot is returning funds in the amount of \$0.3 million. The project was completed under budget due to competitive tender pricing. The project involved replacing the fuel pump systems in six (6) T&W locations: Clarkson Works Yard, Mavis Works Yard, Meadowvale Works Yard, Malton Works Yard, Malton Transit, and Central Transit.

- PN18726 (CPFP006444) LAC Lighting Renewal is closing and returning funds in the amount of \$0.3 million. The project was completed under budget due to competitive tender pricing. The scope was to replace existing interior lights with new LED luminaires. It is anticipated that with this lighting replacement, the City will see a 30% reduction in energy consumption.
- PN19722 (CPFP007151) Arena Renewal Iceland is closing and returning funds in the
 amount of \$0.5 million. The project was completed under budget due to competitive tender
 pricing. The project was executed on time and implemented with no disruption to facility
 operations. The project scope involved the lifecycle replacement of refrigeration equipment
 and new refrigeration controls. The replacement will renew the life of this equipment and
 keep the arena in a state of good repair.
- PN19752 (CPFP007173) Facility Renewal Clarkson CC Pool & Arena is returning funds in the amount of \$0.5 million. The project was completed under budget due to competitive tender pricing. The project scope involved the lifecycle replacement of the ice rink slab, dasher board system and rink piping. The replacement will renew the life of this equipment and keep the arena in a state of good repair.

Roads

• PN15111 (TWMR00156) is closing and returning \$0.5 million. The project was completed under budget as the project was undertaken in collaboration with the Region's road resurfacing project. Cost savings were acquired through competitive tender pricing and cost sharing for common elements. The project scope involved the construction of bus queue jump lanes and bus bays on Dundas Street at Erin Mills Parkway and a bus only left-turn lane and associated traffic signal modifications on Burnhamthorpe Road (eastbound direction) at Erin Mills Parkway.

PART 3: STORMWATER FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Stormwater Operating and Revenue Charge Summary

As of June 30, 2021, the Stormwater operating program will have a favourable variance in the amount of \$1.1 million due to lower exemption/credit applications including declines in subsidy applications for the sump pump program. Any surplus at year-end will be transferred to the Stormwater Pipe Reserve Fund.

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Further details are provided in Appendix 1-2, Revenue Charge and Operating Details for Stormwater.

Stormwater Capital Summary

The approved Stormwater capital program is \$146.7 million, including legacy Stormwater projects originally part of the Roads service area. Staff recommends closing 6 projects and returning approximately \$5.1 million to the appropriate reserve funds.

Recommended adjustments to the Stormwater capital program will result in a revised net budget of \$141.7 million for the active 98 projects.

The following is the highlight of major project funding adjustments:

Stormwater

- PN20004 (TWSD00210) Cooksville Creek Flood Storage Facility Bristol Road E, west of Kennedy Road is returning \$5.5 million due to lower bidding prices and favourable underground conditions.
- PN20029 (TWSD00381) Loyalist Creek Erosion Control between Thornlodge Drive is requesting additional funds of \$1.3 million. This request is based on the engineering consultant's cost estimate for the work. In addition to the original erosion control work, the project will also include re-alignment of a portion of the creek to move it out of private backyards and into the adjacent city park, as well as an expansion of the study area to include additional restoration work on the creek downstream of Thornlodge Drive.

Capital Appendices

The following appendices detail project updates, changes, and funding adjustments for all capital projects, including Stormwater:

- Appendix 2-2: Projects Completed, Delayed or Cancelled and To Be Closed 91 projects with an approved budget of \$46.5 million, including 6 Stormwater projects with approved budget of \$3.1 million, are to be closed. \$6.6 million or 14.2% of the approved budget amount being returned to the reserves and reserve funds.

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PART 4: MUNICIPAL ACCOMMODATION TAX

City of Mississauga introduced the Municipal Accommodation Tax (MAT) tax effective April 2018. This tax is collected by accommodation owners (facilities) offering short-term accommodation. The total revenue budget for MAT is \$9.8M for 2021.

In February 2020, a By-law was established to create Tourism Mississauga. 50% of the total MAT revenue would be remitted to Tourism Mississauga.

As of June 30, 2021, the revenue collected is \$1.4M. The year-end projection for MAT revenue is around \$2.65M or 27% of total budget.

PART 5: WARD-SPECIFIC SPECIAL PROJECTS

On May 22nd, 2019 a motion was passed by Council to establish capital projects up to a total amount of \$2 million per ward, to be used at the discretion of each local Councillor. These funds need to be utilized within council term.

Approved Ward Specific project # 20346 Cooksville Sign Project is requesting an increase of \$0.4 million. The additional funds are to allow for contractor services for supply and install of a new Cooksville Sign at Cooksville Four Corners, including replacement of the canopy panels and any related site work for the sign and security camera install.

New projects, to be established and funded from the Federal Gas Tax reserve fund are outlined in Appendix 2-7. A status update of approved projects by Ward is presented in Appendix 2-8.

PART 6: HOUSEKEEPING ITEMS:

ICIP COVID-19 Resilience Stream

The Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) is a 10-year cost-shared federal infrastructure program providing \$33B in federal infrastructure funding. On, August 5, 2020 the federal government announced that it would be adapting the ICIP program in order to respond to the impacts of COVID-19. As a result a new temporary Resilience stream, with over \$3B available in existing funding, has been to created to provide provinces and territories with added flexibility to fund quick-start, short-term projects that might not otherwise be eligible under existing funding streams.

Total eligible funding for ICIP COVID-19 Resilience Stream is \$14.8 million. Details project spending and funding adjustments are outlined in Appendix 3-1.

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Financial Bylaw Amendment

Currently, transfers between funds (i.e., Reserves, Reserve Funds, Operating and Capital) are approved through recommendations in Council-approved corporate reports. In addition, a second stand-alone enacting by-law is passed. Staff from Legal Services, Clerks and Finance Divisions met to discuss this process. It was determined that a stand-alone by-law was not required to transfer monies between funding sources and that approved recommendations in Corporate Reports is sufficient. In accordance with our Lean practices, staff have identified significant administrative time savings. Therefore, transfers between funds will be authorized through the approval of a recommendation or resolution by Council and the practice of bringing forward a subsequent financial by-law to approve the same transfer(s) will be discontinued. The only exception to this is where an amendment to the Reserves and Reserve Funds By-law 0298-2000 is necessary. This practice applies to transfers starting in 2021.

New Reserve Fund - Tax-Funded Planning and Studies

A new Tax-Funded Planning and Studies Reserve Fund is being established, with the purpose of segregating funding for various studies such as Master Plans and Studies across all service areas. These projects have previously been funded through the Tax-Capital Reserve Fund. This administrative segregation will provide increased transparency regarding how much is spent on planning studies. Equivalent funding will be transferred from the Tax Capital Reserve Fund.

Conclusion

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to significantly impact City operations in 2021 with a forecasted year-end operating deficit of \$64.5 million. The deficit is primarily due to reduced revenues, particularly in the MiWay, Recreation and Regulatory Services service areas. City staff continue measures to mitigate the financial impact of COVID-19 where possible.

The projected budget deficit is anticipated to be offset by already-announced Provincial and Federal funding through the Safe Restart Agreement and through 2021 COVID-19 Recovery Funding for Municipalities.

As a municipality we anticipate revenues will slowly return to normal, however we are limited in the ways we can adjust our costs to remain in line with revenues. Many of our services are essential and must be maintained. These projections will be updated as Provincial guidelines continue to respond to pandemic conditions.
