10. MATTERS PERTAINING TO COVID-19

Mayor Crombie spoke to the total number of COVID-19 cases in Mississauga and the Region of Peel and enforcement measures in the City.

Mayor Crombie enquired about the status of wearing masks on public transit. Geoff Wright, Commissioner, Transportation and Works advised that the City is advocating for masks to be worn on public transit, however, it was not mandatory. Mr. Wright also noted a report would be brought to Council next week on the Resumption of Fare Collection. Councillor Fonseca requested that the report include fare collection from an accessibility standpoint.

Shari Lichterman, Commissioner, Community Services provided an update on the reopening of park amenities. Ms. Lichterman also noted that staff would be developing recovery plans to re-open indoor facilities and pools, as well as summer camp programs. Councillor Fonseca enquired about implementing a Bike Ambassador Program and also requested a report to Council with respect to the status of the Community Gardens reopening.

Councillor Saito enquired about the status of road and parking lot maintenance and the status of signage for bicycle and pedestrian lanes on trails. Gary Kent, Commissioner, Corporate Services and CFO advised that there had been some delays in parking lot maintenance. Mr. Wright advised that capital projects for road maintenance were on schedule and that he would report back on the status of the signage plan for bicycle and pedestrian lanes on trails.

Councillor Kovac expressed concerns with the provincial order that overrides the Noise By-law; allowing construction to occur from the hours of 6 AM and 10 PM. Direction was provided to send a letter to the Province signed by the Mayor regarding the noise concerns.

10.1 <u>Planning and Development Committee Operations During COVID-19 Pandemic</u> <u>Recovery</u>

Items 10.1 and 10.2 were addressed together at this time.

Members of Council spoke to the matters and raised the following questions and concerns:

- Concerned about the public's virtual participation;
- Suggested Planning and Development Committee (PDC) meetings be held in the evening;
- Inquired whether Members of Council would be consulted on agenda items;
- Inquired about the impact on statutory timelines;
- Inquired about the success of resuming meetings virtually in other municipalities;
- Concerned about meeting notification and engagement;

Andrew Whittemore, Commissioner, Planning and Building and Diana Rusnov, Director, Legislative Service and City Clerk advised that both PDC and Committee of Adjustment would follow a similar format to Council, which would allow the public to participate through telephone, computer, mobile device or written submission. Mr. Whittemore also noted that Members of Council would be consulted on upcoming agenda items and noted that other municipalities had success resuming Committee of Adjustment meetings virtually. Andra Maxwell, City Solicitor noted that the Province had been in consultation with the legal community on the proceedings of the order that impact the suspension of statutory timelines and that there would be a transition period once reopening begins.
