Dear Mayor Crombie,

Thank you for writing to us to share the City of Mississauga's concerns about Metrolinx's considerations for how to improve parking at GO Transit parking lots.

Let me assure you that we have not made any decisions and nothing has changed at GO station parking lots at this time.

We are aware that parking is a challenge at many GO stations across the network. Although we are in the business of delivering transit to get people where they need to go better, faster and easier, we have become one of the largest parking providers in North America. Of our 77,000 parking spots at GO stations across the region, only 8 per cent are currently paid reserved spots.

We have the fastest growing ridership in North America and our GO services are very popular. Our ridership has increased over 5.3% this past year alone and we have increased our services by more than 35%. Increasing parking capacity is one way for us to manage the growing demand, and we will continue to invest in this in line with our GO Rail Station Access Plan. We already have plans to add 24,000 additional parking spaces by 2031.

However, parking alone will not be able to meet the future needs of our customers. 62% of our customers that drive to our stations drive alone and almost 1 in 5 customers that live within one kilometre of a station, drive. This is why we are working with municipalities like yours to improve connections with local transit and make it easier for customers to get to and from our stations using other modes of transportation you noted such as walking, cycling, carpooling and ridesharing. Of course, we recognize that it takes time to change customer behaviour and we are taking steps to encourage new travel patterns through investment in new infrastructure, local pilots, partnerships with third-party services (e.g., Lyft, Uber) and other incentives.

As a part of a broader access strategy, we are studying options to improve parking at GO stations. This includes exploring new ways to use reserved parking. Our teams are looking into approaches that improve the customer experience, while ensuring that riders have safe,

It is our priority to ensure transit costs remain affordable for customers. We are dedicated to consulting with stakeholders and understanding the end-to-end costs and impacts along the entire customer journey to find the most effective strategies.

As always, we remain committed to working with the City of Mississauga to build and maintain a safe and reliable regional transit service. I am proud, for example, of the work between Metrolinx and the City of Mississauga on the Hurontario LRT.

Our teams also look forward to strengthening this collaboration in 2020 and beyond by continuing to explore how we can leverage local MiWay bus services and provide more pedestrian and cycling connections to advance our shared vision of building a connected, transit-oriented region that maximizes residential, business and leisure opportunities.

I would be pleased to have a Metrolinx representative meet with you to discuss these matters and to consult on first mile/last mile solutions further. Dear Mayor Crombie:

Thank you for your letter of November 20, 2019 regarding the opposition of the residents of Mississauga to Quebec's Act respecting the Laicity of the State.

Canada is a diverse and inclusive society with vibrant Indigenous communities and heritage. Our country is characterized by linguistic duality and has a long history of immigration and integration.

Under the Canadian Constitution, the Parliament of Canada and the provincial legislatures can enact legislation. In this case, the *Act respecting the Laicity of the State* was adopted by the Legislature of Quebec.

The Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms (the Charter) is part of the Constitution of Canada. It applies to all levels of government, including to provinces and territories, to protect individuals against their human rights and fundamental freedoms. Notwithstanding these obligations, Section 33 of the Charter permits the Canadian Parliament and provincial legislatures to declare that a law is valid, even if the law or one of its provisions is seen to not respect certain rights protected in the Charter. This provision can be invoked for up to five years before it must be renewed.

Bonnie Crombie Mayor of Mississauga 30 City Centre Drive Mississauga, Ontario L5B 3C1 Canadian courts have the jurisdiction to rule on potential infringements of Canadians' Charter rights and the constitutionality of the Act. Provisions of Quebec's Act respecting the Laicity of the State currently are being challenged before the Quebec courts.

WHEREAS Plazacorp Properties Limited, has submitted official plan amendment and rezoning applications to permit a 101 back to back stacked townhomes at 2512, 2522 and 2532 Argyle Road, south of Dundas Street West, west of Confederation Parkway, (File OZ 18/017 W7)

AND WHEREAS the Planning and Development Committee has received and considered staff's report on the proposed development along with written and oral submissions relating to this matter and has recommended refusal of the planning staff recommendation for reasons as stated orally at its meeting of February 24, 2020.

AND WHEREAS concerns regarding, but not limited to, density, location not appropriate for intensification, flooding, insufficient parking and traffic safety and high volume, have been raised:

AND WHEREAS City Council, in accordance with section 2 of the *Planning Act*, shall have regard to matters of provincial interest, including the orderly development of safe and healthy communities, the resolution of planning conflicts involving public and private interests and the appropriate location of growth and development, among other things;

AND WHEREAS subsection 3(5) of the *Planning Act* requires that City Council's decisions in respect of planning matters shall be consistent with provincial policy statements and shall conform with provincial plans;

#### THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- That the applications filed under File OZ 18/017 W7 submitted by Plazacorp Properties
  Limited for the lands located at 2512, 2522 and 2532 Argyle Road, south of Dundas Street
  West, west of Confederation Parkway, be refused on the basis which includes but is not
  limited to the following reasons:
  - a) the proposal is not consistent with the Provincial Policy Statement;
  - b) the proposal does not conform and conflicts with all applicable Provincial Plans;
  - c) the proposal does not conform with the Region of Peel Official Plan;
  - d) the proposal does not conform with the Mississauga Official Plan, including but not limited to policy 5.3.5.1 which states that Neighbourhoods will not be the focus for intensification and should be regarded as stable residential areas where the existing character is to be preserved;
  - e) the proposal is incompatible with the character of the established neighbourhood and constitutes overdevelopment; and
  - f) the proposal does not represent good planning;

- 2. That City Council's decision reflects that City Council has fully considered all of the written and oral submissions relating to this matter;
- 3. That the City Solicitor, or her delegate, be authorized to defend City Council's decision and to retain external legal counsel and consultants, as required, should this matter be appealed to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal; and
- 4. That in the event that any development arising out of the subject applications is approved, City Council require the execution of all necessary agreements, satisfactory to the City of Mississauga, including but not limited to a Development Agreement and Section 37 Agreement, as well as payment of cash-in-lieu of parkland in accordance with the *Planning Act* and the City's policies and by-laws.
- 5. That eleven oral submissions made at the Planning and Development Committee meeting on February 24, 2020 be received.
