- 5.1 Item 7.1 Michael Foley, Manager, Mobile Licensing Enforcement

Mr. Foley provided a presentation on taxi fare models and provided the following fare model options: adjustments to the current fare, introduce a maximum fare, fixed fares or deregulation. Committee members expressed concerns with the fare model options provided and directed staff to further summarize the options given and provide a report at the next Public Vehicle Advisory Committee (PVAC) meeting.

Committee members requested an update on the accessible on-demand vehicle for hire project. Sam Rogers, Director, Enforcement noted that the committee had not come to a consensus with respect to the previous options given for the accessible on-demand vehicle for hire project. Mr. Rogers advised that the City could start collecting cash in lieu of accessible services from TNCs.

Raj Grewal, Brampton Resident spoke to insurance and deregulation concerns with respect to the taxi industry. Councillor Starr advised the resident to provide a letter to Council to request assistance from the Province on this matter.

Toronto Residents spoke to insurance concerns and noted concerns with TNCs.

7.2 2018-2022 Public Vehicle Advisory Committee Work Plan (For review/approval)

Al Cormier, Citizen Member noted the discussion that took place during item 5.1 with respect to accessible services for on-demand vehicles for hire. The committee directed staff to review the feasibility of collecting cash in lieu of accessible services from TNC's and provide a report directly to General Committee.

Mark Sexsmith, Citizen Member requested an update on increasing the vehicle model year restrictions to 10 years for standard taxicabs. Michael Foley, Manager, Mobile Licensing Enforcement noted that staff had reviewed the vehicles and advised that staff would request an amendment to the by-law to increase the vehicle model year restrictions to 10 years.

Mr. Sexsmith enquired about the status of fender numbers on taxicabs and Mr. Foley advised that the City is not enforcing fender numbers at this time.
