The deputants provided the Committee information about various recommendations that would increase accessibility including:

- low cost programming and support for low income residents;
- reviewing gaps in service delivery;
- monitoring capacity and use of recreation spaces to ensure they are aligned for equity deserving groups;
- enhancement of parks to reduce barriers and increase accessibility;
- flexible spaces in libraries, furniture, pop up libraries and technology;
- awareness of cultural events and spaces to support the arts, culture and heritage experiences and reducing barriers to participation in cultural events; and

 renovations at various fire stations that would increase accessibility and the vulnerable persons' registry.

Committee members inquired about pop up libraries in older condominium buildings, types of computers loaned out at library and their accessible features, library apps and partnership with CNIB, the vulnerable persons' registry, and facilitating encouragement and support for people with disabilities to remain active.



Best Practices Industry Scan

- Various policies and guidelines for designing accessible transit stops interfacing with active transportation facilities were reviewed
- The purpose was to identify and understand practices that inform the use of TWSIs at these facilities
- Focused primarily on practices in Ontario



Linear cone-like pattern, easily detected by foot or cane


Tactile Directional Indicator (TDI)










Integrated Transit Stops with Cycle Tracks (#1)


