

### **Executive Summary**

- Henley Road (Ward 1), Darcel Avenue (Ward 5), Heatherleigh Avenue (Ward 6), White Clover Way (Ward 6), Camilla Road (Ward 7), Colonial Drive (Ward 8), Forest Park Drive (Ward 10), Bancroft Drive (Ward 11), and Old Derry Road (Ward 11) are being recommended for the installation of physical traffic calming.
- Following a public consultation process, no significant opposition was received by each respective local community.
- Funds allocated from the Traffic Calming Program Capital budget are being utilized for each project, apart from Henley Road which is utilizing Special Project Ward Funding from Ward 1.
- No concerns have been raised from municipal services, emergency services or MiWay regarding the proposed traffic calming measures.

### **Background**

The Traffic Services and Road Safety Section regularly reviews roadways in response to resident concerns related to speeding, aggressive driving, and traffic infiltration on local roadways within residential neighbourhoods. The results of these reviews determine if physical traffic calming measures are warranted based on the City's Traffic Calming Policy (10-09-03).

In 2023/24, staff prioritized 8 locations for physical traffic calming measures to address issues of confirmed speeding and aggressive driving behaviour. Staff worked in consultation with the respective Ward Councillors in developing plans that would address the issues and reduce speeding on the roadways. The 8 projects would be funded through the available Traffic Calming capital funding. In addition to these 8 locations, one location has been identified by the Ward 1 Councillor to be prioritized and funded through the Special Project Ward Funding.

The following locations were identified:

- Henley Road (Appendix 1)
- Darcel Avenue (Appendix 2)
- Heatherleigh Avenue (Appendix 3)
- White Clover Way (Appendix 4)
- Camilla Road (Appendix 5)
- Colonial Drive (Appendix 6)
- Forest Park Drive (Appendix 7)
- Bancroft Drive (Appendix 8)
- Old Derry Road (Appendix 9)

#### Comments

Once traffic calming candidate locations are identified, preliminary plans are developed by staff. Consideration is given to the type, number, location, and spacing of traffic calming devices based on the individual roadway characteristics. The plan is designed specific to each roadway to have the maximum impact on operating speeds while ensuring a consistent speed throughout the area. The devices recommended by staff are commonly used throughout the City of Mississauga and are consistent with industry best practises related to road safety and traffic calming.

#### **2023 Traffic Calming Program**

In 2023, staff completed construction of traffic calming on all 18 roadways that were approved by Council. It should be noted that the 13 of the 18 roadways that received traffic calming in 2023 were Ward funded projects.

The results of our initial follow-up studies reveal significant impacts on the overall operating speeds. We have observed an average of 10 km/h decrease in the operating speeds, and an average of 35% increase in speed limit compliance where physical traffic calming measures were installed.

### **Engagement and Consultation**

Each traffic calming proposal was presented to the directly impacted residents, in the form of an online survey and, in some cases at the discretion of the Ward Councillor, an in-person public meeting. Residents were given an opportunity to provide feedback and voice their support or opposition to the plan. No significant opposition was received from residents who engaged in the process, and each project is supported by the respective Ward Councillor.

Staff have consulted with all municipal and emergency services as well as MiWay. No concerns associated with the proposed traffic calming proposals were raised that would significantly impact their delivery of service.

### **Financial Impact**
