6.1 <u>Dan Sadler, Manager, Standards Training and Compliance regarding the 2023 Accessibility</u> <u>Annual Status Update</u>

Dan Sadler, Manager, Standards, Training and Compliance spoke to the 2023 Accessibility Annual Status Updates and noted the key areas of focus, updates and achievements incorporated throughout the City regarding accessibility to include park updates, employment, staff training, customer service, digital communications, and spoke to the evolution of accessibility at the City. Further, D. Sadler noted an 98.4% completion rate with the remaining focus on accessible websites and documents.

Naz Husain, Citizen Member spoke to the ability to reach 100% with accessible documents.

In response to N. Husain, D. Sadler noted that staff would look at different options and use of HTML for documents and further advised the Committee that the Facility Accessibility Design Guidebook would be completed by the end of the year and advised that different accessible features would be added to the guidebook to include Type C parking spaces and evaluation of accessible pathways.

6.2 <u>Alana Tyers, Manager of Service Development regarding MiWay's 2023 Annual Accessibility</u> <u>Plan</u>

This item was heard before 6.1.

Alana Tyers, Manager of Service Development, MiWay spoke to the 2023 Annual Accessibility Plan and highlighted accessible bus stops and advised that staff would be looking at inaccessible bus stops and sidewalk improvements. Further, A. Tyers spoke to sidewalk improvement and bus pads, infrastructure adjustments to ensure accessible transportation, enhanced bus shelters with digital screens and audio announcements of real time next bus information, theatre seating on fleet buses and staff training on accessibility.

In response to M. Daniel, Citizen Member, A. Tyers advised she would take back her concern about accessible entry and time for seating on buses and spoke to spot markers and ramp deployment.

1.3 billion people experience disability

Persons with disabilities find inaccessible and unaffordable transportation **15 times more difficult** than those without disabilities



80% of disabilities are hidden and may not immediately be obvious



Diverse Challenges: Over 1,200 different conditions considered hidden disabilities, each presenting unique challenges to the individual Global Partnership: Originating from Gatwick Airport, expanded to encompass 40,000 participating businesses across 40 countries, including Toronto Pearson, Air Canada and Metrolinx

The hidden disability sunflower illustrates all of these conditions to make the invisible visible

Benefit to Riders

Improve the MiWay customer experience for individuals with hidden disabilities through creation of an inclusive environment that destigmatizes disabilities and ensures no individual feels overlooked.

There is **no qualifying list** of invisible disabilities - you simply choose to wear the Sunflower to indicate that you may need additional support, help or simply a little more time.

MiWay places high priority on ensuring that everyone has **full access** to our transit services, ensuring travel across our transit network is safe, convenient and easy.

Benefit to MiWay Employees

- The sunflower creates awareness and invites the employee to offer assistance.
- Supports a safe and respectful work environment.
- The Sunflower symbol doesn't focus on the invisible, it triggers a simple question 'How can I help you?'



Role of MiWay Employee

- Recognize the sunflower identifier and offer kindness:
 - Ask if you can help
 - Have patience, slow the pace
