





The updated Climate Change Action Plan will:

- Satisfy the commitment to update the 2019 CCAP every 5 years
- Address the March 2023 Council motion, which directed City staff to provide a Pathway Report to align with international best practices to limit global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius
- 3. Separate out climate change mitigation and adaptation into two distinct plans
- 4. Focus on a net zero pathway (e.g. mitigation plan) for corporate and community emissions

Phase 2 Energy and Emissions Forecast and Modelling

- The 2019 CCAP set the following target:
 - Reduce GHG emissions by 40% by 2030 and 80% by 2050 (below 1990 levels) with the goal of becoming a net zero community
- The 2024 CCAP is being updated to accelerate the City's targets and action pathways. The proposed GHG targets are:
 - By 2030, achieve a 63% reduction, relative to the 2018 baseline
 - By 2050, achieve net zero emissions

Being net-zero means we can only emit as much GHG as we are able to absorb or sequester
