## **Subject**

MiWay Fare Strategy - 2025

## Recommendation

- That the MiWay fees and charges outlined in Appendix 1 of the Corporate Report dated September 16, 2024, from the Acting Commissioner of Transportation and Works entitled "MiWay Fare Strategy – 2025", be approved.
- 2. That Budget Committee choose between two options \$1 senior fares effective January 1, 2025 or free senior fares effective July 1, 2025, as outlined in the Corporate Report dated September 16, 2024, entitled "MiWay Fare Strategy 2025" from the Acting Commissioner of Transportation and Works.
- 3. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0199-2023, as amended, be repealed effective December 31, 2024.
- 4. That a consolidated Fees and Charges By-law be enacted, effective January 1, 2025, to incorporate and establish new, revised, and existing MiWay fees and charges as well as those from various City departments, as outlined in the Corporate Report dated September 16, 2024, "MiWay Fare Strategy 2025".
- 5. That all necessary by-laws be enacted.

## **Executive Summary**

- MiWay boardings have surpassed pre-pandemic levels, seeing a 7.6% increase from January to August 2024 compared to the same period in 2023.
- MiWay's actual revenue increased by 29% in 2023, with a 14% increase expected in 2024 and an additional 7% increase expected in 2025.
- MiWay recommends no fare increase for 2025 for adults and youth, citing strong revenue

growth in 2023 and expected revenue growth in 2024 and 2025 driven by increased ridership and expanded service.

- MiWay presents two options for senior fares following the expiration of the \$1.00 senior fare pilot program on December 31, 2024. MiWay is seeking direction from the Budget Committee for a recommended senior fare program.
  - Option 1 Permanent \$1.00 Senior Fare effective January 1, 2025. Seniors will pay \$1.00 using both PRESTO card and cash. The full year revenue impact is \$1.4 million, which is accounted for in the 2025 proposed budget.
  - Option 2 Free PRESTO Senior Fares effective July 1, 2025. Seniors must
    use a PRESTO card in order to take advantage of the free fare or pay cash fare of
    \$1.00. The full year revenue impact is \$1.7 million. This option has not been
    incorporated in the 2025 proposed budget and would require a budget adjustment.
- MiWay recommends that the current pilot program providing free fares for children, become permanent effective January 1, 2025. Children must use a PRESTO card in order to take advantage of the free fare. The full year revenue impact is \$0.3 million and has been accounted for in the 2025 proposed budget.
- The current cash fare for adults and youth is \$4.25 and the senior cash fare is \$1.00. MiWay recommends no change to the existing cash fare price. Keeping the cash fare higher than the PRESTO price will encourage the utilization of PRESTO fare payment.
- Recommend continued support of the current fare discount programs: PRESTO Loyalty Program, Affordable Transit Program (ATP), Food Bank Program, and GO Fare Integration Program.
- Due to the introduction of digital U-Pass, replacement fees for U-Pass have been eliminated. Discussions toward a new U-Pass agreement, effective September 01, 2025, are ongoing. Council will receive a corporate report in January 2025 requesting approval for the new terms of the agreement.
- MiWay recommends a 3% increase in charter rates, Mississauga Transitway Access fees and MiWay Stop Infrastructure Permit Review fees, effective January 1, 2025, to account for inflation.
- MiWay recommends introducing a new Special Events Permit fee of \$501.50 effective January 1, 2025. The fee would be charged to organizations or individuals hosting special events that impact MiWay service operations or facility access.

## **Background**

MiWay fare revenues were significantly impacted in 2020, 2021 and most of 2022 due to ridership reduction during the COVID-19 pandemic. As part of MiWay's Ridership Recovery Strategy, MiWay fares remained unchanged to encourage customers to continue using the service during that time. MiWay's fare revenue has fully recovered to pre-pandemic levels in 2023. MiWay fare was increased in both 2023 and 2024; these fare increases were to help offset baseline budget increases due to inflationary pressures and expanded service resulting from increase in diesel costs, major maintenance costs and foreign exchange rates.

The table below outlines the changes in MiWay fare revenue collected between 2019 (prepandemic year) to 2023 and budget for 2024 and 2025.

Fare revenue collected grew 54% in 2022 and an additional 29% in 2023 resulting in MiWay fare revenue exceeding 2019, pre-pandemic levels. In the current period, ending August 31, 2024, fare revenue has grown by 15%, totalling \$70 million collected. If this pattern of revenue growth continues in Q4 2024 with the return to school and planned expansion of service, MiWay is projected to reach \$109 million in revenue by year-end, which is a 14% revenue growth from 2023, or a \$9 million surplus to 2024 budget. In 2025, MiWay expects to see continued growth in revenue driven by ridership increase.

The table below outlines the 2024 MiWay fares for all concessions.

On April 17, 2024, Council enacted By-law 0068-2024, implementing the 2024 MiWay fees and charges. This MiWay Fare Strategy report sets out the MiWay fees and charges for 2025 and if approved, it will be added into the consolidated User Fees and Charges By-law.

## **Comments**

MiWay currently recovers just under half of its operating costs through transit user fees (fares) and a small portion from advertising revenues. The portion/percentage of operating costs that is recovered from fares and advertising revenues is called the revenue to cost ratio (R/C ratio). The remaining expenses are funded through municipal taxes and provincial gas tax funds. The 2019 R/C ratio for MiWay was 45%, meaning that 45% of transit operating expenses is funded by revenue and 55% is funded by the aforementioned tax levies. The pandemic resulted in the reduction of riders, and therefore the R/C ratio declined substantially in 2020 and 2021. Strong ridership recovery began in the latter part of 2022, resulting in a higher R/C ratio which fully recovered to 45% in 2023.

Table below shows the actual R/C ratio from 2019 to 2023.

The R/C ratio is projected to remain stable or slightly climb in 2024 and 2025 as a result of increasing ridership and surplus revenue.

## **MiWay Fares**

MiWay fare pricing should be evaluated in the context of other Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area (GTHA) transit fare prices, fare category usage trends, ridership effects and future phases of the fare integration initiatives.

A comparison of GTHA transit fares is provided in Appendix 2 – MiWay GTHA Fare Comparison 2024.

MiWay's fare for adult and youth concessions is higher than the average fares of other transit agencies within GTHA. Brampton transit fares are generally higher than MiWay's fare on all concessions except seniors which is free for Brampton senior residents. The Toronto Transit Commission (TTC) fares are lower compared to MiWay adult and youth fares. Currently, two transit agencies in the GTHA provide free senior fares: Oakville and Brampton, the latter of which only provides free fare to Brampton senior residents. Child fare is free across the GTHA except in Brampton transit and York Region.

It is recommended that there is no fare price increase for MiWay in 2025 and that discounted pilot projects pertaining to Senior and Child fare should be permanently adopted. The following provides details of 2025 proposed fare changes for specific fare types and is included in Appendix 1 – MiWay Fees and Charges 2025:

#### **Adult and Youth fares**

Adult fare was increased from \$3.10 to \$3.20 in 2023 and further increased to \$3.40 in 2024. The monthly adult pass was increased from \$131.00 to \$141.00 in 2024. Youth fare was increased from \$2.35 to \$2.45 in 2023 and further increased to \$2.65 in 2024.

No change in fare is recommended in 2025 for adult and youth concessions.

## Senior fares (Age 65 years and over)

Council approved a \$1.00 senior fare as a one-year pilot discount program effective May 1, 2023, to April 30, 2024. In April 2024, Council extended this pilot discount program to continue through to December 31, 2024. Seniors can pay \$1.00 fare either by cash or PRESTO card.

MiWay is seeking direction from the Budget Committee for a recommended senior fare program. Two options are described below:

## Option 1 – Permanent \$1.00 Senior Fare effective January 1, 2025:

Seniors will continue to pay the \$1.00 fare either by cash or PRESTO card. Senior Monthly Passes continue to be available for purchase at \$65.00 or \$32.50 for seniors eligible for the Affordable Transit Program (ATP).

Prior to April 2023, senior fare was \$2.10 senior fare during peak hours and \$1.00 during nonpeak hours, weekends & holidays. The full year financial impact for providing all day \$1.00 senior fare is outlined in the below table:

\$1.4 million of lost revenue represents 1.2% of the 2025 MiWay fare revenue budget. This revenue loss has already been included in the 2025 budget. Should the Budget Committee decide to implement the permanent \$1.00 fare option, no budget adjustment will be required.

Annual senior boardings for the May 2023 to April 2024 pilot period was 3.3% of MiWay's total boardings and represents a 0.3% increase compared to pre-implementation period.

Opting for the \$1.00 senior fare will allow seniors to continue benefitting from a discounted transit fare while allowing MiWay to maintain fare revenues of \$1.7 million. This option allows both the taxpayer and the user (senior) to subsidize the costs of transit services and enhancements. With the population of seniors in Mississauga expected to rise in the near future, the cost of this program will increase accordingly.

### Option 2 - Free PRESTO Senior Fares effective July 01, 2025:

Free senior fare provides the most affordable option to travel on MiWay especially to riders with fixed or limited income. It will contribute to improved independence, allow seniors to attend appointments and engage in their communities, as well as enhancing overall quality of life.

Option 2 also supports the expectation from the Ontario Ministry of Transportation that MiWay and Brampton Transit work toward a full alignment of fares for the start of revenue service of the Hazel McCallion Light Rail Transit Line. Brampton Transit currently offers free senior fares.

Under this program, seniors must use a PRESTO card in order to take advantage of the free fare. Otherwise, a \$1.00 cash payment is required to ride. Any senior who currently uses \$1.00 fare by PRESTO will already be set up for free fare.

Annual senior boardings for the May 2023 to April 2024 pilot period is 3.3% of MiWay's total boardings and represents a 0.3% increase from a year prior to the pilot. The decrease in revenue compared to \$1.00 senior fare is expected to be \$1.7 million. This revenue loss has not been accounted for in the 2025 budget; should the Budget Committee select this option, a budget adjustment for the half-year revenue loss of \$0.85 million will be required. It is also worth noting that as the senior population of Mississauga continues to grow, the potential revenue loss of free senior fare will increase.

If Option 2 is selected, the implementation date would be set for July 01, 2025, to allow MiWay and Metrolinx to test systems and implement the required adjustments. As a result, senior monthly passes will be made redundant and eliminated.

#### Child fares (Age 12 years and under)

Free transit for children is already provided by most transit agencies in the GTHA except Brampton and York Region. Free child fares provide the option for children to use transit as their primary mode of transportation and learn how to use the transit system. This would make family travel more accessible and affordable.

Council approved MiWay's free child fare as a pilot program from May 1, 2023, to April 30, 2024. In April 2024, Council extended this pilot discount program until December 31, 2024. MiWay is recommending that free child fares become permanent effective January 1, 2025.

Under this program, children must use a PRESTO card in order to take advantage of the free fare. Only physical PRESTO card can be set with a child concession; a digital PRESTO card option for children is excluded.

The actual full year impact to MiWay for providing free child fare instead of charging \$1.75 is approximately \$0.3 million.

\$0.3 million of lost revenue represents 0.3% of the 2025 MiWay fare revenue budget. This revenue loss accounted for in the 2025 budget; should the Budget Committee approve free child fares; no budget adjustment will be required. Annual child boardings for the pilot period of May 2023 to April 2024 is 0.44% of MiWay's total boardings and represents a 0.04% increase from a year prior to the pilot.

### Cash fares for adults, youths and seniors

The current cash fare for adults and youth is \$4.25 and the senior cash fare is \$1.00. MiWay recommends no change to the existing cash fare price. Keeping the cash fare higher than the PRESTO price will encourage the utilization of PRESTO fare payment.

MiWay currently collects 5% of its fare box revenue through cash fares, a decrease from 14% in 2019. This cash fare transaction pattern is due to the introduction of open payment (debit and credit cards) in 2022 and MiWay's strategic encouragement of riders to use PRESTO.

## **MiWay Fare Discount Programs**

MiWay is recommending that existing discount programs for 2025 remain unchanged. The list of current discount programs is below:

### **PRESTO Loyalty Program**

MiWay introduced a new customer loyalty program in 2012 to encourage the use of the PRESTO fare card. The MiWay loyalty program allows customers who make 11 transit trips on MiWay during a one-week period to ride free for the remainder of the week when using their PRESTO card. This program functions as a weekly pass without committing to the full upfront cost. This program improves affordability for loyal MiWay customers. The number of trips required to travel free was reduced from 12 to 11 in May 2023.

## **Affordable Transit Program (ATP)**

The MiWay Affordable Transit Program became a permanent program in 2017 in partnership with Peel Region and the City of Brampton. Eligible participants receive a PRESTO card allowing them to purchase a PRESTO monthly pass for 50% of the regular price.

### **Food Bank Program**

MiWay introduced a partnership program with eligible food banks in Mississauga which allows them a discount to purchase MiWay 'special purpose' tickets at 50% of the total value. These programs provide affordable options for the most vulnerable transit customers.

### **GO Fare Integration Program**

Introduced in March 2022, transit riders can travel free on MiWay when connecting with GO Transit using a PRESTO card. This program encourages new riders and provides affordability for MiWay and GO Transit riders.

## One Fare Program

Introduced in February 2024 and funded by the Ministry of Transportation of Ontario, transit riders after paying a single fare using their PRESTO card or open payment (debit or credit card), can transfer for free within a two-hour period between MiWay and the TTC. This program encourages new riders and provides affordability for MiWay and the TTC Transit riders.

### **U-Pass for UTM Student Pass**

On January 18, 2023, City Council approved By-law 0010-2023, endorsing the newly renegotiated U-Pass agreement between University of Toronto Mississauga (UTM), University of Toronto Mississauga Student Union (UTMSU) and the City of Mississauga. This agreement was effective September 1, 2023, for a duration of two years, until August 31, 2025. The U-Pass is now exclusively available in digital format, accessible to all UTM students through their mobile phones.

The new U-Pass fee for pricing as per the U-Pass agreement is provided in the table below:

Due to the introduction of digital U-Pass, replacement fees for U-Pass have been eliminated. Discussions toward a new U-Pass agreement, effective September 01, 2025, are ongoing. Council will receive a corporate report in January 2025 requesting approval for the new terms of the agreement.

## Other MiWay Fees

Below is a list of other fees contributing to MiWay's non-fare revenue:

### **MiWay Charter Service Rate**

MiWay is recommending a 3.0% fee increase to the MiWay charter service rate to help offset

baseline hourly operating cost increases due to inflationary pressures. The changes are provided in the table below:

### MiWay Special Events Permit Fee - New Fee effective January 01, 2025

This fee is charged to any organization or individual who organizes a special event (parades, street festivities, etc.) that affect the smooth functioning of transit service or accessibility to any transit infrastructure, such as bus stops. The organizer covers MiWay staff labour and materials costs required to create, deliver, and remove service disruption procedures and communication to MiWay customers.

## **Financial Impact**

The proposed gross operating budget for the transit division in 2025 totals \$258.5 million, reflecting an increase of \$28.5 million or 12% over the 2024 adopted budget.

The proposed total fare box revenue budget for the transit division in 2025 is \$116.2 million, reflecting an increase of \$16.6 million or 17% over the 2024 budget. This increase of \$16.6 million is attributed to \$9 million base revenue budget increase due to higher-than-anticipated revenue growth expected in 2024 and carry over to 2025. Additionally, the projected revenue growth for 2025 includes an estimated \$7.6 million from new riders stemming from service enhancements and ridership growth in 2025.

The proposed advertising and other transit recoveries revenue budget in 2025 is \$4.6 million reflecting a net increase of \$0.5 million driven by advertising revenue increase. Consequently, the proposed total revenue budget in 2025 for transit division is \$120.8 million as shown on the table below:

These revenue increases have been included in 2025 proposed budget. The revenue impacts including \$1.4 million revenue loss for implementing the \$1.00 senior fare and \$0.3 million for implementing the free child fare has already been included in the 2025 proposed budget.

Should Budget Committee select the option of senior free fares, the full year revenue loss will be \$1.7 million, and half year effective July 01, 2025, will be \$0.85 million. This revenue loss has not been included in the proposed 2025 budget and will require an adjustment.

## Conclusion

The fare structure is a vital component of transit service delivery. It must be balanced between providing affordable fare options for riders, aligning with other GTHA transit systems and ensuring a reasonable cost recovery ratio for taxpayers. Given the significant growth in ridership and revenue seen in 2023 and projected throughout 2024 and 2025, it is recommended that no fare increase be made for 2025. Additionally, the discounted fare options for seniors and children are recommended to be implemented permanently. Continued support of the current fare discount programs is recommended.

MiWay is also recommending the addition of a new special events permit fee. Finally, it is recommended that bus charter rates, transit way access permit fees and MiWay stop infrastructure permit fees are increased by 3% due to inflationary pressures.

## Recommendation

- That the Transportation and Works Department fees and charges, as outlined in Appendix 1, Appendix 2 and Appendix 3, attached to the Corporate Report dated September 17, 2024 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works entitled "2025 Transportation and Works Fees and Charges" be approved.
- 2. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0199-2023, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2024.
- 3. That a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law effective January 1, 2025, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish new, revised, and existing fees and charges for the Transportation and Works Department as outlined in the Corporate Report dated September 17, 2024 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works entitled, "2025 Transportation and Works Fees and Charges."

## **Executive Summary**

- This report is the annual review of fees and charges for the Roads and Stormwater Service Areas in the Transportation and Works department.
- Review and revisions have been made to the current fees and charges to reflect increased costs and to ensure fees are comparable to fees charged in surrounding municipalities.
- Maintenance on existing fees and charges includes new fees and deletion of the existing fees

## **Background**

Each year, the Transportation and Works Department undertakes a review of the fees and charges charged under the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25. The fees and charges include fees for administrative and other services/products provided by the department.

Fees and charges provide revenue to support services, which provide benefits to specific individuals and organizations, rather than all residents. Ensuring fees and charges increase to maintain cost recovery ratios and cover cost increases helps to reduce pressure on the City's tax levy requirements. If fees do not increase to cover costs, tax support for the program or service must increase and is paid by all residents rather than those that benefit from the services.

On December 13, 2023, Council enacted By-law 0199-2023, implementing the 2024 Transportation and Works fees. This report sets out the proposed fees and charges for 2025. The 2025 fees and charges, if approved through this report, will be included as part of a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

## **Comments**

Transportation and Works fees and charges have been thoroughly reviewed and revisions have been made to reflect increased costs. In general, fees and charges have been increased by the rate of inflation, which has been estimated at 3%. This rate may be slightly higher when amounts are rounded to whole numbers. Municipal benchmarking comparisons have been conducted for the current/proposed fees and are comparable to fees charged in surrounding municipalities.

Fee increases or new fees are generally a result of increased administrative and production costs or new services provided.

## The following is a summary of new fees being introduced for 2025:

#### **Works Operations and Maintenance Division – Maintenance Contracts**

The Driveway Windrow Clearing Program has had a fee of \$200 per season since the program was first established. However, the fee was never included in the list of fees and charges and is now being added:

 Driveway Windrow Snow Clearing - Program for residents 65 years and older, and for persons with disabilities - \$200 per season

## Works Operations and Maintenance Division – Road Occupancy Permits and Contract Compliance

The following permit previously had no charge. A fee is now being introduced to recover a portion of the costs incurred by the City. Further increases will be made in future years to attain full-cost recovery:

 Temporary Road Occupancy Permit Application – Storage (Waste bins, moving and storage containers) - \$80 per Permit Application

## Infrastructure Planning & Engineering Services – Development Engineering and Construction

The following new fee has been created to reflect the time spent on file review and site inspection for Residential Additions - Unclaimed Deposit Release:

 Residential Additions (small additions/alterations, second unit access. etc.) - Unclaimed Deposit Release (Lot Grading, MSPD, ESC, Seeding/Sodding) for small additions, second unit access - Under the discretion of Development Construction, the City may perform a site review to release an unclaimed deposit – return of deposit less the fee of \$400.

## The following is a summary of fees being deleted for 2025:

## Infrastructure Planning & Engineering Services – Development Engineering and Construction

- Variance Approval to Residential Lot Grading after Approval Before building construction started - \$200.00 per request is proposed to be deleted since no longer required.
- Variance Approval to Residential Lot Grading after Approval After building construction started - \$600.00 per request is proposed to be deleted since no longer required.
- Variance to Block Grading in Industrial/Commercial of Multiple Family areas after Approval - Before building construction commenced - \$225.00 per request is proposed to be deleted since no longer required.
- Variance to Block Grading in Industrial/Commercial of Multiple Family areas after Approval - After building construction commenced- \$600.00 per request is proposed to be deleted since no longer required.

### **Works Operations and Maintenance Division – Maintenance Contracts**

 Construct Block Headwall (up to 300 mm pipe diameter) - \$825.00 per square metre is proposed to be deleted because block concrete headwalls are no longer constructed.
 Poured concrete headwalls are preferred over block headwalls as they provide a longer service life.

## **Traffic Management and Municipal Parking**

Replacement of Parking Multi-Visit Card - \$22.48 per card is proposed to be deleted because it is being replaced by digital solution.

• Parking Permit Replacement - \$55.58 per card is proposed to be deleted because it is being replaced by digital solution.

## **Financial Impact**

The additional revenue being generated through the revised and new Transportation and Works fees and charges proposed in Appendix 1 and Appendix 3\_Schedule B-4 will be offsetting increased costs in the 2025 departmental budget submission. The proposed stormwater rate increase is expected to generate approximately \$1,681,000 in additional revenue.

## Conclusion

The annual review of Transportation and Works fees and charges has resulted in a few deletions, revisions and a limited amount of new fees to cover increased costs.

## SCHEDULE "B-2" Transportation and Works Fees and Charges

## CHARGES TO EXTERNAL OR INTERNAL PARTIES FOR ENGINEERING, CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, TRAFFIC AND STREET LIGHTING WORKS

#### 1. General

- **a.** Payment of all fees and charges may be made by Visa, MasterCard, American Express, debit card, bank draft or certified cheque. The full payment for the total of refundable deposits and non-refundable fees combined must be made by bank draft or certified cheques only. Uncertified cheques will not be accepted.
- **b.** No discounts will apply for early payment of any fee set out in Schedule "B-2" to this By-law.
- **c.** The City's current Road Occupancy Permit By-law 0173-2020, as amended, and Lot Grading and Municipal Services Protection By-law 0172-2020, as amended, set out the deposits that are payable in respect of permits for construction on land abutting a highway or for construction that may affect drainage or grading.

### 2. Application of Schedule "B-2"

Schedule "B-2" applies to engineering, construction and maintenance, traffic and street lighting works undertaken by the Transportation and Works Department on behalf of External or Internal Parties.

Internal or External Parties shall be charged with costs, which include the Direct Costs (as defined below) of works performed either by City forces or by contractors working on behalf of the City, plus an Administration Fee (as defined below).

#### 3. Charges for Engineering Works

Charges associated with Engineering Works include, but are not limited to, work performed on behalf of External or Internal Parties, such as project management, design, survey, inspection and material testing activities in conjunction with the construction of roads, bridges, sewers and watercourse works.

### 4. Charges for Construction and Maintenance Works

Charges associated with Construction and Maintenance Works include, but are not limited to, work performed on behalf of External or Internal Parties, such as asphalt, concrete and sod restoration works related to utility and development works, turning lanes, island extensions, sidewalks, access modifications ("curb cuts/culvert extensions"), road modifications for developers, railway crossing restoration work, and newspaper pad installation work; as well as installation of signs and pavement markings.

### 5. Charges for Traffic and Street lighting Works

Charges associated with Traffic and Street lighting Works include but are not limited to work performed on behalf of External or Internal Parties, such as traffic signal modifications for developers, and street lighting pole small cell attachments for third parties.

#### 6. Direct Costs

The "Direct Costs" for works undertaken by City and/or contract forces are calculated as set out below.

If the City is using contract forces:

#### 7. Administration Fee

An "Administration Fee" is applied as a percentage of Direct Costs to compensate the City for indirect costs for works performed on behalf of External or Internal Parties which may include, but are not limited to, some or all of the following:

- Preparing and tendering projects;
- Functional and detailed design;
- Surveying and inspection for works maintenance activities;
- Reinstatement of disturbed areas;
- Overall project management;
- Administrative functions such as invoicing, issuance of permits and other administrative duties.

### 8. Total Charge

"Total Charge" for works performed means the Direct Costs and the Administration Fee as well as applicable tax and is established as follows:

Unless an applicable agreement between the City and the External Party provides for a different administration fee.

### Notes:

Refer to the Excise Tax Act, Schedule V (Exempt Supplies), Part VI (Public Sector Bodies), Sections 21 and 22.

When supplied by a municipality, the following services are exempt from Harmonized Sales Tax (HST), regardless of who is being charged:

a) Installing, replacing, repairing or removing street or road signs or barriers, street or traffic lights or property similar to any of the foregoing.

- b) Removing snow, ice or water.
- c) Removing, cutting, pruning, treating or planting vegetation.
- d) Repairing or maintaining roads, streets, sidewalks or similar or adjacent property.
- e) Installing accesses or egresses.
- f) Installing, repairing, maintaining or interrupting the operation of a water distribution, sewerage or drainage system.

#### 9. Reduction of Administration Fee:

Notwithstanding any of the above, it may be appropriate to reduce the Administration Fee on a project-specific basis. This may occur only in circumstances where necessary, such as when City staff is unable to complete any of the administrative functions (see Item #7).

A reduction to the Administration Fee of under \$50,000 requires the signature of the responsible Director.

A reduction to the Administration Fee of \$50,000 or more requires the signature of the Commissioner of Transportation and Works or their designate.

Justification for the reduction shall be documented, approved by signature (as stipulated in the previous paragraph), and placed in the project file.

### **DEFINITIONS**

- 1. In addition to the defined terms in section 1 of the By-law, in this Schedule "B-4":
  - (1) "Adjustment" means a process by which changes are made to information associated with a given Stormwater Account.
  - (2) "Applicant" means a single residential, Multi-Residential or Non-Residential property owner that submits a Request for Review Application or a Stormwater Charge Credit Application on the City approved form, where applicable.
  - (3) "Billing Error" means an undercharge or overcharge caused by a gross or manifest error in the preparation of the Water Bill or Stormwater Only Bill that is clerical or factual in nature, including the transposition of figures, a typographical error or similar errors.
  - (4) "Credit Application" means a completed application form and all required supporting documents demonstrating on-site stormwater management measures eligible to receive a Stormwater Charge Credit.
  - (5) "Credit Program" means the City's Credit Program that reduces Stormwater Charges for Multi-Residential and/or Non-Residential property owners who provide on-site Stormwater with stormwater management measures already in place. The Stormwater Charge Credit is received through a Credit Application.
  - (6) "Council" means the elected council of the City.
  - (7) "Director of Finance" means the City's Director of Finance and Treasurer or their designate.
  - (8) **"Environmental Services Section"** means the City's Environmental Services Section in the Infrastructure Planning and Engineering Division of the Transportation and Works Department.
  - (9) "HST" means harmonized sales tax.
  - (10) "Impervious Area" means the total area of paved or hard surfaces, building rooftops, compacted gravel, artificial turf, disturbed or compacted soil stripped of vegetation and other surfaces on a property which are considered highly resistant to the infiltration of water, increasing stormwater runoff.
  - (11) "Low Income Senior and Low Income Person with Disabilities" means single residential properties or condominiums that are owned and occupied by an individual who is in receipt of the City of Mississauga's Tax Rebate, in accordance with Tax Rebate By- law 56-10, as amended.
  - (12) "Material Change" means information as part of an approved Stormwater Charge Credit or Stormwater Charge exemption application that has changed, was not provided or aware of by the parties at the time and results in a property no longer being in compliance with the approved credit or exemption.
  - (13) "Multi-Residential and/or Non-Residential property" means a property that contains more than one residential unit and/or contains industrial, commercial, or institutional uses.
  - (14) "Place of Worship" means a property recognized as such by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) by the designation of an MPAC property code of 700 or 701 (Place of Worship With/Without a Clergy Residence), with the property tax/class qualifier "EN," meaning exempt.
  - (15) **"property"** means any real property within the City, including buildings, structures and erections of any nature and kind in or upon such lands.
  - (16) **"property owner"** means the registered owner of property or any person, firm or corporation having control over or possession of the property or any portion

thereof, including a property manager, mortgagee in possession, receiver and manager, trustee and trustee in bankruptcy, and any occupant, lessee, tenant or any other persons which is served by the municipal stormwater drainage system.

- (17) "Region of Peel" means The Regional Municipality of Peel.
- (18) "Request for Review" means the process by which a property owner requests a review of their Stormwater Charge assessment.
- (19) "Stormwater Account" means the Region of Peel's water and wastewater service customer account to which Water Bills or Stormwater Only Bills are invoiced.
- (20) "Stormwater Billing Unit" means the number of billing units assigned to a property as a result of a Stormwater Charge assessment. A single "Stormwater Billing Unit" is equivalent to the average total impervious area (267 m2) found on detached single residential properties in the City.
- (21) "Stormwater Charge" means the City's stormwater fees and charges listed in Appendix "A" to this Schedule "B-4" imposed pursuant to ss. 9 and 11 and Part XII of the Municipal Act, 2001.
- (22) "Stormwater Charge Credit" means a Stormwater Charge reduction granted to a property owner through an approved Credit Application.
- (23) "Stormwater Charge Program Coordinator" means the City's Stormwater Charge Program Coordinator in the Environmental Services Section or their designate.
- (24) **"Stormwater Charge Subsidy"** means a City grant provided to reduce or eliminate the amount of Stormwater Charge payable by a person.
- (25) "stormwater drainage system" means the physical infrastructure as part of the overall Stormwater Management System that is designed to manage stormwater flow.
- (26) **"stormwater management measures"** means a technique, practice or control used to manage the quantity and quality of stormwater runoff.
- (27) "Stormwater Management Program" means the planning, development, construction, operation, maintenance, renewal and enforcement of by-laws associated with the municipal Stormwater Management System to protect property, infrastructure and the natural environment from erosion, flooding and to improve water quality.
- "Stormwater Management System" means the infrastructure or measures used, controlled, maintained or operated by the City to manage stormwater flow and drainage systems and all appurtenances thereto owned, and includes, but is not limited to, storm sewers, catchbasins, storm service connections, drains, pipes, outfalls, overland conveyance systems including road corridors, culverts, channels, ditches, swales, rivers, streams, creeks and watercourses, stormwater management facilities including landscaping and low impact development features, storage ponds or underground tanks, and oil and grease treatment devices that control quantity or quality of stormwater runoff, pumping stations and all equipment laid within any highway or road allowance, City right- of-way or easement or City property used for the collection, transmission, detention and treatment of stormwater or uncontaminated water.
- (29) **"Stormwater Only Bill"** means the City's Stormwater Charge as invoiced by the Region of Peel where water and wastewater services are not provided or instances with multiple property owners.
- (30) **"T&W Commissioner"** means the City's Commissioner of Transportation and Works or their designate.

- (31) "Veterans' Organization Property" means properties recognized by the City as being used and occupied by the three Mississauga Legion Clubs and the Army, Navy & Air Force Veteran's Club, specifically:
  - Army, Navy & Air Force Veterans Club (765 Third Street, Port Credit);
  - Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 82 (35 Front Street N., Port Credit);
  - Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 139 (101 Church St., Streetsville); and
  - Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 582 (456 Hensall Circle, Cooksville).
- (32) "Water Bill" means the City's Stormwater Charge as invoiced by the Region of Peel in the same manner as the Region of Peel's water and wastewater utility charges, and itemized on the same monthly or quarterly invoice.
- (33) "Working Farm" means the portion of a property that is subject to the Farm Property Class Tax Rate, as assessed by the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC).

#### **SCOPE**

- 2. A Stormwater Charge shall be imposed upon all property owners in the City in accordance with Appendix "A", which is based on the amount of Impervious Area and property sizes and types.
- 3. The T&W Commissioner shall be responsible for the administration of this Schedule "B-4", and shall prescribe all forms necessary to implement this Schedule, and may amend such forms from time to time as the T&W Commissioner deems necessary.
- 4. Council hereby establishes the Stormwater Charges as set out in Appendix "A" and the Credit Program as set out in Appendix "B" to this Schedule "B-4". Stormwater Charges will be subject to HST where applicable.

### **CREDITS**

- 5. The Credit Program provides owners of Multi-Residential and/or Non-Residential property with the opportunity to receive a reduction to their Stormwater Charge for implementing and maintaining stormwater management measures on their property.
- 6. Owners of Multi-Residential and Non-Residential property may qualify for Stormwater Charge Credits where such property owners can clearly demonstrate to the City that their on-site stormwater management measures effectively control stormwater runoff and contribute in part to the City's efforts to manage stormwater. Qualifying criteria of the Credit Program are outlined in Appendix "B" to this Schedule "B-4".
- 7. Participation in the Credit Program is by application only. Owners of Multi-Residential and Non-Residential property must submit a Credit Application in a form approved by the City for qualification and consideration of a Stormwater Charge Credit. Credit Applications will be reviewed by, and approved credit amounts will be determined by, the Stormwater Charge Program Coordinator in the Environmental Services Section.
- 8. Reductions to Stormwater Charges made as a result of the approval of a Credit Application will be retroactive to the date of receipt of the Credit Application or the date on which the qualified stormwater management measures were implemented into service, as determined by the Environmental Service Section, whichever is later.
- 9. Stormwater Charge Credits do not apply to any property, or any portions of a property, that receives a Stormwater Charge Subsidy or is exempt from the imposition of Stormwater Charges.
- 10. Stormwater Charge Credits shall be in effect for a period of up to five (5) years or as otherwise specified at the time of credit approval. Credits will expire if not renewed prior to the expiration date of the credit approval.

- 11. A credit update application must be submitted to the City no later than three (3) months after any Material Change to a property that may impact an approved credit application. Any late submission of the application may result in a discontinuance of the current credit amount. The City may adjust (increase or decrease) the current credit amount.
- 12. A credit renewal application must be submitted to the City no later than three (3) months prior to the expiration date of the credit approval. Any late submission of the application may result in a discontinuance of the current credit amount. The City may adjust (increase or decrease) the current credit amount.

#### **SUBSIDIES**

- 13. The City is entitled to provide a Stormwater Charge Subsidy by way of a grant made pursuant to s. 107 of the *Municipal Act, 2001* to reduce or eliminate the amount of Stormwater Charge payable by the following persons:
  - (1) Place of Worship;
  - (2) Veteran's Organization Property;
  - (3) Working Farm;
  - (4) Low Income Senior and Low Income Person with Disabilities; and
  - (5) Any other subsidies, as approved by Council

#### **EXEMPTIONS**

- 14. Exemptions from the Stormwater Charge may apply to a property or a portion of a property that is either not subject to municipal fees and charges or not serviced by the City's Stormwater Management System.
- 15. The property owner is required to notify the City in writing when Material Changes are made to a property that could affect the distribution of an exemption amount or the validity of the approved Stormwater Charge exemption amount. Failure to comply may result in the cancellation of the exemption for that property.

#### **ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT**

- 16. The Region of Peel is hereby authorized to invoice and collect the City's Stormwater Charges, together with any interest and fees related to such collection.
- 17. The Region of Peel shall deliver a Water Bill or Stormwater Only Bill, on behalf of the City, to each property owner upon whom a Stormwater Charge is imposed under this Schedule "B-4" in the same manner as the Region of Peel's water and wastewater utility charges and shall be itemized on the same monthly or quarterly invoice.
- 18. Payment of all Stormwater Charges imposed by the City under this Schedule "B-4" is due and payable upon receipt of a Water Bill or Stormwater Only Bill. Stormwater Charge Credits under the Credit Program will be processed and reflected on the appropriate bill.
- 19. No person shall be entitled to any discounts for the early payment of any Stormwater Charge under this Schedule "B-4".
- 20. Interest on any outstanding accounts shall be applied and calculated at the current Region of Peel interest charge for late payment, and shall be added after the due date for each subsequent Water Bill or Stormwater Only Bill that is issued, with unpaid and carriedforward Stormwater Charges.
- 21. If Stormwater Charges are not paid when due and remain outstanding, the Region of Peel may enforce collection of the Stormwater Charges under this Schedule "B-4" in the same manner as Region of Peel water and wastewater charges. The Region of Peel is authorized to write-off uncollectible amounts in accordance with the Region of Peel's standard collection processes for utility accounts.
- 22. A Stormwater Charge imposed upon a property owner under this Schedule "B-4", which

shall be deemed to include any interest charges, penalties and all costs of collection, constitutes a debt of the person to the City and to the Region of Peel.

- 23. Notwithstanding Section 20 of this Schedule "B-4", all costs, including any interest on such costs, recoverable by the City and the Region of Peel pursuant to this Schedule "B-4" or otherwise pursuant to the *Municipal Act, 2001*, may be recovered by any lawful means available to the City and Region of Peel, and such recovery methods may include pursuant to subsection 398(2) of the *Municipal Act, 2001* and any outstanding monies owed with respect to Stormwater Charges may be added to the tax roll of the property in respect of the money owed and any other any real property in the City registered in the name of the property owner, and shall be collected in the same manner as municipal taxes.
- 24. The T&W Commissioner or their designate shall have delegated authority and is authorized to:
  - (1) approve or reject any application submitted for Stormwater Charge Credit or update or renewal of said credit;
  - impose such terms and conditions to any application under this Schedule "B-4" as the T&W Commissioner or their designate considers appropriate;
  - (3) determine and decide any Request for Review under this Schedule "B-4"; and that the decision of the T&W Commissioner shall be final and binding.
- 25. The Director of Finance or their designate shall have delegated authority and is authorized to adjust (increase or decrease) the Stormwater Charge on any property, to the extent it is deemed appropriate due to a Billing Error, and the account may be retroactively recalculated for a period not exceeding one (1) year from the date of detection with resulting credits or charges being applied to the property owner's Stormwater Account, and the decision of the Director of Finance shall be final and binding.
- 26. Notwithstanding any other section of this Schedule "B-4", the City reserves the right to conduct site inspections and may, at any reasonable time, enter and inspect any property, to review eligibility and may suspend, adjust (increase or decrease) or cancel credits if the approved stormwater management measures on the property no longer meet the performance criteria as documented in the Credit Application or the credit update or renewal application and/or its supporting documentation and/or the terms and conditions for the Stormwater Charge Credit approval, update or renewal.
- 27. A Stormwater Charge Credit may be suspended, adjusted (increase or decrease) or cancelled by the City under the following circumstances:
  - (1) failure of an applicable property owner to make Stormwater Charge payments as invoiced by the Region of Peel;
  - (2) failure of an applicable property owner to meet the terms and conditions of the credit approval;
  - (3) submission of inaccurate or false information by the Applicant;
  - (4) failure of the Applicant to maintain a stormwater management measure as required by the terms and conditions of the credit approval;
  - (5) failure of a stormwater management measure to operate or meet the performance criteria as documented in the Applicant's Credit Application or credit update or renewal application and/or its supporting documentation and/or the terms and conditions for the Stormwater Charge Credit approval, update or renewal;
  - (6) failure to submit a complete Stormwater Charge Credit update or renewal application within the required timeframe.
- 28. An adjustment or cancellation of a Stormwater Charge Credit may be challenged by the Applicant through the Request for Review process outlined in Appendix "C" to this Schedule "B-4". The decision of the T&W Commissioner or their designate shall be considered final and binding.
- 29. Where the City determines that a stormwater management measure is in a state of

disrepair, no longer functions as approved or was never implemented, the Applicant shall reimburse to the City the entire amount of the credit received in respect of the property since the date that the application was approved, updated or renewed or since the last inspection by the City, whichever is later. If the credit has been cancelled, the Applicant may not re-apply for a credit for a period of twelve (12) months.

### **REQUEST FOR REVIEW**

30. An Applicant will not be required to pay a service fee for any of the following Appeals:

- 31. The filing of a Request for Review does not stay the requirement for payment of a Stormwater Charge. Any Stormwater Charge billed during the course of the Review will be due and payable upon receipt and remain subject to the Region of Peel's standard collection processes for utility accounts.
- 32. Adjustments made as a result of a Request for Review shall take effect in accordance with the following schedule:
  - (1) Adjustments that result from Request for Reviews will be retroactive to the date of receipt of the Request for Review Application by the Stormwater Charge

Program Coordinator.

- (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) above, any Adjustment as a result of a credit update application under section 11 will be retroactive to the date of the subject Material Change as determined by the City. Where the change results in an increased credit, the additional amount will be retroactive up to a maximum period of six (6) months.
- 33. An Applicant will be contacted within ten (10) business days of submitting a request, subject to the volume of requests received by the City. The Stormwater Charge Program Coordinator may require further information from the Applicant in order to complete the review.
- 34. Stormwater Charge assessments may be revised in either of the following instances: (i) an external adjustment arising from an update to the assessment from a Request for Review, or (ii) an internal adjustment whereby the City may revise, modify or amend a Stormwater Charge assessment, subsidy amount, legal exemption, technical exemption or credit. These include:
  - (1) Routine geospatial data maintenance resulting from annual update to aerial imagery;
  - (2) Targeted review and update of assessments of properties which are undertaking a redevelopment process through City's Planning & Building Department;
  - (3) Routine updates to Municipal Property Assessment Corporation's assessment data; and
  - (4) Audits/inspections of properties receiving credit for on-site stormwater management measures.
- 35. Request for Reviews will follow the review process as determined by the T&W Commissioner as set out in Appendix "C" to this Schedule "B-4".

#### **GENERAL**

- 36. Appendices "A" and "B" and "C" shall form and be an integral part of this Schedule "B-4".
- 37. Should any part of this Schedule "B-4", including any part of Appendix "A" or Appendix "B" or Appendix "C", be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or of no force and effect, it is the stated intention of Council that such invalid part of the Schedule "B-4" shall be severable and that the remainder of the Schedule "B-4", including the remainder of Appendices "A" and "B" and "C", as applicable, shall continue to operate and to be in force and effect.
- 38. Words importing the singular number shall include the plural, and words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine, and the converse of the foregoing also applies, unless the context of this Schedule "B-4" otherwise requires.
- 39. Any decision or determination required to be made by the City or any official of the City under this Schedule "B-4" shall be made in the sole and absolute discretion of the City or the City official.

## APPENDIX "B" CREDIT PROGRAM

The Credit Program has been designed to provide a Stormwater Charge reduction to owners of Multi-Residential and/or Non-Residential property whose stormwater management measures provide a benefit to the City's Stormwater Management System and/or Program objectives.

A Stormwater Credit Schedule has been developed with four categories and eligible credit amounts as set out in Table 1 to this Appendix "B".

The following are descriptions and examples of the services in the City's Stormwater Management System and/or Program in each of the four categories in Table 1 of the Stormwater Credit Schedule that may be beneficially impacted by credit-eligible practices.

Peak Flow Reduction

Peak flow reduction includes the planning, design, construction, operation, maintenance and renewal of infrastructure to manage stormwater runoff rates and lessen the potential and severity of potential flooding impacts on downstream lands.

Examples of related infrastructure include stormwater detention basins, stormwater quantity control ponds and underground chamber systems.

Water Quality Treatment

Water quality treatment includes the planning, design, construction, operation, maintenance and renewal of infrastructure to actively or passively remove suspended solids and other contaminants from urban stormwater runoff.

Examples of related infrastructure include stormwater quality control ponds, manufactured treatment devices (e.g. oil and grease treatment devices) and low impact development works or green infrastructure.

Runoff Volume Reduction

Runoff volume reduction includes the planning, design, construction, operation, maintenance and renewal of infrastructure to promote the reduction of urban stormwater runoff volumes conveyed to the City's stormwater system. Examples of related infrastructure include low impact development works or green infrastructure and rainwater harvesting systems.

Operations and Activities

Operations and activities includes the operation and maintenance of infrastructure, property and implementation of practices that promote enhanced stormwater management and pollution prevention. These activities encourage and support lessening the impact on the City's receiving stormwater system. Examples of practices include sustainable landscaping, education, paved area sweeping, salt management and pollution prevention.

### Recommendation

- That the Fire & Emergency Services fees and charges, as outlined in Appendix 1 attached to the Corporate Report dated August 13, 2024 from the City Manager and Chief Administrative Officer entitled "2025 Fire & Emergency Services Fees and Charges" be approved.
- 2. That User Fees and Charges By-Law 0199-2023, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2024.
- 3. That a new consolidated fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2025, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish, revised and existing fees and charges for Fire & Emergency Services as outlined in the Corporate Report dated August 13, 2024 from the City Manager and Chief Administrative Officer entitled "2025 Fire & Emergency Services Fees and Charges".

### **Executive Summary**

- The fees charged for motor vehicle collisions and other specialty calls are based on the Minister of Transportation (MTO) fee schedule.
- The MTO has raised their billable rates by 3.1%. Fees for those incidents have been adjusted to reflect the increase.

### **Background**

By-Law 0199-2023, stipulates that Mississauga Fire & Emergency Services (MFES) establishes certain services where fees will be charged for the purposes of cost recovery. These fees and charges allow MFES to recover the costs of such things as labour and consumable materials for certain types of incidents. The 2025 Fees and Charges, if approved through this report, will be added into a consolidated fees and charges by-law.

### **Comments**

The proposed fee changes to existing fees outlined in Appendix 1 have been adjusted to more accurately reflect the cost of delivering these specific services.

The fees charged for motor vehicle collisions and other specialty calls are based on the Ministry of Transportation (MTO) fee schedule. The MTO has raised their billable rates by 3.1%. Fees for those incidents have been adjusted to reflect the increase.

### **Financial Impact**

There is no financial impact from the recommendations in this report. The increase in existing fees is based on cost recovery for service and an increase in the Ministry of Transportation rates.

### Conclusion

The fee adjustments outlined in Appendix 1 are a result of a complete review of all MFES fees and charges. These adjustments have been made to address administrative costs and operational changes. It also provides MFES the ability to recovery costs and will reduce the impact on MFES resources and operating budget.

- 2. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0199-2023, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2024.
- 3. That a consolidated fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2025, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish new, revised and existing fees and charges for the 2025 General Fees and Charges as outlined in Appendix 1 attached to the Corporate Report dated September 6, 2024 from the City Manager and Chief Administrative Officer entitled, "2025 General Fees and Charges".

### **Executive Summary**

- General fees include meeting room rentals, inspections, audio visual technicians, zoning applications, licenses, certifications, court transcripts and business consultation inclusive of seminars and events for small businesses, etc.
- General fees and charges are reviewed annually to recover increased costs and respond to market conditions.
- No budget impact: The recommended 2025 General Fees and Charges has no impact on the 2025 Operating Budget.

### **Background**

Each year, as part of the Business Plan and Budget development process, City staff review fees and charges imposed under the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25. The General Fees and Charges include fees for general administrative services provided across departments. Fees and charges provide revenue to support services, which provide benefits to specific individuals and organizations, rather than all residents. By ensuring that fees and charges increase to maintain cost recovery ratios and cover cost increases, pressure on the City's tax levy requirements is reduced. If fees do not increase to cover costs, tax support for the program or service must increase and be paid by all residents rather than those who benefit from the service.

This report sets out the proposed fees and charges for 2025. The 2025 fees and charges, if approved through this report, will be added into a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

### **Comments**

As part of the draft 2025-2028 Business Plan and Budget development process, staff reviewed the existing general fees and charges and are recommending certain fee adjustments which are set out in Appendix 1 to this report and are recommended to be included in the consolidated fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2025.

The majority of the proposed changes to existing fees are regular annual increases generally resulting from increased service costs or increases based on benchmarking with other municipalities.

The following fees are being introduced in 2025:

- 1) Economic Development
  - NEW Growth ID Membership Dedicated Office for IDEA Square One Innovation Hub:
     A new version of office space is being created to accommodate the need seen in the past 18 months. Two of the focus rooms are being added to the monthly rental pool under this new category which will include a dedicated locker.
  - <u>NEW Key Replacement:</u> In the instance where a Scale ID member has misplaced a
    key, this fee will be implemented to cover the cost of re-keying the lock and replacing
    the keys to the office affected.
- 2) NEW Additional Start ID member card/access card: Recognizing that some Start ID members require a pass for additional team members this new category was created to provide a lower cost and remove the need for an additional application process.

#### 3) Legislative Services

 <u>NEW Minor Variance and Consent Inactive File Fee:</u> This fee will be charged for minor variance and consent files that are inactive for 12 months.

#### 4) Revenue

 <u>NEW Tax Sale Tenders:</u> Tax Sale Tender packages are prepared with the individual property details that are advertised for tax sale. These packages are posted online for customers to purchase to submit a tender for the Tax Sale by Public Tender.

#### Animal Services Fees Notes

#### Fee Exemptions

A Person with a service animal or therapy animal may be exempt from Licensing Fees in the Schedule "A".

To be granted this exemption for a service animal, the Manager shall require proof of training from an animal service training agency which can include but not be limited to services accommodating the blind and hearing impaired.

To be granted this exemption for a therapy animal, the Manager shall require medical documentation from a licensed medical physician recommending use of a therapy animal.

\*Low income person will be determined based on the "Low Income Cut-Off" which is a measure of poverty calculated by Statistics Canada using an annual survey of incomes and defines a set of after tax (net) income levels below which individuals are considered to be living under the poverty line. Cut-off levels vary with the number of family members and are adjusted periodically for inflation.

### **Subject**

2025 Library Fees and Charges

### Recommendation

- That the Library Fees and Charges incorporating new, revised and existing Library fees as outlined in Appendix 1 attached to the Corporate Report dated August 12, 2024 from the Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2025 Library Fees and Charges" be approved.
- 2. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0199-2023, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2024.
- 3. That a consolidated fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2025, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish the new, revised, and existing Library fees and charges as outlined in the Corporate Report dated August 12, 2024 from the Commissioner of Community Services entitled, "2025 Library Fees and Charges".

### **Executive Summary**

- The Library reviews fees and charges annually for the Library Board and Council's approval in response to increased costs and current demands to ensure cost recovery.
- The anticipated increase in revenues resulting from the proposed fee changes is approximately \$4,000.

### **Background**

The Mississauga Public Library Board (Board) reviews fees and charges annually, making adjustments as necessary. These include cost recovery fees as appropriate, establishing

charges for new services, and eliminating charges for services that are no longer offered. The resulting Fees and Charges Schedule is then considered by Council, and if approved, included in the City-wide Fees and Charges By-law.

The Library's preliminary 2025 Fees and Charges Schedule (Appendix 1) was considered and approved by the Board at the September 18, 2024 Board meeting.

#### **Comments**

As part of the draft 2025-2028 Corporate Business Plan Update and 2025 Budget development process, staff have reviewed the fees and charges for the Mississauga Library to ensure that we are maintaining cost recovery, and identifying changes required with updates to processes and the introduction of new technology and services. The recommended changes to the Library fees and charges are outlined below.

#### **Service Charges**

In early 2023, a new print management system was launched across all Mississauga libraries. As the new system uses online accounts for funds management, the copy/print card has been discontinued, and is being removed from the Library fees & charges.

#### **Makerspaces**

Ongoing reviews of Makerspace fees and the cost of acquiring related consumable materials has resulted in various changes to items previously listed under the Item Charges, and Makerspace Materials sections of the Library fees and charges.

As part of the reviews, it was noted that vinyl used with different types of Maker equipment varies in price. The original Cricut Vinyl fee has been deleted and replaced by three categories of Cricut Sheet: Regular, Intermediate, and Premium. The Paper Coloured Sheet and Transfer Tape fees have also been deleted as they are now covered under the Cricut – Regular fee, while Heat Transfer Vinyl has been deleted as it is now an option available under Cricut – Premium. Descriptions of the three categories of Cricut sheets will be made available on the Library website. This will provide more agility with changes to material offerings as new options are introduced, or existing options are no longer available.

Vinyl used with the vinyl cutter equipment has also been reviewed by staff as new materials are investigated to provide customers with more options for their Maker projects. This has resulted in a realignment of the vinyl cutter material costs with three categories similar to the Cricut Sheet fees: Vinyl Roll Regular, Intermediate, and Premium. While the Intermediate material is a new fee, Regular and Premium vinyl roll fees have been adjusted to align with cost recovery. As with the Cricut sheets, descriptions of the three categories of vinyl roll materials will be made available on the Library website.

The Button Maker equipment allows for the creation of two types of items: pins and magnets. As the cost of acquiring these items differs quite significantly, the Button Maker fee has been split out into two fees for each item type. The fees now appropriately align with cost recovery.

A review of current 3D printing filament costs has resulted in minor increases to the PLA Filament and PVA Filament fees to maintain cost recovery with inflation.

As part of housekeeping, and for clarity, Library has reorganized the Fees and Charges table to ensure it is clear as to which paid consumable materials are related to each piece of Makerspace equipment. Certain items have been renamed for simplicity with the new equipment sections.

### **Financial Impact**

Changes to the Library fees and charges take into consideration inflationary increases based on cost recovery, along with housekeeping recommendations. As a result of proposed increases related to Makerspace fees, a \$4,000 revenue budget increase is forecast in the 2025 Budget.

#### Conclusion

The Board and Council review fees and charges annually, making adjustments as necessary. These include cost recovery fees as appropriate, establishing charges for new services and eliminating charges for services that are no longer offered. With the introduction of new consumable materials available for use with Makerspace equipment, and a review of existing cost recovery Makerspace fees, changes have been identified.

### **Subject**

2025 Parks, Forestry & Environment Fees and Charges

### Recommendation

- That the Parks, Forestry & Environment fees and charges, as outlined in Appendix 1, Appendix 2, and Appendix 3 attached to the Corporate Report dated August 7, 2024 from the Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2025 Parks, Forestry & Environment Fees and Charges" be approved.
- 2. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0199-2023, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2024.
- 3. That a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2025, which will include the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish the new, revised, and existing fees and charges for the Parks, Forestry and Environment division as outlined in Appendix 1, Appendix 2 and Appendix 3 attached to the Corporate Report dated August 7, 2024 from the Commissioner of Community Services entitled, "2025 Parks, Forestry & Environment Fees and Charges".

## **Executive Summary**

- Fees for Parks, Forestry and Environment services include rates for park permits, requested tree maintenance, sports fields, cemeteries, marinas, museums and associated services provided for specific residents, individuals and organizations.
- Parks, Forestry and Environment fees and charges are reviewed annually to recover increased costs and respond to market conditions.
- Incremental revenues of \$118,000 are forecasted as a result of the proposed fee changes.

### **Background**

On an annual basis in accordance with the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, Parks, Forestry and Environment reviews the rental rates for City-owned and operated facilities and programs including parks, sports fields, cemeteries, museums and marinas, along with additional fees for Parks, Forestry and Environment services provided to specific residents, individuals and organizations.

Ensuring that fees and charges maintain appropriate proportion of cost recovery ensure those who benefit directly contribute to these services, reducing the burden on the City's tax requirements. If fees do not increase proportionately to cover increased costs, tax support must increase and the costs to administer are left to all taxpayers. The 2025 Fees and Charges, if approved through this report, will be added into a consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

#### **Comments**

As part of the draft 2025-2028 Corporate Business Plan Update and 2025 Budget development process, staff have reviewed the fees and charges for Parks, Forestry and Environment services with the objective of ensuring that recommended price increases maintain cost recovery without adversely affecting demand. Staff reviewed cost impacts as well as current market rates, utilization and demand for rentals and services, user and staff feedback, and prior increases to determine specific pricing changes. The recommended pricing changes to Parks, Forestry and Environment services are outlined below.

#### **Parks**

Fees for the rental of park facilities and associated services help offset the costs to maintain over 3,178 hectares (7,853 acres) of City-owned parkland and open space, and for services to individual park users. This approach is designed to ensure fee recovery that directly benefits those who hold permits, thereby maintaining the high quality and accessibility of our parks for all users. In order to maintain cost recovery, rate increases are required to offset increased operating costs for materials, vehicles, equipment and labour. Fee increases of 3% are recommended for parks rental rates, vendor permits and associated services to offset inflationary costs. Historical increases for parks rental fees and associated services have not detrimentally impacted demand for facility use. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 1.

#### **Marinas**

The majority of the fees for marina rentals and services are recommended for 3% increase to recover the inflationary costs to deliver services. Further review of slip management processes and user feedback has resulted in the recommendation to remove the Monthly and Seasonal Buddy Pass between both City-owned marinas in exchange for a Weekly option. This would enable marina users to access both Marinas during non-peak times from Sunday at Noon to the following Friday at noon for their selected week(s). This fee was based on the previous monthly fee, reallocated into a weekly fee.

With the increases proposed, fees at the marina will remain competitive. This approach is designed to ensure fee recovery that directly benefits those who hold permits, thereby maintaining the high quality and accessibility of our parks for all users. Revenues for Marina rentals and services are expected to remain on target in 2025 as previous increases have not impacted demand for these services. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 1.

#### **Park Planning and Development**

The majority of fees related to Park Planning and Development are recommended to remain unchanged, as greenbelt and park processing fees are charged as a percentage of works completed. Additional fees are recommended to be increased by 3% to offset inflationary costs. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 1.

#### **Forestry**

Fees charged for Forestry services include on-demand tree works, tree permits and tree replacement costs as well as streetscape processing fees. To offset increased costs for contractor services, vehicles, equipment, materials and labour for requested services, an increase of 3% is recommended for most fees. The second and final year of a recommended 50% increase for Non-Resident/Corporate Tree Planting fee is recommended for events ranging from one to 100 participants. This increase is based on aligning the operating recoveries with the actual costs of events. These fees also better align with benchmarking of similar programs within the Greater Toronto Area. By aligning these fees with actual costs this team can provide increased events for community and affiliated groups through increased revenues and cost recovery. Historically, increases to fees for Forestry Services have not detrimentally impacted revenues. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 1.

#### Cemeteries

Under the *Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002,* S.O. 2002, c. 33, the City is required to maintain abandoned and municipally owned Cemeteries in a state of good repair. Lot sales, interment fees and other service charges are used towards offsetting annual operating costs for the ongoing care of 11 municipally owned or maintained cemeteries. A portion of the total fees charged for burial rights is placed in a reserve fund, where interest collected is used towards the perpetual care and maintenance of cemeteries owned and maintained by the City.

For most fees, staff is proposing rate increases of 3% to recover increased costs and to ensure that fees are consistent with market rates across the GTA, with the exception of any veteran fees which remain unchanged.

Historically, increases to fees for Cemetery Services have not detrimentally impacted revenues. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 2.

#### **Sports Fields**

Parks Operations maintains over 370 sports fields across the City to support permitting for major and minor baseball, cricket, soccer, football, volleyball and artificial fields. Pricing for sports fields is founded on the principle that in order to maintain service sustainability, sports fields should endeavour to maintain or incrementally increase their cost recovery rate year over year. This approach is designed to ensure fee recovery that directly benefits those who hold permits, thereby maintaining the high quality and accessibility of our parks for all users.

Over the last several years, staff have consulted with most outdoor sports field users both individually and through the Outdoor Sports Field User Network on user fees to receive feedback and support for rental fees prior to Budget Committee's consideration.

In 2025, a rate increase of 3% is proposed to offset inflationary costs. The Outdoor Sports Field User Network has been advised of the changes for 2025 fees. Historically, minimal increases to Sports Fees has not had detrimental impacts to participation rates or demand for City facilities. Fee increases are recommended in Appendix 3.

Looking to 2026 Fees and Charges, sports fields rates have undergone a comprehensive review with a revised cost recovery and benchmarking model underway. The goal of this model is to revise fees to reflect operating costs by sport, while ensuring alignment with neighbouring municipalities. To address cost recovery deficiencies in sports user fees, rate increases will need to be considered over several years commencing in 2026. City staff will work with the Outdoor Sports Field User Network through late 2024 and early 2025 to receive feedback and develop a strategy for rolling out revised fees from 2026 to approximately 2029.

Additionally, fees for permitting of Tennis/Pickleball Courts has been introduced based on user demand. These fees are reflective of operating costs and benchmarking amongst neighbouring municipalities.

#### **New Fees**

#### **Tennis/Pickleball Court Fees**

Given the increase in popularity and continued user demand, fees for permitting of Tennis/Pickleball Courts are recommended for select operational hours to offer this amenity to user groups as well as Residents who wish to reserve specific play time. This fee will be for specific courts across the City and during specific time blocks to ensure open play time is still available for the public who wish to participate in drop-in play. The fee being proposed is based on recovery of operational costs and benchmarking of nearby Municipal facilities.

#### Non-Resident/Corporate Group Forestry Event

Events offered by the Forestry Team historically has been for tree planting. More recently there has been requests for non-planting events, including those for invasive species removal, stewardship and maintenance of natural areas. Based on this demand Forestry is proposing a

new fee to deliver these events to Non-Resident and Corporate Groups. The fee will be assessed based on the number of participants, materials required and resource impacts to deliver the event. As with the Non-Resident/Corporate Tree Planting event fees, these fees do not apply to Residents, Community or School groups.

### **Financial Impact**

As a result of the projected increases, a \$136,000 revenue budget increase is proposed in the 2025 Budget and Business Plan. Revenues are not anticipated to be impacted by any increases to fees.

#### Conclusion

Fee increases assist Parks, Forestry and Environment in offsetting increased annual operating costs including labour, equipment, materials and supplies for the ongoing care and maintenance of City-owned open space assets. The proposed fees for Parks, Forestry and Environment have been adjusted to assist in maintaining user demand for rentals, along with maintaining cost recovery for on-demand services to reduce the pressure on the tax levy.

- Park permit fees may be waived for occasional park use by schools, not for profit community youth groups, conservation authorities, rate payers groups, Port Credit Yacht Club's Annual Racing Series official finish line and groups working in partnership with staff on weekdays (Monday to Friday) only.

  Park access permit fees may be waived for Conservation Authorities and the Region of Peel.

  Photography and park permits may be booked within the following timelines:

  Residents & Community Groups: up to 10 months in advance

  Non-Residents and Commercial: up to 2 months in advance

  Non-Residents and Commercial: up to 2 months in advance

  The 2 adjacent shelters at Lakeside Park (Area A, Area B) are considered 1 area for park permit fee considerations.

  Standard Park fees also apply to Streetsville Village Square in addition to fees specific to this location.

  Sikhard's Memorial Park may be booked annually by the Sheaby flamily for a World Peace Celebration at no charge.

  Seasonal Park Permit is intended for shared use of park space, not exclusive use of park or commercial activities.

  For delivery and pickup of picnic tables and/or waste receptacles related to park permit fees, the total per load can be a combination of Picnic Tables (max. 9) and/or Waste/Recycling Receptacles (max. 6 with picnic tables, max. 20 without picnic tables)

- Meetings of official City business held by the ward councillors at a community centre in their ward are booked at no charge. If specialized requirements are needed at the location, standard charges apply.

- Meetings of official Lity business held by the ward councilions at a community centre in their ward are booked at no charge. If specialized requirements are needed at the location, sta-City staff can receive free meeting space at Parks for city business except when:

   The meeting is booked on behalf of another group
   The booking is requested at a community centre/banquet facility

   The booking for staff refirement events
   The standard park permit rate and additional standard fees apply for all exceptions noted above. For City business, an account number must be provided at the time of booking.

- Marina Fee Notes:

  Lakefront Promenade Buddy Pass: Provides ability for transient use of Credit Village Marina, available Sunday noon to Friday Noon.

  Marina fees can be walved for Coast Guard and Police requiring waterfront access.

  Late payment charge is effective the day after the payment is due on any outstanding fees.

  Non-Resident slip fees for existing Seasonal slip holders was enacted in 2023.

#### Forestry Fees Notes:

- Forestry Administration fee is applicable for Forestry services completed within the road allowance, By-law contraventions, Non-Resident/Corporate Forestry events 101+ people and other forestry services as approved by the Director of Parks, Forestry and Environment.

   The Replacement of Damaged or Destroyed Street Trees fee is applicable to existing street trees damaged or destroyed due to acident, construction activities or the unauthorized pruning or removal by third parties.

   The Non-Resident/Corporate Fore Palming Event Fee and Forestry Event Fee does not apply to Residentians, Community Groups and Schools. These Fees are applicable for any requested Non-Residentify/Corporate Event facilitated by Forestry including but not limited to tree plantings,
- invasive species and naturalizations
- There is no charge for a Tree Removal Permit/Permission for any tree that is dead, dying, or hazardous.
  For Non-Resident/Corporate Event cancellations not due to weather, the fee is 10% of the total event cost.

2025 Recreation & Culture Program Fees and Rental Rates

#### Recommendation

- 1. That the Recreation and Culture rental rates and notes incorporating new, revised and existing charges for Meeting Rooms, Food Services and Banquets, Garry W. Morden Training Centre, Pools, Culture Venues, Filming Locations, Box Office, other rentals and associated services and sundries, effective January 1, 2025 through to December 31, 2025 (as outlined in Appendices 1 and 2 attached to the Corporate Report dated September 10, 2024, from the Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2025 Recreation and Culture Programs Fees and Rental Rates") be approved.
- 2. That the Recreation rental rates and notes incorporating new, revised and existing charges for Arenas, Gyms and Indoor Artificial Turf, effective May 1, 2025 through to April 30, 2026 (as outlined in Appendices 3 and 4 attached to the Corporate Report dated September 10, 2024, from the Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2025 Recreation & Culture Programs Fees and Rental Rates") be approved.
- 3. That the program fees and rental rates currently listed in Schedule "E-2" (Recreation Rental Rates); Schedule "E-3" (Recreation Program fees and charges); Schedule "F-2" (Culture Program Fees and Charges) of Users Fees and charges by-law 0199-2023, effective the start of the spring session 2025 through to the end of the winter session 2026, be incorporated into the new consolidated fees and charges by-law.
- 4. That the Recreation and Culture program fees and notes incorporating new, revised and existing charges for Recreation and Culture Programs, effective the start date of spring 2025 recreation program through to the end date of winter session 2026 except for Museums of Mississauga Drop In Programs & Pay-As-You-Go (PAYG) fees and charges and Corporate Workshops and Birthday Parties fees and charges, which are effective January 1, 2025 through to December 31, 2025 (as outlined in Appendices 5 and 6 attached to the Corporate Report dated September 10, 2024, from the

Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2025 Recreation & Culture Programs Fees and Rental Rates") be approved.

- 5. That the Culture Education program fees and notes incorporating new, revised and existing charges for Culture School Education programs, effective September 1, 2025 through to August 31, 2026 (as outlined in Appendices 8 and 9 attached to the Corporate Report dated September 10, 2024, from the Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2025 Recreation & Culture Programs Fees and Rental Rates") be approved.
- 6. That the Culture Education program fees currently listed in Schedule "F-3" of User Fees and Charges by-law 0199-2023, which are applicable until August 31, 2025 be added to the new consolidated fees and charges by-law.
- 7. That User Fees and Charges by-law 0199-2023, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2024.
- 8. That a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2025, which will include the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish the new, revised, and existing Recreation and Culture program fees and rental rates, as outlined in the Corporate Report dated September 10, 2024, from the Commissioner of Community Services entitled "2025 Recreation and Culture Programs fees and Rental Rates."

### **Executive Summary**

- Recreation and Culture program fees and rental rate increases are reviewed and analyzed annually in response to increased costs, current demand and market conditions.
- Price increases are recommended for those programs and lines of business that can absorb the increase without negatively affecting participation or revenue.
- Culture fees continue to be examined and aligned, considering customer impact.
- As a result of these recommendations, Recreation & Culture is expected to drive incremental revenues of \$1,085,200 for 2025.

### **Background**

On an annual basis the fees charged for Recreation and Culture offerings are reviewed and, in accordance with the *Municipal Act, 2001*, adjustments for program fees, rentals, and memberships are recommended to Council for approval. This report sets out the proposed fees and charges for 2025. The 2025 fees and charges, if approved through this report, will be incorporated into a new consolidated user fees and charges by-law.

User fees are one of two principle sources of funding for Recreation services; property taxes being the other. As a result, any cost not directly recovered through user fees is, by definition, subsidized through property taxes. This is true of all municipal programs and services and must be understood when setting user fees. If individual rates and user fees fail to keep pace with the costs associated with delivering a given program or service, then that cost must be recovered through increases in the property taxes of all residents.

The guiding principles and assumptions for Recreation's pricing were established in accordance with the Pricing Study, a comprehensive document that was approved in principle by the Budget Committee. This document dictates that fees should be established based on a combination of factors including: cost recovery; affordability of programs and services to generate the greatest societal benefit; fees ensure that desired services are sustainable; and that fees for services that are the same as those provided by the community will be guided by the market.

#### **Comments**

Fee and rate changes are recommended after significant analysis is completed to determine demand and market benchmarking. Potential fee increases first focused on a base increase of 3% in order to recover a portion of increased labour and operational costs. Further changes were identified for offerings that are not aligned with external benchmarking and/or offerings where demand analysis demonstrates an opportunity to alter price to drive more utilization.

As existing program fees and rental rates listed in Schedules "E-2", "E-3", "F-2" and "F-3" of the User Fees and Charges by-law 0199-2023, as amended, extend into 2025, those program fees and rental rates will also be included in the new consolidated user fees and charges by-law to cover the period until the 2025 program fees and rental rates are in effect.

Price increases have been identified for the majority of rentals, memberships and programs for the lines of business. A list of all Recreation and Culture programs and their associated proposed program fee categories can be found in Appendix 7. The recommended pricing changes specific to each line of business are outlined below.

#### **Aquatics**

Analysis of pricing in the Aquatics Line of Business determined that increases in Aquatics programs, memberships, rentals and pay as you go fees can be sustained in 2025. The total estimated revenue increase for the Aquatics line of business is \$188,000 for 2025.

#### **Arenas**

In order to accommodate rising labour and operating costs for arenas, it is proposed that ice rental rates increase by an average of 3%. The fee changes for the Arena line of business is expected to generate an additional \$191,900 in budgeted revenue for 2025.

#### **Community Programs and Camps**

Community Programs, including Learn to Skate and Camps, generate a significant volume of participation and support our mandate of delivering community-based affordable recreation opportunities for residents. Benchmarking and local market analysis has confirmed that the City's Community Programs and Camps can sustain a 3% increase. The recommended increases are projected to drive an additional \$142,800 in revenue for 2025.

#### Fitness and Seniors' Centre

Fitness customers are sensitive to price fluctuations due to the availability of a number of private fitness centres in the community. After analysis and benchmarking, staff is recommending an increase of 3%. Overall, the Fitness line of business revenue increase is estimated at \$90,100. The Seniors' Centre rates will be held for 2025.

#### **Food Services**

To recover increased costs, a 3% increase was applied to banquet rentals rates to remain competitive. The increases for the Food Services line of business are anticipated to generate an incremental \$2,300 in 2025.

#### Golf

The golf industry has trended toward standardizing promotional pricing and discount packages in an attempt to gain market advantage. To compete with industry trends, BraeBen and Lakeview staff have conducted market research to recommend price points that align to benchmarking and position the courses to remain competitive. These price changes are expected to generate a revenue increase of \$162,400 in 2025.

#### **Room Rentals**

The Room Rentals line of business can withstand an average rate increase of 3% based on historical trending and benchmarking. This increase is projected to generate additional revenue of \$40,300 in 2025.

#### **Sports**

This line of business incorporates Indoor Artificial Turf, Gyms and Sport Leagues. To recover increased costs while remaining competitive, an average 3% rate increase was applied to the indoor turf, gym rental fees and sports leagues. All Sport line of business increases are expected to drive \$105,000 in additional revenue for 2025.

#### **Therapeutic**

Therapeutic is still a developing line of business and it is important to continue to offer programs at price points which encourage increased participation in order to help grow the Therapeutic market. Therapeutic offerings are recommended to increase by an average of 3%. This increase will generate an incremental \$9,900 in 2025.

#### **Culture Venue Rental Fees**

In response to the July 1, 2023 structural reorganization of the Culture Division, fees were amalgamated with the Recreation Division and the Parks, Forestry and Environment Division.

The reorganization provided an opportunity to improve the fee model to provide customers with an improved experience. This updated approach provides standard production and box office fees across all Culture venues provides for a more seamless and consistent customer-facing approach for those that utilize event facilities.

Additionally, Culture venue rental fees have been repackaged to provide further transparency for rental clients regarding the cost of venue rentals while also aligning with other comparable venues. For example, the base rental fee now includes minimum staffing requirements and administrative fees, and previous separate charges for these required associated fees have been removed. Including minimum required staffing levels and administrative fees in base rent is consistent with benchmarking and aligns Culture venue rental fees to the market. Recommended updates to Culture Venue Rental fees<sup>1</sup> are estimated to generate an incremental \$29,000 in 2025 with minimal impact to rental users.

#### **Box Office Fees**

Box Office fees are amalgamated and continue to move towards alignment to create consistency between Culture venues. Through the procurement of a new ticketing platform in 2024, box office fees have been streamlined to provide a unified ticketing fee structure across venues. Recommended updates to Box Office fees are estimated to generate an incremental \$4,500 in 2025.

#### **Culture Production Fees**

Technical and equipment fees are reviewed yearly to ensure alignment across all Culture facilities. These fees were reorganized to reflect technical equipment fees for all Culture venues. Technical production labour is a blend of third-party labour or in-house staffing chargebacks pending the venue. Fees were adjusted to align with other internal and external chargeback practices for staffing and third-party services. These changes may result in lower production costs for a number of clients.

The year-to-year impact of the cumulative changes to Culture venue rental, box office, Culture production and staffing fees for most event rental clients will result in an average 3% increase to fees or less. Recommended updates to Culture Production fees are estimated to generate an incremental \$8,500 in 2025.

#### **Creative Industries**

Majority of Creative Industries fees can withstand an average increase of 3%. This increase is projected to generate additional revenue of \$12,500 in 2025.

#### **Museums of Mississauga Programs**

Museum program and education program fees have, for the most part, increased above 3% in order to cover the cost of program delivery. Historical program success, along with the number of participants, illustrate the ability to pay. Fees were benchmarked with museums across southern Ontario and the proposed increases align with sector increases. In addition, the Museums would like to introduce an annual Museum Membership. This membership would include free tours, discounts/passes to special events hosted by the Museums, as well as building relationships with neighbouring businesses to provide benefits to patrons of the Membership. Introducing a Membership increases opportunity for users to enjoy the Museums and exhibits and encourages increased exposure through multiple visits. Benchmarking has shown offering a membership to be a common practice amongst Municipal Partners, and the suggested fee is reflective of this benchmarking.

#### **Culture Programs**

Culture Programs includes fees for sessional and camp programming in digital, literary, performing and visual arts, the Resident Artist program, and school and corporate workshops at the Living Arts Centre. The majority of Culture Programs fees are increasing by 3%. Corporate workshops at the Living Arts Centre were reorganized in 2024 to reflect one streamlined fee structure based on cost recovery and market value. This approach reduces the number of fees and will simplify the administration of this program. Culture Programs are expected to generate a revenue increase of \$98,000 in 2025.

### **Financial Impact**

As a result of Recreation & Culture's comprehensive annual user fee review including inflation, market price comparisons, benchmarking and an examination of the impact of historic price changes on volume, the fee recommendations in this report are expected to drive incremental annualized revenues totalling approximately \$1,085,200. The 2025 Business Plan has been updated to reflect this increase in income.

### Conclusion

Recreation and Culture programs and activities help to build strong communities, celebrate our heritage, contribute to the vibrancy of life in Mississauga, and assist residents in living healthy and active lives. Program fees must be balanced to ensure affordability, particularly for core services and equity deserving populations, while limiting reliance on the general tax base. The recommended rates and fees respond to market demand and attempt to drive increased participation while generating incremental revenue.

#### **General Notes**

• The City Manager or Commissioner of Community Services or the Director of Recreation and Culture, as applicable, or their designate, may approve a new fee, waive a fee, approve promotional pricing, and/or discounts on any Recreation & Culture fee in accordance with the general criteria for any such waiver, reduction or variation.

- Payment by cash, debit card, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, money order, certified cheque, Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) and cheques (if event is later than 14 days from booking) accepted
- Indoor special events, including Food Services and Banquet locations, may be booked in accordance with the standard booking timelines outlined in Policy 05-01-12, Use of City Facilities.
- Corporate Policy 04-01-05 shall govern payment terms for all Facility rentals and refunds.
- For purchase for resale items for food, beverage and retail sales pricing is determined by the Manager, Food Services using the cost to purchase an item plus the cost of good sold percentage, established in accordance with the divisional standard operating procedure. Exceptions to cost of goods sold pricing must be approved by District Manager.
- Proof of Insurance is required when booking a City facility, including bookings that are provided at no cost under the Community Group Registry Program.

  The City provides access to a general liability insurance policy that is paid for solely by the renter and is available at reasonable rates on a per rental basis.
- Labour costs for any staff in addition to those included based on the size of the event will be charged the maximum staff rate identified on the Part-time Rate schedule +18%, (including extra staff required for clean-up).
- 33% Holiday rate applied for statutory holidays for all facilities and additionally December 31 after 6:00pm for all Social events (including food services banquet facilities). Opening must be approved by the Manager of the facility.
- School boards and government agencies will benefit from the affiliated rate.
- When Culture equipment or facilities are not returned in a satisfactory state by rental clients, cost of damages will be charged plus an additional 10% of the total damages cost.
- A Late Use Penalty Fee will be applied in addition to staffing when event or client exceeds agreed upon end-time as stated in contract. The Late Use Penalty Fee will be 10% of the Venue Rental Fee.
- When booking an indoor photography permit, access to outdoor space for photography is also granted free of charge. If an outdoor photography permit has been purchased it does not include indoor access even in the event of inclement weather. There will be no outdoor photography permitted at Meadowvale Theatre.
- Peel School boards (Mississauga based) and government agencies will benefit from the affiliated rate for events related to the delivery of their services. Colleges and Universities are subject to Commercial rates.
- An Additional Cleaning Post Event Penalty Fee will be applied when the rented venue is not returned in a satisfactory state. The Cleaning Post Event Fee will be 10% of the Venue Rental Fee.
- Third Party Services that are arranged by Culture and Events staff for Events and Culture Venues will be charged at a rate of Cost +20%. Charges for Third Party Services for events at Culture

Venues arranged by other departments (Parks, T&W, FPM etc.) are set by those departments.

- Paramount Fine Foods Centre Annual Suite Licenses are identified in individually negotiated agreements.
- Third party labour will be billed at cost plus 5%.
- Labour costs for any staff in addition to those included based on the size of the event will be charged the maximum staff rate identified on the Part-time Rate schedule + 18%, (including extra staff required for clean-up).
- Fees will be quoted at current prices and will be honoured upon confirmed contract.
- PFFC Parking Lot special events lot is separated into 10 bookable areas and each area is charged the associated parking lot rental fee. The number of lots needed for an event will be determined by staff.
- Ticketmaster's fees are outlined in the third party agreement.
- A 25% discount will apply to outdoor events at Mississauga Celebration Square during the winter months (November March).
- Capital refurbishment fee is not applied to indoor and outdoor events that are open to the public and free of charge.

• Single ticket processing fee is not applied to indoor and outdoor events that open to the public and free of charge, and the organizer is part of the Community Group Registry Program or Peel School boards (Mississauga based).

## **User Group Definitions:**

#### Affiliate Fees correspond to:

- Any registered community group that has been approved for inclusion in the Community Group Registry Program (CGRP) and has been approved for the affiliated rental rate category.
- All CGRP Arts and Culture service providers are classified as affiliated.

## Community Fees correspond to:

• Any registered community group that has been approved for inclusion in the Community Group Registry Program (CGRP) and has been approved for the community rental rate category.

## Resident Fees correspond to:

- Any individual whose principal address is in Mississauga (temporary absences for reasons such as vacation do not affect residence status), or
- A student who is registered in an educational institution in Mississauga and who lives and attends school in Mississauga for a period of at least eight months during the calendar year, or
- A non-CGRP Not-for-Profit organization, whose principal address is in Mississauga, that is a corporation or an unincorporated association formed for the purpose of providing services, activities, programs and opportunities that improve or benefit one or more communities, is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors or trustees, does not generate revenue to be distributed amongst its members, directors, officers or trustees, as the case may be, for their financial gain, and turns back any revenue remaining after expenditures into the organization to further its aims and activities, or
- A business in Mississauga, that permits time with no intent to gain financially as a result of the activity, or
- A non-resident who is the principal owner of a business in Mississauga, that permits time with no intent to gain financially as a result of the activity.

# Non Resident Fees correspond to:

- Any individual whose principal address is outside of Mississauga, or
- Any business whose principal address is outside of Mississauga, that permits time with no intent to gain financially as a result of the activity.

#### Commercial Fees correspond to:

Any individual or business, that permits time with the intent to gain financially as a result of the activity.

#### **Room Rentals**

- Rates are based on an hourly fee unless otherwise noted. Minimum booking periods are required for some facility uses as indicated below:
- Room Category B/C/H minimum booking period is 3 hours.
- Room Category B/C/H, Saturday 1pm to Sunday 1am, minimum booking period is 7 hours.
- Room Category C minimum booking period is 3 hours.
- Room Category B and C, Saturday 1pm to Sunday 1am, minimum booking period is 7 hours.
- Room Category A at standalone Libraries minimum booking period is 1 hour.
- Exceptions to minimum number of hours for room booking periods to be approved by Manager of the facility to drive utilization (i.e. last minute availability)
- A non-prime bulk discount of 45% is applied to all groups booking more than 500 rental hours on weekdays between 7:00am and 6:00pm.
- A flat administrative surcharge of \$50 for Category B, and \$100 for Category C applies for all bookings longer than 3.5 hours. Any non-prime rental that is eligible for the bulk or CGRP discount shall not be charged the administrative surcharge.
- Meetings of official city business held by ward councillors at a community centre, community hall and/or arena in their ward, and/or in Culture facilities are booked at no charge. If specialized facilities are required to be opened for the meeting, standard charges apply.
- City Staff can receive free facility space for city business except when;

- -The meeting is booked on behalf of another group.
- -The booking is requested at a banquet/event facility.
- -The booking is for staff retirement events.
- -The affiliated/internal room rental rate, any staffing and external production or reimbursible expenses applies for all exceptions noted above. If specialized facilities are required to be opened for the meeting, staff charges will apply. For City business, an account number must be provided at the time of bookings.

Specialized facilities are defined as Small Arms Inspection Building, Meadowvale Theatre, Paramount Fine Foods Centre and Living Arts Centre. For City business, an account number must be provided at the time of booking.

Appropriate charges will apply for staffing, food and sundry services, Leadership Team and Extended Leadership Team are booked at no rental charge during standard business hours regardless of location or condition of use.

# Meeting Rooms - Category H

• Room Category H refers to all Heritage properties that include Clarke Hall, Erindale Hall, Lorne Park Hall, Malton Hall, Meadowvale Village Hall and Streetsville Heritage Hall. It also includes the meeting room space at Small Arms Inspection Building.

#### Meeting Rooms - Category P

• Room Category P refers to Premium spaces currently including the Time Out Lounge lobby at PFFC, Hall of Fame lobby at PFFC and boardrooms at Lakeview Golf Course.

#### Meeting Rooms - Category S - Storage

- Storage includes the-use of storage spaces located within Recreation facilities e.g. cabinets, shared storage, dedicated storage.
- Category S minimum booking commitment is one year and is paid at the beginning of the rental agreement term and renewed annually.
- No charge for registered Older Adult providers and Clubs Affiliated Older Adult groups.
- Dedicated/shared storage is available at a commercial rate
- with a maximum threshold of 250 square feet. Commercial groups with more than 250 square feet of dedicated/shared storage will be required to undergo the Realty Services agreement process and their applicable rates and fees.
- The Recording Studio and Kitchen rates are applicable only to the Malton Hub facility.

## Meeting Room - Community Group Registry Program (CGRP):

- Eligible Registered groups may receive no charge meeting room rentals as per Corporate Policy 08-01-01, for organization monthly board meetings and AGM.
- Minimum booking periods and administrative surcharges will apply as approved through the Recreation Rental Rates in Schedule "E-1" of the Fees and Charges Bylaw.
- In the event a group neglects to cancel a free room booking or does not show up for booked dates, a financial penalty of 50% of the affiliated room rental rate will be applied.
- Registered Older Adult Providers and Clubs may be eligible for no charge weekday use for facility space, based on available older adult space, in accordance with established guidelines.
- Registered Older Adult Providers and Clubs are charged 20% off the regular affiliated room rental rate during evenings and weekends.
- Registered Older Adult Providers and Clubs meeting room use in July and August and seasonal camp dates (i.e. March Break) is subject to availability.

#### **Pool Rentals:**

- Lifeguard staff costs charged separately for pool rentals based on attendance.
- Mississauga Fire and Emergency Services receives free pool rental for training sessions. Lifeguard staff costs still apply.
- \* Half pool bookings will be charged half of the full pool rate.
- \* Per Lane pool bookings will be charged a quarter of the full pool rate.

Requests for equipment, pool inflatable etc. have \$26.00 charge per contract.

### **Garry W Morden Notes:**

• Burn building - live fire includes; the following ignition materials: Full day includes 22 skids, 4 straw balls, 10 ignition flares. Half day includes 14 skids, 3 straw balls, 6 ignition flares. The rental includes the use of the Multi Use Pad and field shelter. Staffing fee of \$750 per full day (\$375/half day rental) will be added to the rental fee. Additional ignition materials are available at an extra cost as per fee schedule.

- SCBA Cylinders are available for live burn rentals at an extra cost.
- Driving track Includes use of field shelter. Staffing fee of \$750 per full day will be added to the rental fee.(\$375/half day rental)
- Except where noted separately, an additional fee of \$750/day will be added to all rental fees to cover facility wages per day. (\$375/half day rental)
- Instructor Fees is \$750 per instructor per day. \$375 per instructor per half day.

Propane Fuel Costs will be charged at a rate of 1600 litres per full day rental or 800 litres per half rental day at current market value. If extra fuel is required, additional propane consumption fees will be calculated per litre at current market value with an invoice issued post rental. Should less fuel be consumed fuel costs for unused propane will be refunded post rental.

- Normal Business Hours: 7:30 -16:30 hrs
- Additional staffing hours will be charged for events held outside regular business hours.
- Where eligible, the half day (4 hr.) rental rate is 50% of the full day rental rate.
- The Director of Recreation and Culture, the Chief of Fire & Emergency Services or their designate has the authority to approve price packaging and discounts.

#### Food Services & Banquet Notes:

- External Bookings are a minimum of 5 hours, with 8 and 12 hour options available
- There is a minimum charge of \$750 before taxes and gratuity for full service food and beverage. Manager of Food Services can waive the fees in order to drive utilization (i.e. last minute availability).
- Minimum spend per person by meal time for external events:
- \$14.00 for Breakfast
- \$20.00 for Lunch
- \$22.00 for Cocktail reception
- \$40.00 for Dinner
- There is a minimum charge of \$500.00 before taxes and gratuity on full service bar requests. Manager of Food Services can waive the fee in order to drive utilization.
- For golf tournaments where there is full service food and beverage contracts room rental charges will not apply.
- For banquet facilities and LIVE Cuisine restaurant three room rental options 5 hour, 8 hour and 12 hours in duration apply. These times are to be inclusive of all set up and tear down expenses.
- For internal rentals, minimum 3 hour booking applies.
- Due to fluctuations in wholesale food costs, catering package prices are subject to change without notice. Quoted prices are guaranteed no more than 3 months prior to the event.
- Room rental rates for events booked on statutory holidays or New Year's Eve to be billed with a 33% surcharge.
- \$1500.00 minimum spend, per concessions, when requested to be opened for Corporate Events.
- A charge of \$75 per 30 minutes will be applied to clients who exceed their contracted booking time.
- Event request may incur miscellaneous charges ranging from \$1-\$250 outside of the catering package based on client service requests.
- Mobile Food Vendor permitting fees:
- Stationary Food Carts \$41.30 to \$1,287.94
- Ice Cream Cycles \$273.89 to \$1,165.56
- Food and Ice Cream Trucks \$329.39 to \$7,194.00

#### SMALL ARMS INSPECTION BUILDING

25% discount is applied to SAIB rental rate for activities whose primary goal is to advance arts and culture activities (with limited to no ancillary activities) that include the following:

- Poetry readings/slams
- Concerts
- Art displays/shows/demonstrations/sales/workshops
- Art exhibitions
- Plays, readings, rehearsals
- Dance performances
- Cultural dance classes
- Fashion or textile, costume showcase
- Free cultural festival featuring live performances

#### **CULTURE PRODUCTION**

- When additional equipment and/or consumables are rented and/or purchased on behalf of the client, the cost of rentals/purchases will be charged plus an additional 20% of the total rental cost.
- Third Party Labor will be billed at time and a half; Between 00:00 and 07:00, or after 8 hours of work.
- City Production Staff will be billed at time and a half after 12 hours in one day or 44 hours in 1 week.
- Affiliated Groups will receive a 25% discount on the Technical and Equipment Fees.
- Production costs are calculated per rental per week.
- Meal Pentalty's applied when breaks are less than 1 hour for Third Party Labour.

## **CREATIVE INDUSTRIES**

- For film contracts that displace current users, the film client will pay for the cost recovery. If a private rental must be cancelled, the cost to re-book is covered by the film client. Additionally, if a City run program is cancelled, the cost to refund the customers is covered by the film client.
- If an unpaid approved permit is cancelled by the client, a cancellation fee of 15% of the full fee would apply as per the standard City of Mississauga Film Permit Terms and Conditions. A cancellation fee is not applicable to expedited permits. Cancelled expedited permits must be paid in full.
- If a permit has been approved and paid for, there will be no refund of fees.
- Where a City Owned Facility/Asset is also designated as a heritage property, the higher rate shall apply.
- There will be no half-day filming, prep or wrap rate for Civic Centre, Living Arts Centre Main Auditorium, Studio Theatre-and Living Arts Centre Parking Level P2 (Filming).

The full day rate for these spaces will apply unless approved by exception (See item 7).

- Average film shoot is a 12 hour day. Half day is 6 hours or less. Full Day is 6hr1min-24hrs.
- From time to time, as it relates to Commercial Film Requests, the applicable divisional Director may approve a new fee, waive a fee, approve promotional pricing and/or discounts on any Culture fee in accordance with the general criteria for any such waiver, reduction or variation. RATIONALE: Parks director would approve change in Film Fee related to Park filming for example
- Expedited Film Processing Fee is for permits processed within less than the three (3) business days if requested by applicant and if possible. Fee is non-refundable.
- Film Permit Processing Fee will apply to a request from a facility or booking client for a non film event in order for the Film Office to coordinate a 3rd party film component request.

  Original booking client must approve request.
- Additional Transportation & Works fees and charges may be applicable with filming requests. Fees applicable as stated in the bylaw plus 10% processing fee.
- Any applicable corporate wide fees &charges required in association with filming requests will incur a 10% processing fee.

#### **RESIDENT ARTIST PROGRAM**

- Resident Artist program has priority when selecting new applicants to the program. New Graduate Artist Residencies and Post Residency Rentals are only given if there is studio availability after Resident Artist applications have been completed.
- . All participants in the Resident Artist program including New Graduates, Resident Artists and Artist Renters must apply and meet the minimum technical competency required to participate in the program as assessed by City staff.
- Resident Artists who meet the eligibility criteria for the New Graduate program receive a 50% decrease on the Resident Artist fees for a maximum of 2 years.
- Fees for Artist Renters who sign a 12 month contract are 50% more than Resident Artist fees.
- Fees for Artist Renters who rent studio space on a month to month basis are 75% more than Resident Artist fees.
- Additional kiln cycles will be charged based on an hourly batch rate starting with a minimum of 20 hours per month. Additional hours above 20 per month will be charged in batches of 20 hours. A 10% surcharge will be applied for hours above 80 to accommodate smooth operations of the studio space.
- Resident Artist additional kiln cycles must be purchased in 20 hour increments. The number of increments available to purchase is at the discretion of Culture staff based on studio operations and equipment scheduling.
- LAC Glass Artist Residency Materials will be charged in batch increments of 15 pounds (i.e., 15, 30, 45, 60) per slot. The first 15 pounds of batch is included in the blow slot fee. Addition batch above 15 pounds will be calculated at the per pound rate.

#### Other Rentals:

- Walking track can only be booked in conjunction with the rental of the gymnasium at Carmen Corbasson only.
- Parking lot rental fees are applicable for all bookings that utilize the parking lot space for more than its prescribed use.

#### **Elections Exceptions:**

- Provincial elections receive free space for polling stations (as per the elections act R.S.O 1990, Chapter E.6)
- Federal elections pay \$100 per polling stations or as otherwise set out in the Canada Elections Act, S.C 2000, c.9.

#### STANDARD DISCOUNTS

Annual Vendor Permit Holders: 50% discount applies to City produced event vendor fees - MCS Only

Cart Vendors: 50% discount applies to City produced event vendor fees for food carts (hot dog, popcorn/candy, ice cream style carts) – MCS Only Vendor Permit Early Bird Discount: 10% discount applies to vendor fees for vendors that submit all licencing requirements prior to application deadline

#### RESIDENT ARTIST DEFINITIONS

New Graduates: Artists that have graduated from a recognized post-secondary institution within two years of the residency start-date.

New Graduates must sign a one year contract.

Resident Artist: Artists that sign a one year contract that have graduated more than two years after the resident start-date. Artists are eligible to participate

in the program for a maximum of 8 years. After 8 years they must leave the program or become a Renter. Artist that have documentation

of a project-based residency do not need to sign a one year contract but are still eligible for the Resident Artist rate.

Renters: Artists who rent studio space on a short-term basis (less than 12 months) and do not have documentation for a project-based residency.

Short-Term Project-Based Residency: Short-term project-based residencies are between 3 and 6 months. Artists must provide supporting documentation of their project. Artists that meet the criteria for a project based residency are eligible to pay the Resident Artist fees.

• The City Manager or Commissioner of Community Services or the Director of Recreation and Culture, as applicable, or their designate, may approve a new fee, waive a fee, approve promotional pricing, and/or discounts on any Recreation & Culture fee in accordance with the general criteria for any such waiver, reduction or variation.

- Payment by cash, debit card, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, money order, certified cheque, Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) and cheques (if event is later than 14 days from booking) accepted
- Corporate Policy 04-01-05 shall govern payment terms for all Facility rentals and refunds.
- Proof of Insurance is required when booking a City facility, including bookings that are provided at no cost under the Community Group Registry Program.

  The City provides access to a general liability insurance policy that is paid for solely by the renter and is available at reasonable rates on a per rental basis.
- Labour costs for any staff in addition to those included based on the size of the event will be charged the maximum staff rate identified on the Part-time Rate schedule + 18%. (including extra staff required for clean-up).
- · 33% Holiday Rate for Statutory Holidays. Opening must be approved by the Manager of the facility.

## **Executive Summary**

- This report is the annual review of the Lot Grading and Municipal Services Protection Deposit and Road Occupancy Permit.
- Changes include a few housekeeping changes under the Maintenance Standards and Permits Section.

## **Background**

Each year, the Transportation and Works Department undertakes a review of its refundable deposits. A review of the deposits as set out in By-law 0172-2020 and By-law 0173-2020 has now taken place.

Budget Committee 2024/09/17

On July 22, 2020, Council enacted Lot Grading and Municipal Services Protection By-law 0172-2020 and the Road Occupancy Permit By-law 0173-2020 implementing the 2020 deposits.

## **Comments**

In undertaking this review the following changes were proposed for the 2025 Road Occupancy, Lot Grading and Municipal Services Protection deposit amounts:

### Appendix 1, Schedule A - Municipal Services Protection and Lot Grading Deposits

- 1. MSPD Residential pool in-ground or on-ground of \$1,000.00 is proposed to be increased to \$1,500.00.
- 2. MSPD Residential addition/alteration to existing structure under 15 meters of frontage of \$1,000.00 is proposed to be increased to \$1,500.00.
- 3. MSPD CMP (Construction Management Plan) Residential, Industrial and Commercial \$700.00 per meter of frontage is a new deposit introduced in 2025.
- 4. Previously was "Lot Grading Residential new construction for multiple-unit dwellings"; it is proposed to be replaced by "Lot Grading Residential new construction for multiple-unit dwellings (Block up to 6 units)".
- 5. Lot Grading Industrial and Commercial new construction of \$10,000.00 is proposed to be increased to \$15,000.00.

## Appendix 2, Schedule A - Road Occupancy Municipal Services Protection Deposits

- 1. The title has been changed from "Road Occupancy Municipal Services Protection Deposits" to "Road Occupancy Deposits".
- 2. The item Environmental Services Section Municipal Services Protection Deposits has been moved to Appendix 1, Schedule A Municipal Services Protection and Lot Grading Deposits.

## **Financial Impact**

There will be no Financial Impact on the 2025 budget.

## Conclusion

The annual review of the Road Occupancy Permit, Lot Grading and Municipal Services Protection By-laws has resulted in a few revisions, one new fee to cover increased costs and a few housekeeping changes.

2025 Planning Act Processing Fees and Charges

## Recommendation

- That the Planning Act processing fees and charges, as outlined in Appendix 1 attached to the Corporate Report dated September 13, 2024 from the Commissioner of Planning and Building entitled "2025 Planning Act Processing Fees and Charges" be approved.
- 2. That User Fees and Charges By-law 0199-2023, as amended, be repealed effective at the end of December 31, 2024.
- 3. That a consolidated fees and charges by-law, effective January 1, 2025, which will incorporate the approved fees and charges of various City departments, be enacted to incorporate and establish new, revised, and existing fees and charges for the Planning and Building Department, Corporate Services Department, and Transportation and Works Department as outlined in Appendix 1 attached to the Corporate Report dated September 13, 2024 from the Commissioner of Planning and Building entitled, "2025 Planning Act Processing Fees and Charges".

## **Executive Summary**

- Planning application fees processed in accordance with the *Planning Act* include minor variances and severances, zoning certificates, official plan amendments, rezonings, draft plan of subdivision, draft plan of condominium and site plan inspections, amongst others
- The City's Planning Act fees and charges are reviewed annually to recover increased costs and respond to market conditions
- The City has completed a comprehensive review of the Planning Act Processing Fees and Charges
- This report sets out the proposed Fees and Charges for 2025

## **Background**

Each year the City undertakes a review of the fees and charges collected as part of a planning application processed in accordance with the provisions of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13, as amended. The *Planning Act* Processing Fees and Charges includes fees for services and activities provided by the City departments involved with processing these applications (i.e. Planning and Building, Transportation and Works and the Legal and Legislative Services Divisions).

The City of Mississauga completed a comprehensive review of the Planning Act Processing Fees and Charges in 2024. The Planning and Building Department planned to present recommendations in a report to Budget Committee that outlined any changing fees along with a rational for the changes. Some significant changes were expected as a result of this study. However, due to several Provincial Legislative changes and corresponding changes to the City's application processes along with the current status of the development industry and housing market conditions, it was determined that increasing application rates by only 3% for the 2025 year would be appropriate.

## **Comments**

A fee increase of 3% to the majority of application fees related to the Planning Act as identified in the accompanying table (Appendix 1) is recommended.

Increases are generally intended to account for increases in the consumer price index, new services provided, and the increased administrative and processing costs related to the service.

A clause will be added to Schedule C1 (Planning Act Processing Fees) of the 2025 User Fees and Charges By-law to provide that application fees will be waived for non-profit affordable housing applications: The current housing market conditions have made it difficult to create affordable housing units throughout the Province, including the City of Mississauga. Non-profit housing providers in particular struggle to advance projects, as federal funding is not provided to non-profits until after planning approvals are in place, but non-profits often do not have access to capital to cover costs of planning approvals prior to receiving federal funding. Pursuant to Council Resolution 0388-2020, staff have investigated the most appropriate mechanism to address this issue. In an effort to reduce costs for affordable housing units, application fees associated with official plan and zoning by-law amendments, removal of holding zones, site plan, and minor variance fees will be waived for non-profit housing providers, subject to approval through an application form to the Planning and Building Department. Any non-profit applicants with existing, in-effect fee deferrals for their development proposals will be eligible for fee waivers. This waiver will support non-profit affordable housing development in Mississauga.

## **Development and Design Division**

### **NEW Development Application Review Committee (DARC) Meeting – Removal of (H)**

<u>Holding Provision:</u> This new fee is being introduced to cover the costs associated with the preapplication review of a 'Removal of (H) Holding Provision'. This service provides applicants with the submission requirements and their applicable Terms of Reference required to satisfy the conditions associated with a submitted complete 'Removal of (H) Holding Provision' application. This is necessary to ensure the efficient processing of applications.

**NEW Section 47 Agreement Application:** The Province of Ontario has been issuing several Ministerial Zoning Orders (MZO) and Enhanced Ministerial Zoning Orders (EMZO) to expedite development and achieve Provincial objectives. In addition to changing a property's zoning, EMZOs also exempt a property from a municipality's Site Plan Control By-law, meaning that an applicant is not required to submit a site plan application. Section 47 of the Planning Act does require an applicant to enter into a Section 47 Agreement with the City. It should be noted that the regulations in Section 47 are almost identical to the provisions of Section 41 (Site Plan) of the Planning Act, and thus the manner in which the City processes these requests are very similar. This new fee will cover the costs associated with processing these applications that results in a Section 47 agreement.

## **Financial Impact**

There is no anticipated impact to 2025 Budget revenues generated from these proposed changes to the Fees and Charges for planning applications processed under the provisions of the *Planning Act*.

## Conclusion

The fee adjustments outlined in Appendix 1 are a result of a complete review of all Planning Act processing fees and charges.

## Subject

MiWay 2025 and 2026 Bus Procurement

## Recommendation

- 1. That the report entitled "MiWay 2025 and 2026 Bus Procurement" dated September 9, 2024 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works, be approved.
- 2. That Budget Committee pre-authorize the funds of \$110,500,000, to allow the 2025 and 2026 procurement of Hybrid-Electric and Clean Diesel buses as outlined in the Corporate Report dated September 9, 2024 entitled "MiWay 2025 and 2026 Bus Procurement" from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works for the bus purchases of (88) transit buses total. The purchase of (13) hybrid-electric buses and (10) sixty-foot clean diesel buses are to be pre-approved for delivery in 2025. The purchase of (65) hybrid-electric buses to be pre-approved for delivery in 2026.

## **Executive Summary**

- The ICIP-MIS-01 (Bus Replacement Program) has provided much-needed funding to allow MiWay to replace public transit buses since 2022.
- As part of the 2025 and 2026 Multi-Year Bus Procurement, MiWay will replace (78) forty-foot buses, and (10) sixty-foot buses for a total of (88) buses, which equates to 18% of the total fleet size. This funding request does not include the (10) Hydrogen FCEB buses that was already approved in a preceding report presented to Budget Committee on September 18, 2024.
- As of January 1, 2024 there are no sixty-foot hybrid-electric bus options available for sale
  in North America. Cummins, the engine manufacturer, did not recertify their Cummins L9
  engine to the latest 2024 Environmental Protection Act (EPA) Emissions Regulations for
  hybrid-electric bus applications. As a result the City does not have an option to purchase
  any sixty-foot hybrid-electric buses, therefore City staff is planning to purchase (10) sixty-

foot clean diesel buses to maintain fleet size and service requirements. Forty-foot buses are not affected since they use a different Cummins engine configuration which are certified to the latest EPA Emissions Regulations.

- MiWay currently owns and operates a total of 206 hybrid-electric buses. With recent operational experience with these buses, MiWay is seeing great benefits of this technology from a fuel savings, GHG reduction and reliability perspective and are confident that hybrid-electric buses is the feasible stepping stone for MiWay's journey to a fully zero-emission transit fleet.
- MiWay is seeking pre-approval of \$110,500,000 to purchase 88 buses for delivery in 2025 and 2026. In recent years, it would take the bus manufacturers an estimated (12) months to build and deliver buses, however with recent parts supply challenges it may take substantially longer as MiWay has experienced with the latest bus order. Therefore it is important for MiWay to begin the procurement as quickly as possible.
- The purchase of hybrid-electric buses to replace aging diesel buses that have reached their useful life will lead to transit improvement outcomes including improved capacity and service levels as well as reduce over crowding/closed door scenarios of our transit system.

## **Background**

## ICIP Funding Approval for MIS-01 – Bus Replacement Program

The Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) is a ten-year Federal infrastructure program designed to create long-term economic growth, build inclusive, sustainable and resilient communities and support a low-carbon economy. Through ICIP, the Federal government is providing \$33B in federal infrastructure funding to cost-share projects. On July 22, 2019, the Government of Ontario launched the ICIP Public Transit funding stream for inside the GTHA. Under the Public Transit Stream, funding allocations to municipalities and Metrolinx were established using a ridership formula. The City of Mississauga was allocated \$339M in federal funding and \$282.5M in provincial funding with a required City cost share of \$226M. Although an allocation has been provided, the ICIP Public Transit Stream is application based.

In October 2019, following Council approval, the City of Mississauga submitted applications for funding consideration in order to utilize the full funding allocation. As a result of MiWay's application submission, the ICIP-MIS-01 (Bus Replacement Program) was approved in Q1 2022 by the Ministry of Transportation, which provided much needed funding to allow MiWay to purchase and replace aging diesel buses to hybrid-electric buses. The scope of the funding will allow up to 320 buses to be purchased between 2022 and 2027.

As part of the ICIP-MIS-01 (Bus Replacement Program), the total funding amount for the purchase of MiWay buses is \$359,700,000 between 2022 and 2027. Mississauga will need to contribute 26.7% of total project costs, while the Federal government will fund 40% and the

Provincial government will fund the remaining 33.3% of project costs. **Table 1** below shows the funding sources, per cent contribution, and total funding amounts that were approved.

### **Hybrid-Electric Bus Procurement**

On October 6, 2021, Council authorized the pre-approval of \$183,400,000 for the 2022 and 2023 Capital Budget to purchase (165) Hybrid-Electric Buses. This multi-year procurement allowed MiWay to take advantage of economies of scale for price advantages. This contract was awarded to New Flyer Industries (NFI) in 2022, however due to component parts supply shortages, microprocessor chip shortages and unreliable supplier performance the buses were delayed. MiWay received the bus order over the course of 2023 receiving its final delivery January 2024. All (165) buses have since been delivered to MiWay and are in active revenue service.

If approved by Council, the City plans to purchase up to (78) forty-foot hybrid-electric replacement buses. The procurement process will begin in October 2024 with bus delivery planned for Q3 2025.

Since 2019, MiWay has purchased exclusively hybrid-electric buses and currently owns and operates a total of 206 hybrid-electric buses. With recent operational experience MiWay is achieving great benefits with this technology from a fuel savings, GHG reduction, and reliability perspective and are confident that hybrid-electric buses is the feasible stepping stone for MiWay's journey to a fully zero-emission transit fleet.

#### Clean Diesel Bus Procurement

MiWay is actively working to reduce overcrowding on our busiest corridors across the network. To effectively meet demand, enhance service capacity and reduce overcrowding, in addition to the planned hybrid-electric bus purchase, City staff is planning to purchase ten (10) sixty-foot (60ft) clean diesel replacement buses. These new buses will reduce the frequency of closed doors, ensuring that we can accommodate more passengers, minimize wait times, and improve overall service efficiency.

As of January 1, 2024 there are no sixty-foot hybrid-electric bus options available in North America. Cummins, who is the engine manufacturer for Transit buses did not recertify their Cummins L9 engine to the latest 2024 Environmental Protection Act (EPA) Emissions Regulations for hybrid-electric bus applications. As a result the City does not have an option to purchase any sixty-foot hybrid-electric buses. Forty-foot hybrid-electric buses are not affected since they use a different Cummins engine which are certified to the latest EPA Emissions Regulations.

## Comments

## Transit Bus Fleet Replacement Schedule

As part of the 2025 and 2026 Multi-Year Bus Procurement, MiWay will replace (78) forty-foot and (10) sixty-foot for a total of (88) buses, which equates to 18% of the total fleet size. This funding request does not include the (10) Hydrogen FCEB buses that was already approved in a preceding report presented to Budget Committee on September 18, 2024. The (88) buses planned for purchase in 2025 and 2026 will facilitate the replacement of MiWay's 2010 Orion forty-foot buses, 2011 New Flyer forty-foot buses, and 2013 New Flyer sixty-foot buses. With projected service increases to pre-pandemic levels or more, MiWay will need to replace these buses as soon as possible to increase reliability and ultimately maintain service levels.

In recent years, manufacturing of Transit buses takes approximately 12 months to build and deliver however with recent parts supply challenges it may take substantially longer as MiWay has experienced with the last bus order. Therefore it is important for MiWay to begin the procurement as soon as possible to mitigate long lead times. At the same time this would allow Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM's) to better plan design and production schedules if orders are committed in advance which would reduce risks of delivery delays. Prices will also be locked in throughout the duration of the contract, therefore municipal capital budgets will be better informed of expected costs ahead of the 2025 and 2026 Capital Budget.

## **Financial Impact**

MiWay is seeking pre-approval of \$110,500,000 to purchase 88 buses for delivery in 2025 and 2026. For the (78) hybrid-electric buses specifically, Mississauga will need to contribute 26.7% of total project costs, while the Federal and Provincial government will fund the remaining total project costs (40.0% and 33.3% respectively). The municipal portion for the (78) hybrid-electric buses is \$26,032,500. The (10) sixty-foot clean diesel buses is \$13,000,000 and funded from the 33121-tax capital reserve fund.

The 2025 Business Plan and Budget has the following budget request for the bus replacement program and the funding sources for 2025 and 2026, which is being requested for pre-approval through this Corporate Report.

Historically it takes 12 months for buses to be delivered to MiWay therefore it is important that the funds are pre-approved ahead of the 2025 Business Plan and Budget in order to receive the buses in an appropriate timeframe.

## Conclusion

The purchase of hybrid-electric buses to replace aging diesel buses that have reached their useful life will lead to transit improvement outcomes including improved capacity and service levels as well as reduce over crowding/closed door scenarios. If council pre-approves the funds required to purchase public transit buses this will enable MiWay to replace aging buses on time and increase levels of service and reliability. Replacing existing forty-foot buses with cleaner, fuel efficient and proven hybrid-electric buses will continue to mark a milestone for the City's commitment to a cleaner propulsion technology.
