WHEREAS the new hospital is expected to expand its personnel by approximately 2,400 health care support staff and approximately 400 additional doctors; and

WHEREAS the construction of the new hospital will create approximately 3,000 construction jobs and contribute approximately \$1 billion to the local economy over the next decade; and

WHEREAS the new hospital will be the largest, community-based teaching hospital in Canada at 2.8 million square feet, 950 beds and 23 operating rooms, serving a predicted 1.7 million patient visits; and

WHEREAS at the October 23, 2024 General Committee Meeting the Trillium Hospital Partners requested a \$450 million contribution from the municipality; and

WHEREAS through negotiations with the government of the Province of Ontario, the municipal share was reduced to \$390 million; and

WHEREAS the local share plan by Trillium Health Partners, including the municipal share of \$390 million, must be approved by their Board of Directors by the end of May;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The City of Mississauga approves the reduced municipal contribution amount, not to exceed \$390 million for the construction of the new Peter Gilgan Mississauga Hospital, to be paid by January 1, 2033;
