Subject: Stormwater Infrastructure Grant Applications

This memorandum highlights ongoing efforts to secure grant funding specifically for stormwater infrastructure projects from 2016 through June 30, 2025, enhancing the City's capacity to support resilient infrastructure.

Grant Overview

The City of Mississauga actively pursues grant funding to support the development and sustainability of critical infrastructure, including stormwater management systems. By securing external funding, the City can reduce the financial impact on taxpayers while advancing key priorities such as climate resilience, environmental protection, and infrastructure renewal.

This work is guided by the Grant Funding Management Policy (04-01-10) and the Delegated Authority By-law (0198-2014), which provide a structured and accountable framework for pursuing funding opportunities.

The Finance Division collaborates with Departmental staff to coordinate and prepare grant applications. This process involves collecting required project details, budgets, and documentation, often within tight timelines. A collaborative approach helps present strong submissions and positions the City to pursue external funding opportunities effectively

Submitted Applications

Between 2016 and June 30, 2025, the City of Mississauga submitted eight stormwater infrastructure grant applications, as outlined in Appendix 1, resulting in approvals totaling \$34.11 million.

Note:

1. Exclusions: This data does not include funding applications for non-infrastructure-related stormwater projects or operations (e.g., educational initiatives or student subsidies) or grant applications related to flooding submitted by other departments, such as Community Services – Parks, Forestry, and Environment Division).

Application Highlights:

- Federal
 - Canada Housing Infrastructure Fund
 - The City has received approval in principle of \$24.25 million, or up to 40% of total eligible costs to support the Reconstruction of Little Etobicoke Creek project. This includes the widening and deepening of the creek, as well as the reconstruction of the Dixie Road and Dundas Street bridges.
 - Funding of \$5.14 million has been requested for the Ninth Line Stormwater Management Facility. The application is pending a decision.
- Provincial
 - Municipal Housing Infrastructure Program Health and Safety Water Stream
 - Funding of \$24.38 million has been requested for the Reconstruction of Little Etobicoke Creek project, covering only the widening and deepening of the creek. The application is pending a decision.

The City of Mississauga continues to pursue funding opportunities for vital stormwater infrastructure projects, with approved funding and pending applications representing substantial investments.
