9. MATTERS TO BE CONSIDERED

9.1 Network and Technical Subcommittee Update (Kris Hammel, Citizen Member 10 minutes)

Mr. Hammel provided an update on the Network and Technical Subcommittee and spoke to the National Active Transportation Strategy, community partnerships, community rides and open data.

Suzanne Doyle, Vice-Chair expressed support for the Mississauga Cycling Advisory Committee (MCAC) Terms of Reference to be amended to incorporate micromobility as it relates to cycling infrastructure. Matthew Sweet, Manager, Active Transportation advised that staff currently seek feedback on micromobility from MCAC along with other City advisory committees and that an amendment to the Terms of Reference is not required in order for MCAC to provide feedback or make recommendations regarding micromobility. Mr. Sweet further advised that once staff develop recommendations about micromobility they will consult with the City's advisory committees as well as the public. Committee Members and staff engaged in discussion regarding micromobility and Ms. Doyle requested that MCAC establish a working group to discuss micromobility.

9.3 2021 Quarterly Cycling Program Update (Q2) (Matthew Sweet, Manager, Active Transportation 20 minutes)

Fred Sandoval, Active Transportation Coordinator spoke to the memorandum and advised that most of the 2020 projects are complete except for the Cawthra Road Multi-Use Trail, as it is on hold awaiting MTO approval.

Members of the committee engaged in discussion and enquired about updating sewer grates, addressing the gap at Derry Road and timelines for the Cawthra Road Multi-Use Trail. Mr. Sandoval advised the committee to email staff if there were any locations with sewer drains of concern, and noted that the gap on Derry Road project was regional and would be added to the update once construction is confirmed. Mr. Sandoval further advised that there were no confirmed timelines for the Cawthra Road Multi-Use Trail.
