

Let's walk to school! When walking to school or your bus stop:

Cross at pedestrian crossovers, crosswalks & designated school crossings

At intersections, only cross when there's a walk signal

Be extra aware in areas with lots of driveways - drivers may be reversing (11/2) pic.twitter.com/7dZ4ANFCa5

Mobile Signs (2 per ward)	\$3450
Graphic Design	\$650 (estimate based on logo design)
Webpage	No cost
Total:	\$4600 (estimate)
