Capacity Limits Lifted

What does it mean to lift capacity limits?

- 2m physical distancing no longer required
- Restaurant tables do not need to be separated by barriers or spaced 2m apart
- Masking rules have not changes
- Operators are still required to:
 - Check vaccination certificates and ID
 - Screen patrons for COVID-19 symptoms; and
 - collect contact tracing information



Opting In

- Certain businesses/organizations can choose to require identification and proof of vaccination from patrons, in accordance with s.2.1 of Schedule 1
- While election is in effect, the business/organization does
 not need to limit capacity to ensure 2m distancing
- While election is in effect, signs must be conspicuously posted at all entrances
- Election can be made per day

Impacted City Facilities

- Rental rooms and venues hosting weddings and religious services
- Museums (tours and other non-program activities)
- Clubhouses (operated by 3rd party groups through a management and operation agreement)

Recommendation:

Where an area of a City facility falls into s.2.2(5) of Schedule 1 or s.7 of Schedule 3 of O.Reg. 364/20:

- 1. the City shall opt into s.2.2 for the purpose of City-delivered programs and the City shall require patrons to provide proof of vaccination in order to enter those areas; and
- 2. Where permits and rental bookings are granted for the use of such City facilities, the permit/booking holder can choose whether to opt into the s.2.2 vaccination requirements
