7. <u>MATTERS CONSIDERED</u>

7.1. Vehicle Pound Facility Licensing Moratorium

Michael Foley, Manager, Mobile Licensing Enforcement spoke to the Moratorium on Vehicle Pound Facility licensing matter noting it was put in place to determine the feasibility of the Virtual Pound Initiative which will no longer be moving forward.

Mr. Foley spoke to complaints from the industry; hours of operation; damage to vehicles; storage fees; issues with by-law enforcement; considerations for by-law amendments to enhance consumer protection and a standardized release form.

Members of the Committee engaged in discussion with respect to by-law enforcement measures; lot hours of operation; lot size and complaint statistics. Mr. Foley responded to enquiries noting a possible amendment consideration to add the requirement of 24/7 staffing at all lots. Councillor Starr directed staff to investigate the occurrence of complaints registered with the OPP to release vehicles from lots and that any additional comments or recommendations with respect to the proposed revisions to Business Licensing By-law be forwarded to staff or the City Clerk.
