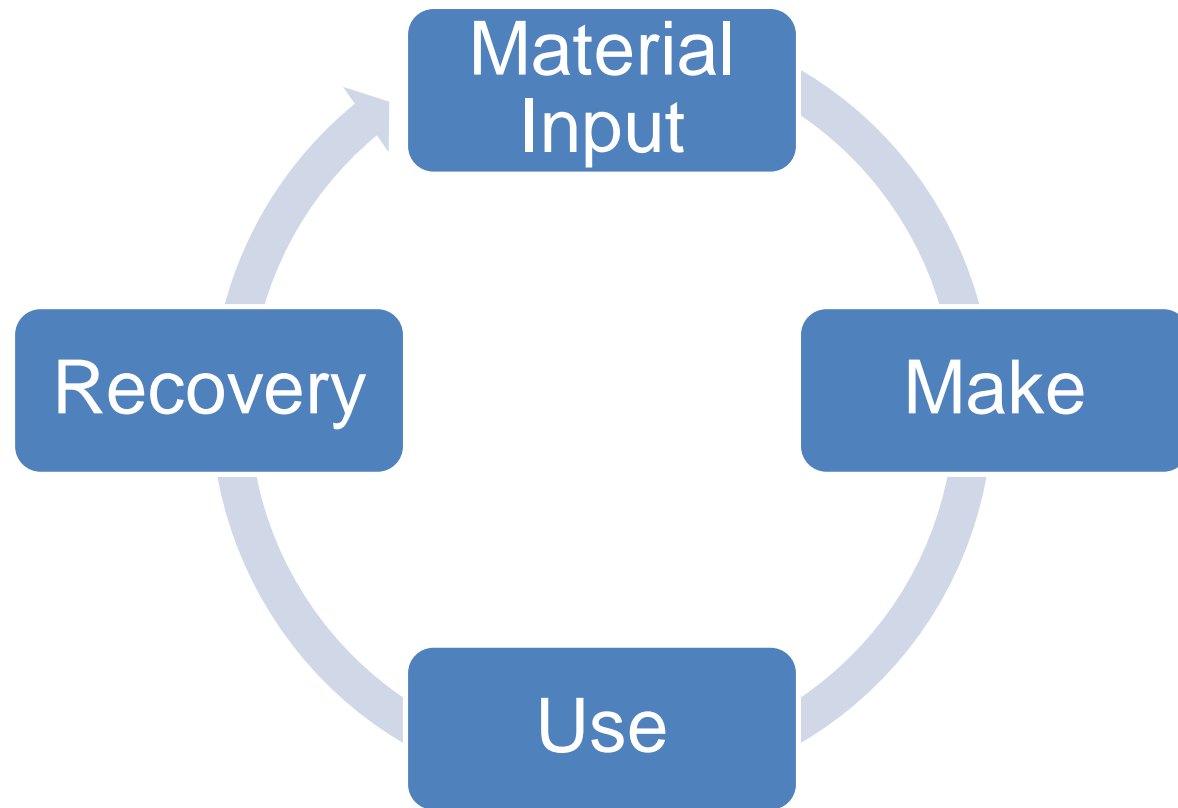

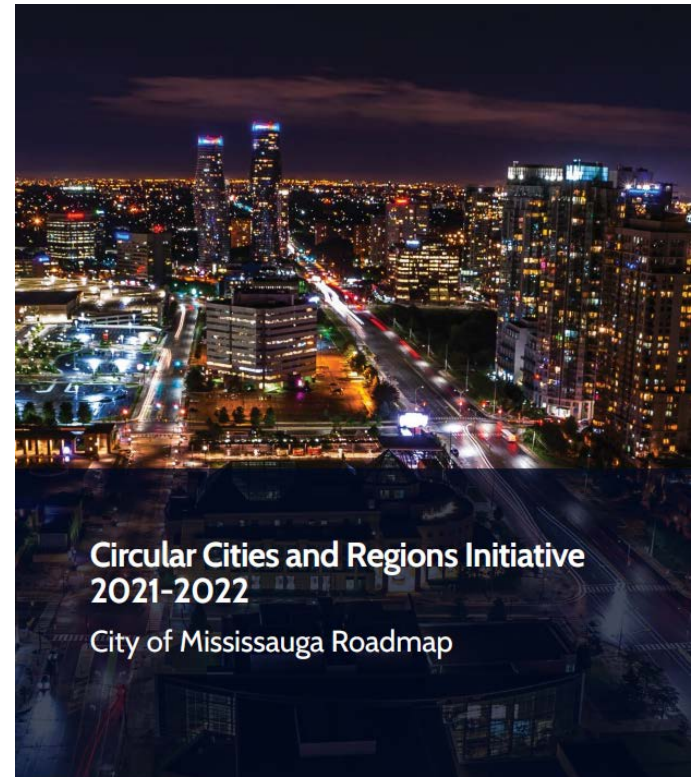
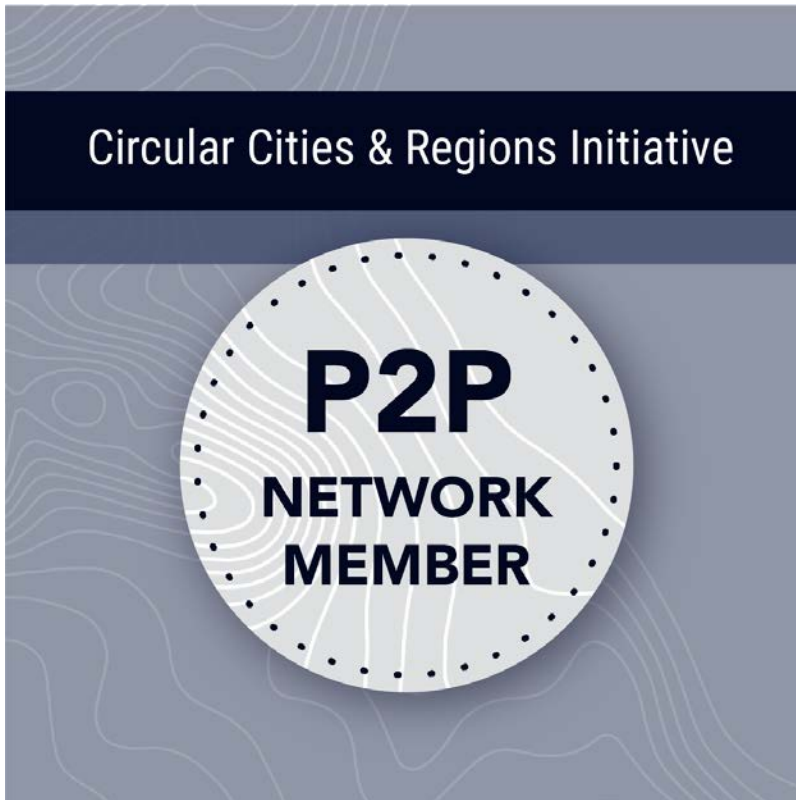

# Central Library Renovation Project

It's estimated that more than 120,000 kg of city-owned items were diverted from landfill, including:

- 35,256 kg reused internally (excluding books)
- 14,253 kg donated
- 40,635 kg of paper sent for recycling
- 3,084 kg of donated books (5,000 books)
- 7,460 kg of scrap metal sent for recycling

- City-Wide Litter Campaign
- Seasonal Operations
- Volunteer Litter Clean-Up
  - Parks Volunteer Clean-Up Programs
  - 20 Minute Makeover
  - Great Canadian Shoreline Clean-Up
