## Subject

**Request to Alter a Heritage Designated Property: 1620 Orr Road (Ward 2)**

## Recommendation

That the request to alter the property at 1620 Orr Road, as per the Corporate Report from the Commissioner of Community Services, dated April 7, 2022, be approved.

## Executive Summary

- Subject property designated under the Ontario Heritage Act.
- Replacement camera proposed on corner of Anchorage building.
- New camera would not be flush with building but impact remains negligible.

## Background

Council designated the subject property under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act in 1977. Section 33 of the Act requires permission from Council in order to make alterations to a property designated under Part IV of the Act.

## Comments

The City's Facilities and Property Management (FPM) Division proposes to install security cameras at the subject property. Of the cameras that may impact heritage attributes, the proposal includes an exterior replacement camera at the corner of the Anchorage building at the Bradley Museum. A multisensory camera is proposed to replace the existing camera at the corner of the Anchorage as per the image labelled figure 1 attached as Appendix 1. The new camera would be the same or similar to the one shown in figure 2. Its dimensions are 385mm (length), 262 mm (width), 299 mm (height). It would not be flush with the building as is the

existing camera. The proposed camera has minimal impact on the heritage character of the property and provides needed surveillance. As such, it should be approved.

## Financial Impact

There is no new financial impact resulting from the recommendation in this report.

## Conclusion

FPM proposes a replacement security camera on the corner of the Anchorage building at the subject property. It has a negligible impact and should therefore be approved.
