Recommendation:

That the memorandum from John Dunlop, Manager of Heritage Planning & Indigenous Relations, dated September 9, 2022 entitled "Murals, Fire Station 104", be received for information.

Background:

The subject property is designated under Part V of the *Ontario Heritage Act* as it forms part of the Old Port Credit Village Heritage Conservation District (HCD). It is considered a contributing property. Changes to the property are subject to the Old Port Credit Village HCD Plan, 2018.

Comment:

The City of Mississauga's Fire Services and Public Art teams are collaborating on a temporary public art project for Fire Station 104. The project is a mural, and is described in Appendix 1.

The artwork will be printed on a vinyl wrap that will be applied to the bay doors of the fire station. The art is temporary in nature, and so there will be no alterations to the fire station. As such, no heritage permit is required.
