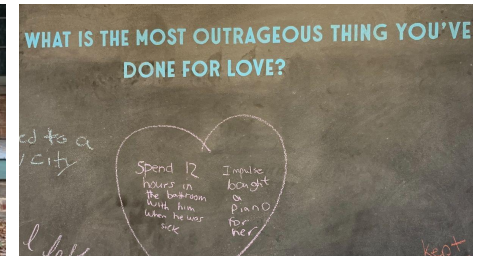

Green infrastructure

A demonstration planter of "rain garden" in Mississauga, Ontario catches runoff from paved surfaces like roads and parking lots, keeping rain water out of sewer systems.

Heavy rains and flash floods are becoming more common in cities as the climate warms and develops intensity. One way to slow down and soak up this excess water is to build green infrastructure. This can be both natural and engineered systems like rain gardens, urban forests, wetlands, and green roofs. Even a neighbourhood full of rain barrels can help!

Infrastructures vertes

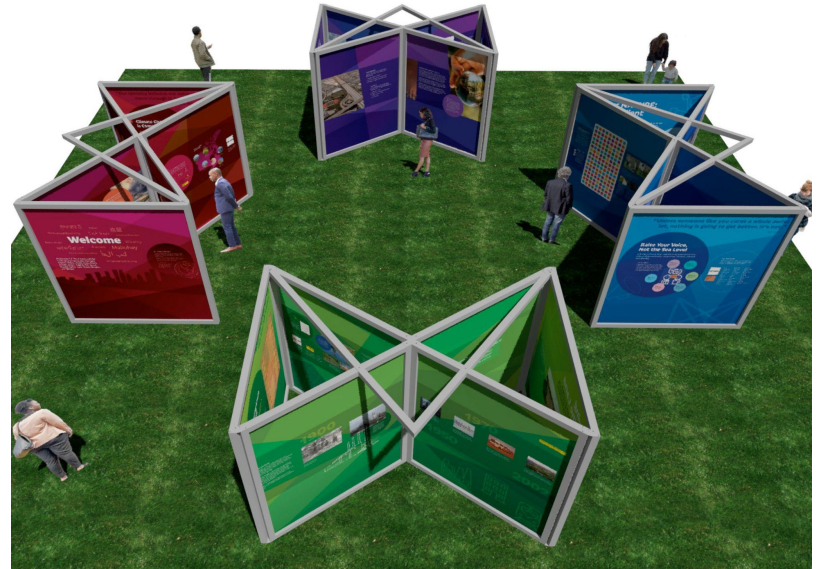

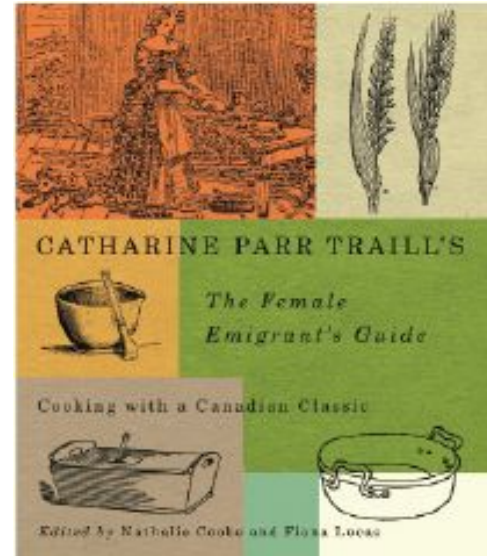

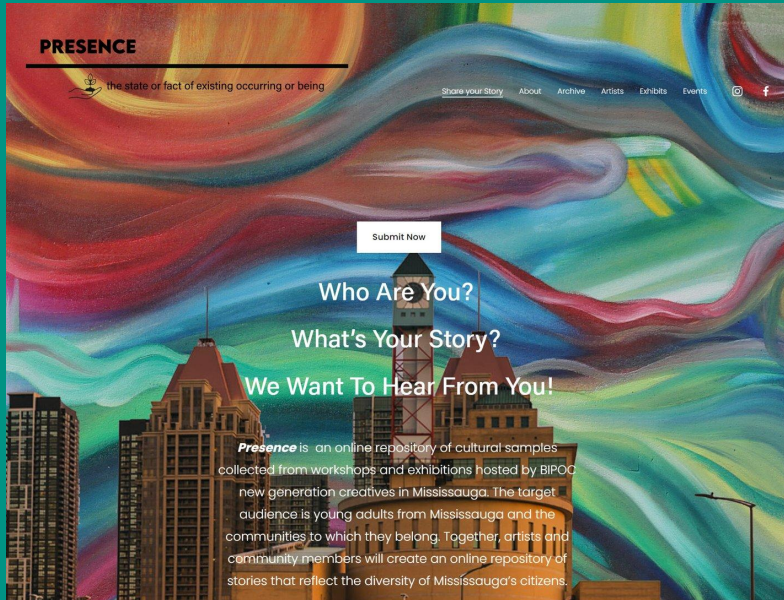
