But their role has largely been ignored as a key part of Canada's history



Remembering our Roots

African people were once enslaved in the territory that is now known as Canada

Those that fought enslavement helped lay the foundation of Canada's diverse and inclusive culture

Some of the Loyalists who came here after the American Revolution and settled in the Maritimes were people of African descent

Many Canadian soldiers were of African descent and making sacrifices in wartime as far back as the War of 1812





Remembering our Roots

1979 first-ever Black History Month Canadian proclamation issued by City of Toronto

1988 first Black History Month was observed in Nova Scotia renamed to African Heritage Month in 1996

1995 the House of Commons officially recognized February as Black History Month

2008 Senate unanimously approved and adopted Motion to Recognize Contributions of Black Canadians and February as Black History Month


