

Whereas the current representation at the Region is badly skewed with Caledon having 5 Councillors to serve a total of 66,515 residents. One Caledon Councillor has only 9,295 residents while Mississauga has one Councillor for every 65,599 residents; and

Whereas there was an effort to amend the formula last term under Brampton Mayor Linda Jeffrey. It was suggested we increase the total number of Regional Councillors from the current 24 to 32. The proposal was:

- Caledon remained at 5
- Brampton increased from 7 to 11
- Mississauga increased from 12 to 16

Whereas Mississauga vetoed it because it was an enormous increase in politicians and an unnecessary financial burden on the taxpayers; and

Whereas the 2016 census shows the population for three municipalities with the 2031 and 2041 projections, attached, indicate the current number of Councillors for the Region requires adjustment; and

Whereas the model of 'representation based on population' is set by both the federal and provincial governments:

- 1 Caledon
- 5 Brampton
- 6 Mississauga

Whereas keeping Peel Council at 24 seats for the 2022 Municipal Election and using the 'rep by pop model' would result in a seat distribution as follows:

- 2 Caledon
- 10 Brampton
- 12 Mississauga

Whereas as Brampton continues to grow, the formula can be adjusted again in the future. Caledon still remains overrepresented with 2 Regional Councillors – each having 33,000 residents or half a typical Mississauga or Brampton Ward; and

Whereas Mississauga has supported keeping the Region of Peel Council at 24 Councillors and a more fair distribution of seats;

Therefore be it resolved:

That Mississauga Council supports a 24 seat Region of Peel Council, using representation by population, for the 2022 Municipal Election composed in the following manner:

- 2 Caledon
- 10 Brampton
- 12 Mississauga

And further, that the position of Mississauga Council be communicated to the Region Policies and Procedures Committee and Region of Peel Council.
