Site and Area Context

The subject property is located on the north-east corner of the Britannia Road West and Silken Laumann Way intersection. It currently contains a commercial plaza which consists of multi-tenant and stand-alone buildings with an associated parking lot. Vegetative elements are located only along the property lines. The surrounding area context includes a range of uses and built forms, including industrial, commercial, and residential uses.

The applicant is seeking to permit a lease for a period of greater than 21 years requiring the consent of the Committee of Adjustment.

Planning

Staff comments concerning the application for consent are as follows:

The applicant is proposing a lease greater than 21 years for a unit on the subject property. The Planning Act requires that leases of 21 years or greater receive consent from the municipality. Staff note that the proposed use conforms to both the official plan and zoning by-law. Through a detailed review, staff is of the opinion that the application is appropriate to be handled through the consent process. Further, the application raises no concerns of a planning nature.

Appendix 2 – Zoning Comments

Zoning has no objection to the Consent application provided that the severed and retained lands comply with the provisions of Zoning By-law 0225-2007, as amended, with respect to, among other things, minimum lot frontage, minimum lot area, setbacks to the existing building(s), on site parking, etc., or alternatively, that any minor variance(s) is approved, final and binding and/or the demolition of any existing building(s) is complete.

We further advise that the proposed lot frontage is to be calculated in accordance with the following definition:

• The applicant is advised that Lot Frontage means the horizontal distance between the side lot lines and where these lines are not parallel means the distance between the side lot lines measured on a line parallel to and 7.5 m back from the front lot line.

Appendix 3 – Region of Peel Comments

- Property Requirements:
 - The Region will require the gratuitous dedication of lands to meet the Official Plan requirement of a 45 metre mid-block Right of Way along Britannia Road (Regional Road 3) 22.5 meters from the centreline of road allowance of Britannia Road. Additional 9 metres of land requires within 245 metres of an intersection, 27 metres from the centreline of the road allowance on Britannia Road;
 - 15m x 15m Daylight Triangle at the intersections of Mavis Rd and Silken Laumann Way;

- The Region will require the gratuitous dedication of a 0.3 metre reserve along the frontage of Britannia Road behind the property line, lifted over any approved access and Daylight Triangle;
- The applicant shall gratuitously dedicate these lands to the Region, free and clear of all encumbrances, and shall provide the Region with the necessary title documents and reference plan(s) to confirm the Region's right-of-way. All costs associated with land transfer are the responsibility of the applicant.

A letter shall be received from the City of Mississauga, Manager of Zoning Plan Examination, indicating that the conveyed land and retained lands comply with the provisions of the Zoning By-law, or alternatively; that any variances are approved by the appropriate authorities and that such approval is final and binding.
