

What is a SNAP?



A Sustainable Neighbourhood Action Program (SNAP) is a neighbourhood-based solution for sustainable urban renewal and climate action. Advantages include:

- Strong community involvement
- Innovative partnerships are built to implement projects


Burnhamthorpe SNAP



- First SNAP in Mississauga
- Council approved Action Plan in 2015
- Some projects include:
 - SWM Home Retrofit pilot
 - ➤ Tower Retrofit Program pilot
 - Depaying Demonstration Project
 - > Rain Garden Installation


Neighbourhood Screening Process

- In 2021, TRCA & CVC started a neighbourhood screening process
- Study identified areas for potential future SNAPs in Mississauga after taking into account a number of factors (e.g., heat vulnerability, flooding risks)
- Two areas recommended for SNAPS in short-term: Cooksville & Malton






Why Cooksville?



- Diverse population, many new Canadians
- Numerous complex issues (e.g., high flood risk area)
- Many opportunities & planned City & other projects
- Extensive stakeholder list and community networks
- Intersection of numerous plans and strategies (e.g., Vision Cooksville)

Malton SNAP



- Malton also rose to the top with multiple priorities (e.g., flood risk, high heat vulnerability, low community well-being)
- Malton SNAP is within TRCA's jurisdiction
- Full funding still to be secured
- Planning for Malton expected to be initiated after Cooksville SNAP (2024-2025)



- To apply for FCM funding, need "Council resolution committing to develop the plan and to include a sustainability vision, goals and targets in the plan"
- Asking EAC to recommend that Council pass the following resolution:

"Be it resolved that the City of Mississauga develop a sustainable neighbourhood action plan that will include sustainability goals, specific targets, actions, and an implementation and monitoring strategy."

"Be it further resolved that the City of Mississauga commit \$40,000 from its budget toward the costs of this initiative."
