

# Concerning Tree care practices

- Mulching Volcanoes
- Insufficient mulch
- Soil Volcanoes
- Lack of watering
- Improper planting
- Grass competion
- Damage from weeders/lawnmowers
- Improper use of Gatorbags and mulch mats












# Consequences and Impacts

#### **Immediate Consequences**

- Declining tree health
- Hazardous trees
- Loss of benefits of trees

#### **Impacts**

- Loss of tree canopy
- Reduced benefits of tree
- Wasted resources
  - Time, money and tree life



### Mulch Benefits

Prevents loss of water from the soil by evaporation

Reduces the growth of weeds

Keeps soil cooler in the summer and warmer in the winter

Reduces solar damage

Suppresses weed growth



#### Mulch Mistakes

Mulch Volcanoes

Underlayed with soil volcanoes

Underlayed with landscaping fabric

Not enough mulch






#### Biology


- Lenticels- 20 percent of total respiration
- Trees fine roots are in top 30 cm of the soil and need access to water and oxygen
- Basal damage results in butt rot
- Root damage results in branch die back and tree death
- Roots go beyond the tree canopy

### Correct Tree Mulching

- Mulch at least 50cm away from tree bark
- 5 15cm high
- Donut or tire ring spread evenly around the tree
- Weed and contaminant free mulch







# Mulch Islands





#### Early Tree Care

- Monitoring and watering new trees in first two years
- Refresh mulch during first three seasons
- Early pruning of trees
- Inspect for health issues early
- Staking in vulnerable areas



# Recommendations

- 1. Immediate remediation of mulching practices
- 2. In request for proposals and contacts best practices are specifically outlined in detail with diagrams
- 3. Audits are done for each tree
- 4. Information brochure for homeowners
- 5. Training for tree care workers
- 6. Fines for improper tree care
- 7. Valuation of loss of tree due to these practices
- 8. Community trained volunteers –ACER trains citizen scientists to monitor and maintain trees
