7.1 Carol-Ann Chafe and Mary Daniel, Access 2 Accessibility regarding Adaptive & Inclusive Micro-mobility

7.2 Laura Zeglen, Vision Zero Program Lead regarding Vision Zero Update: Pedestrian Head Start Signals

Ms. Zeglen presented on the subject matter and provided background information.

In response to Councillor Kovac, Ms. Zeglen spoke to implementation. Zvonimir Miller, Manager, Traffic Signals and Systems spoke to requests for enhanced intersections and cost.

In response to Councillor Horneck, Mr. Miller spoke to Accessible Pedestrian Signal (APS) intersections and funding.

In response to Brant Thompson, Citizen Member, Ms. Zeglen and Mr. Miller spoke to bench marking with other municipalities; the decision to implement no right turn on red signals on a case by case basis only, and long term considerations such as zebra markings.

In response to Jo Pierossi, Citizen Member, Mr. Miller spoke to the Pedestrian Head start signal pilot at the intersection of Stavebank Road and Lakeshore Road and noted only positive feedback has been received.
