
Collaborating with City & Community Partners


- Continuing City's partnership with Ecosource to operate nine community gardens and one urban farm in City parks
- Working with Kandy Kennedy to build a Medicine Wheel Garden on City lands
- Working with Park Development and Cooksmart to include garden beds at the Malton Youth Hub
- Working with Park Planning and Park Development on plans for community gardens at future land developments
- Worked with UTM class on projects related to Urban Agriculture
- Provided letters of support for partner grant applications
- Attended Peel Hunger Relief Network Event



Working on Innovative, New Programming

- Piloting a new City program on small space & balcony gardening
 - Four sessions being held in 2023 starting at the end of November 2023
- Researching backyard sharing programs
- Evaluating whether feasible to install a greenhouse on City lands






Continuing to Expand & Make Gardens More Accessible

- Assisted with the expansion of Forest Glen community garden
- Working with the accessibility team to make gardens more accessible
 - New path installed at Churchill Meadows so that gardeners with mobility issues could more easily access the garden beds

- Provided comments on the Official Plan
- Zoning by-law amendment related to plant-based growing for businesses
- Continue to look for external grants and internal funding for the community gardens program






Spreading the Word About Urban Agriculture


- Conducting urban agriculture tours for internal and external partners
