Background

- The Hazel McCallion Act (Peel Dissolution) was passed on June 9, 2023.
- The legislation calls for the dissolution of Peel effective January 1, 2025 and that Mississauga, Brampton and Caledon are continued as single-tier cities on that date.
- The Transition Board was appointed on July 5, 2023.
- Kick-off meeting with the Transition Board took place October 17, 2023.

Role of the Transition Board

- Transferring assets; assigning liabilities, debt and other financial obligations of Peel
- Managing employment matters
- Facilitating decisions on the allocation, governance, use and control of services provided by Peel
- Providing recommendations that ensure the long-term economic sustainability of Brampton, Caledon and Mississauga as single-tier municipalities



Transition Process



Why dissolution?

- Mississauga and Brampton have outgrown regional governance
- Single tier city can integrate services instead of having two separate bureaucracies
- Mississauga council making decisions for Mississauga
- Focus taxpayer dollars on Mississauga priorities
- Streamlining customer service to residents and businesses
- Eliminate duplication and overlap of services and administration


