### **2024 Budget Timelines**

Mayor Proposes Budget

November 6, 2023

Mayoral Direction issued to table the 2024 Budget

2024 Budget published on mississauga.ca +30 Days

November 7 to December 6, 2023

Budget Overview and Service Area Presentations to Budget Committee Nov. 27, 28, 29

Special Council meeting on Dec. 6 to adopt Budget Committee reports and any resolutions proposing budget amendments

+10 Days

December 6 to December 18, 2023

Mayor can veto proposed amendments to the budget

Mayor can also issue direction to shorten the veto period or to not exercise a veto +15 Days


December 18, 2023 to January 2, 2024

If any amendments are vetoed, Council has until Jan. 2 to meet and vote to override the mayoral veto

Council may also shorten the override period and have the budget adopted before the start of holidays (Dec. 22)



#### **Climate Change**

2024 Capital Budget Highlights:

- Hybrid bus acquisitions
   → 59% of the bus fleet will be hybrid by end of 2024
- Electric vehicle charging infrastructure installations
- LRT corridor enhancements
- LRT storm sewer improvements
- Fire Station 124



44% or \$236 million of budgeted projects in 2024 include some aspects of climate change mitigation and adaptation


#### Implement Cost Containment Strategies

- Service areas have identified cost savings of \$80.8 million since 2009





#### **Bill 23**

- Bill 23 and the Housing Pledge have been included in the 2024 Budget
- Bill 23 caused forecasted DC revenue to decrease, however the Housing Pledge includes nearly 4x the amount of growth compared to past budgets
- Additional growth comes with pressures on the capital budget which have been built into the latter years of the 10-year capital plan
- DC revenue loss has been experienced due to the statutory rental housing
- Majority of revenue loss will not be experienced until the latter five years of the ten-year budget



Build 1.5 million homes, 120,000 in Mississauga, in 10 years.



Less funding to build affordable housing.



Less parkland and developers choose where parks go.



Sacrifice environment, heritage, and greenbelt lands.





## 2024 Gross Capital Budget


