## **Purpose of this Report**

The purpose of this report is twofold:

- 1. Proposed Zoning By-law Amendments: Presenting recommendations to transition the Temporary Outdoor Patio Program and Temporary Outdoor Retail Sales & Display regulation, both set to expire on December 31, 2023, to as-of-right permissions within the Zoning By-law (for private lands).
- 2. Proposed Changes to Other City By-laws: Presenting proposed changes to other City by-laws (related to <u>public lands</u>) for both Seasonal Outdoor Patios and Retail Sales & Displays.

## **Community Engagement**

Community Engagement included:

- Targeted engagement sessions with the City's BIAs, Tourism Mississauga, Mississauga Board of Trade, Ontario Restaurant Hotel & Motel Association, Restaurants Canada, and local businesses
- 2. A social media campaign and Patio Survey with 708 responses which revealed strong support for outdoor patios, particularly in Port Credit BIA.

Insights from these engagements informed staff recommendations being presented.

## **Background - Temporary Patio Program**

- Temporary use by-law Approved in 2020 to allow restaurant establishments to expand outdoor seating on a temporary basis
- Temporary Patio Uses
   Expiring December 31,2023



### **Example: Patios on Private Lands**

Patios on Public lands (such as in Commercial Plazas) do not require a Permit



## **Example: Patios on Public lands**

Patios on City lands (Sidewalks and Lay-by Parking) require either a Permit or Encroachment Agreement



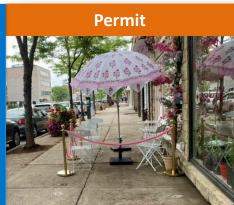

#### Seasonal Outdoor Patios (Private Lands):



#### **EXISTING SEASONAL PATIO REGULATION**

A seasonal outdoor patio is permitted accessory to a restaurant, convenience restaurant or take-out restaurant in these zones only

Not be permitted on landscaped areas or landscaped buffers

Minimum setback from Residential Zones

Not be permitted to occupy an accessible parking space

Minimum distance from accessible parking spaces to edge of a seasonal outdoor patio

Not permitted to obstruct driveways, parking aisles and pedestrian walkways

O1 to O3, C1 to C4, H-CC1 to H-CC4, H-CCO, CC1 to CC4, E1 to E3 zones

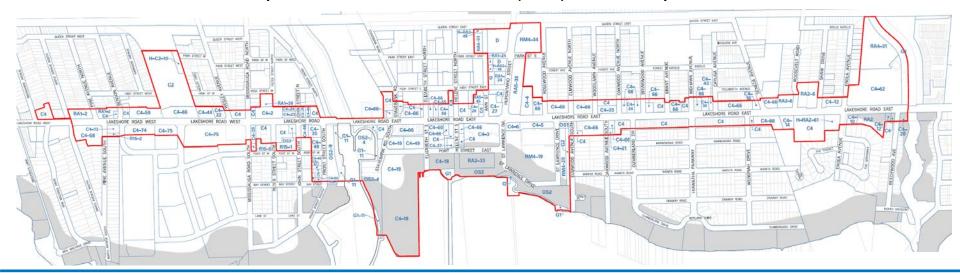

Revising the definition

# Temporary Outdoor Patio Seasonal Outdoor Patio means an accessory seating area, located adjacent to or within proximity of a restaurant, convenience restaurant or take-out restaurant, that may be covered by a temporary tent PROPOSED Seasonal Outdoor Patio means a temporary, outdoor seating area, located on a parking space or sidewalk which may be covered only by a temporary tent, and is operated as accessory to a restaurant, convenience restaurant or take-out restaurant.

#### Seasonal Outdoor Patios (Private Lands)



#### **EXISTING**

Minimum % of required parking spaces that shall remain available for use:

50%





Maximum number of required parking spaces that shall be used for a seasonal outdoor patio:

3.0 spaces per restaurant, convenience restaurant or take-out restaurant with a seasonal outdoor patio







#### Seasonal Outdoor Patios (Private Lands)

#### **PROPOSED**



- 1. A seasonal outdoor patio shall not be permitted on a rooftop
- 2. Minimum unencumbered sidewalk width for a seasonal outdoor patio located on a sidewalk = 1.5 m
- **3.** Allow **temporary tents to be permitted** for the duration that a seasonal outdoor patio is operated.

### Seasonal Outdoor Retail Sales & Display

(Private Lands)

#### SEASONAL OUTDOOR RETAIL SALES & DISPLAY REGULATION

Maximum number of required parking spaces that shall be used for a seasonal outdoor retail sales and display area

Minimum unencumbered sidewalk width for a seasonal outdoor retail sales and display located on a sidewalk

**2.0 spaces** per retail store with a seasonal outdoor retail sales and display area

1.5 m



#### **Permanent Patios** (Private Lands)



#### PERMANENT PATIO REGULATION

- 1. A permanent patio is permitted only in these zones
- 2. A permanent patio shall not be permitted on a rooftop
- 3. Minimum setback from Residential Zones
- 4. Permanent patios shall not obstruct driveways, parking aisles and pedestrian walkways
  - A permanent outdoor patio shall comply with the
- 5. setback or yard provisions of the zone in which it is located

O1 to O3, C1 to C4, CC1 to CC4, H-CC1 to H-CC4, H-CCO, CCO, E1 to E3

## **Permanent Patios: Site Plan Requirements**

Permitting Permanent Patios

 no longer having to apply for a Committee of Adjustment, Minor Variance

**However:** 

Site Plan Control would still apply



## **Restaurant Setback Requirement:**



#### Removing regulation requiring:

# Restaurants, Take-out Restaurants and Convenience Restaurants

to have a Minimum separation distance of **60 m** from Residential zones

#### However-

Restaurants, Take-out Restaurants and Convenience Restaurants that have patios will still be required to have a 6 m setback from Residential zones





Equates to approx. 20 storey building or length of an Ice Hockey Rink





## Public Lands – Other City by-laws

To ensure the continuity of outdoor patio and retail sales and display permissions on public lands, staff are proposing the following:

- Location Restriction: Seasonal outdoor patios & retail sales and displays will be confined to sidewalk areas within the City's right-of-way (ROW) lands
- Exception: Port Credit BIA area patios will be permitted to maintain seasonal and long-term (year round) structures on the city's sidewalks and lay-by parking spaces.
- Fee Waiver: Waiving the application and agreement fees for a period of 2 years

#### **Other Considerations**

Staff will also be working on the following initiatives:

#### Design Guidelines Update

Staff will be producing updated design guidelines for outdoor patios (both seasonal and permanent).

#### Streamlined Process

Optimizing the Outdoor Patio website and application process, and overall user experience for applicants.

#### Recommendation

That the recommendation of the **report be approved in accordance with the following**:

That implementing by-laws be enacted at a future City Council meeting, including by-laws that would allow seasonal outdoor patios and seasonal outdoor retail sales and displays to operate with waived fees for a period of two years until December 31, 2025.
