

DRAFT DESIGNATION STATEMENT

3625 Cawthra Road is a white ashlar marble three storey building. It is located southeast of Highway 403 and Burnhamthorpe Road on the east side of Cawthra Road.

The property has physical and design value as a unique example of traditional Byzantine and Ukrainian architecture blended with modern aesthetics materials and techniques. It has historical and associative value because it has direct association with the Ukrainian community in Mississauga. The church was also designed by architect Roman Dumyn who was a prominent figure in the Ukrainian community. Finally, it has contextual value as it is a landmark.

Heritage Attributes

- Modified Greek cross building shape
- Long and narrow ashlar marble brick walls
- Course grey tile belt covered above ground basement
- Flat roof with a large central peaked done with four spires in the corners
- Polygonal pavilions on the first-floor on each corner
- Copper covering each peak
- Copper trim at the top of the first and third floor
- Copper and coloured glass architectural feature on the front and back of the building
- Narrow colour glass pains in each pillar and the dome
- Gables on the roof at the end of each arm of the cross
