JAMES HARRIS DIES IN FIFTY-FIRST YEAR

Managing Director Was Abattoir Company Here

In the death yesterday afternoon from heart trouble of James Harris, Managing Director of the Harris Abattoir Company, in his fifty-first year, there passed one who was widely known in the packing-house industry of Canada, and who was a member of one of the East End pioneer families. Mr. Harris had been a semi-invalid for three years. and had not been actively associated with the business since last March.
