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Four Main Steps in Collecting and Releasing CMHC Construction Data

1. Monthly building permit reports collected from municipalities between the 1st and 10th working day of the month.
2. Permits for **new residential construction** and **conversions** reviewed and entered into our database. **Conversion starts** are recorded at this stage, as housing starts field enumeration only occurs for **new construction** homes.
3. Field enumerators receive **new construction** permits to track. They typically visit construction sites between the 10th and 15th working day of the month, recording **starts (“foundation” stage)**, completions & absorption information
4. **New construction** data released on the 11th working day of the following month, **conversions** data released on the final working day of the following month

Some Dwelling Types Are Not Tracked by CMHC

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- Dwellings without their own entrance, kitchen and bathroom (ex. **nursing homes***, **student housing***, hostels)

- Dwellings not permanently attached to a site (ex. mobile homes)



- Dwellings unsuitable for year-round occupancy (ex. summer cottages)



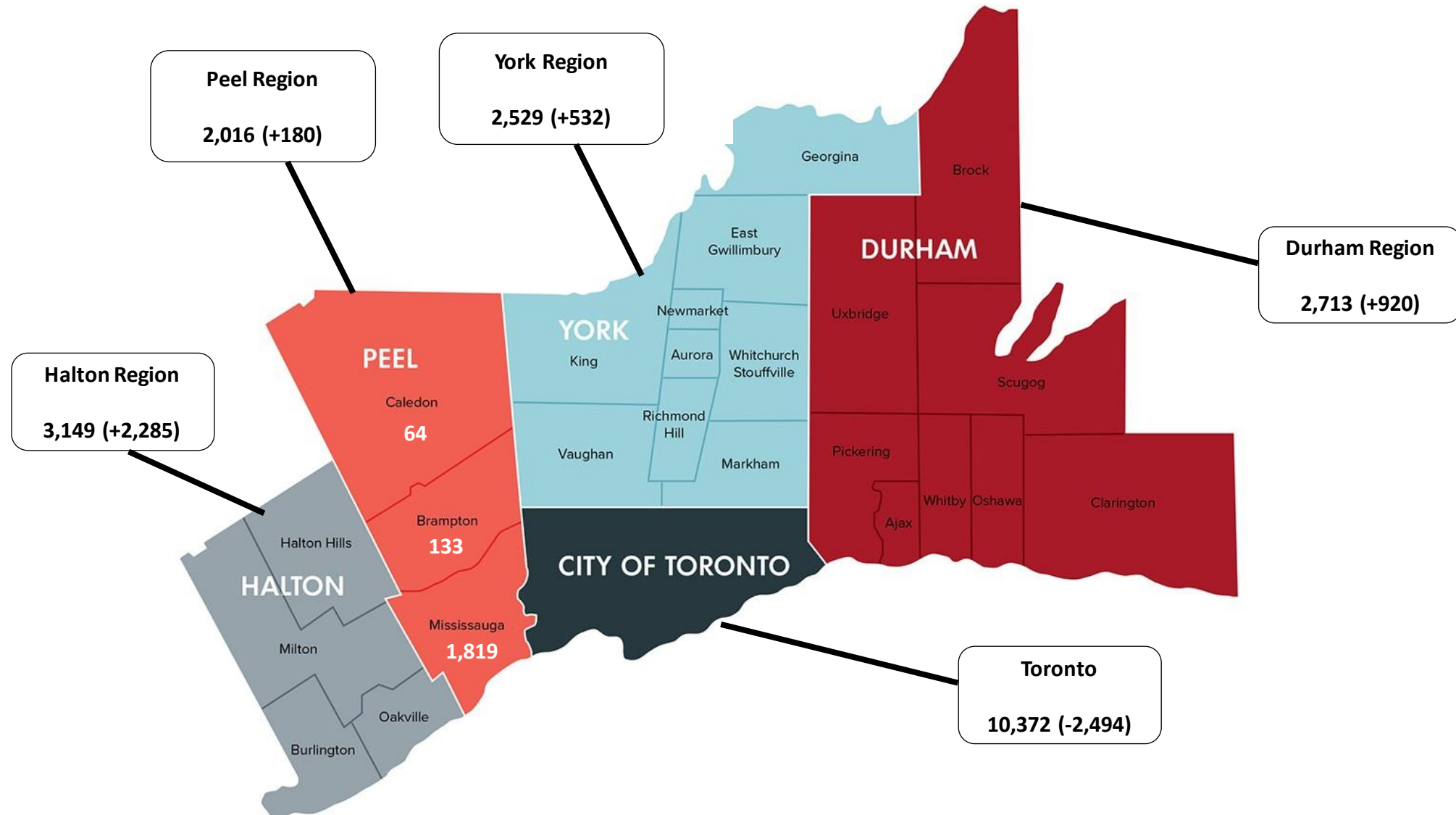

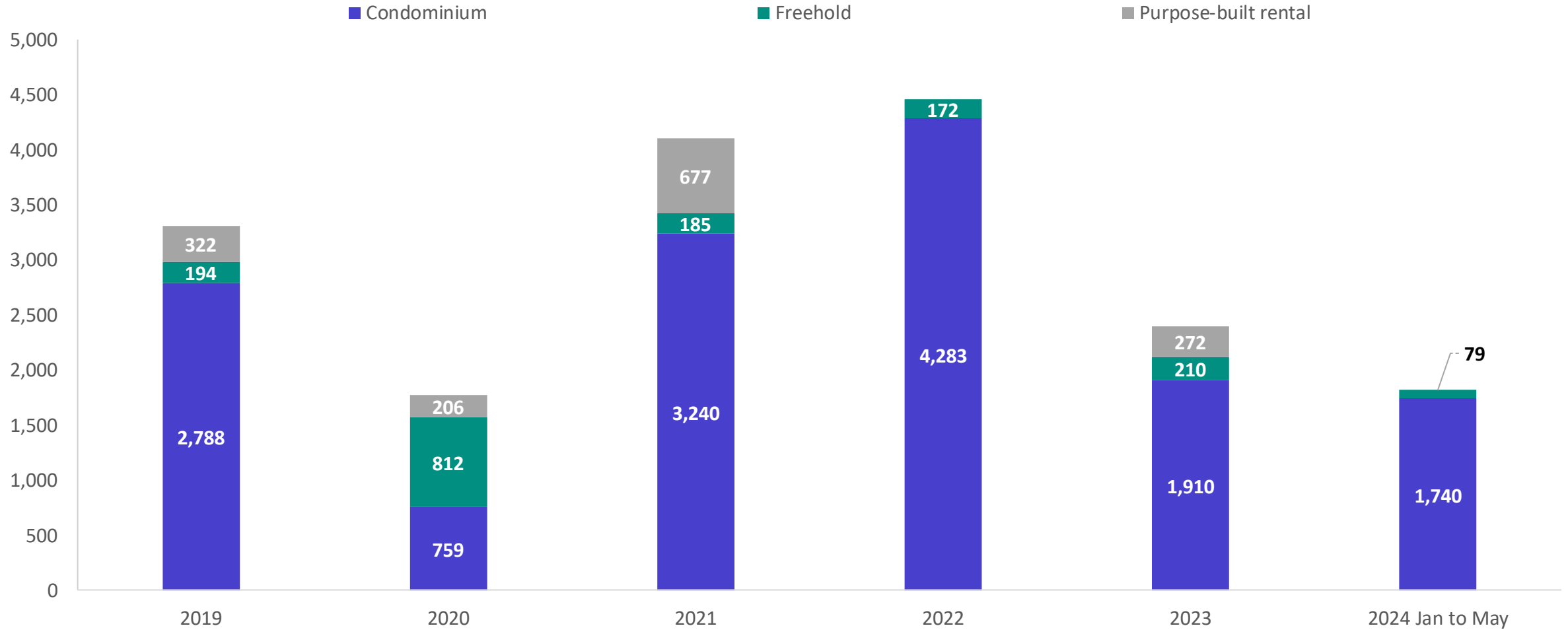
New construction starts activity up in 905 regions this year

New construction starts activity in Mississauga mostly condominiums

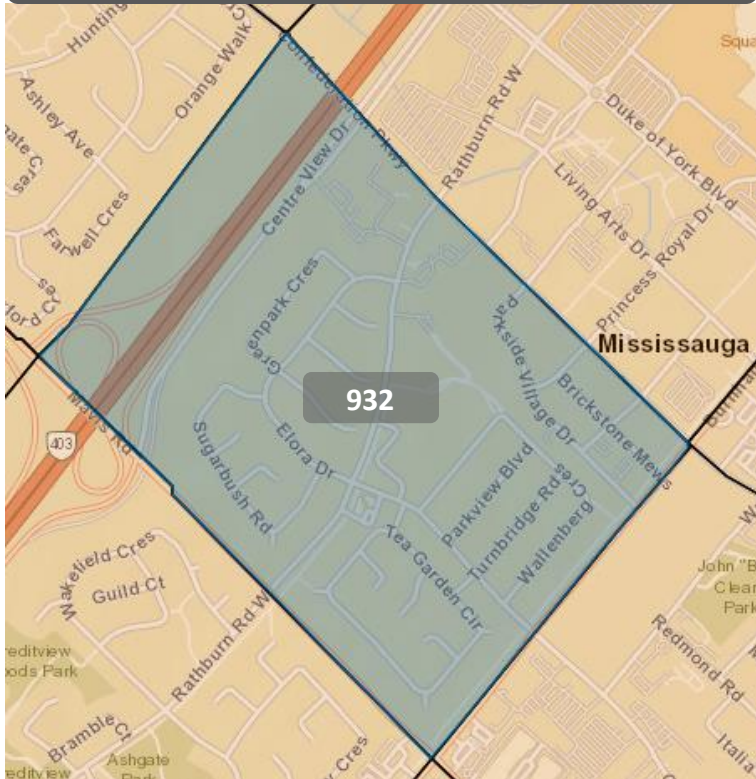
City of Mississauga new construction housing starts by intended market



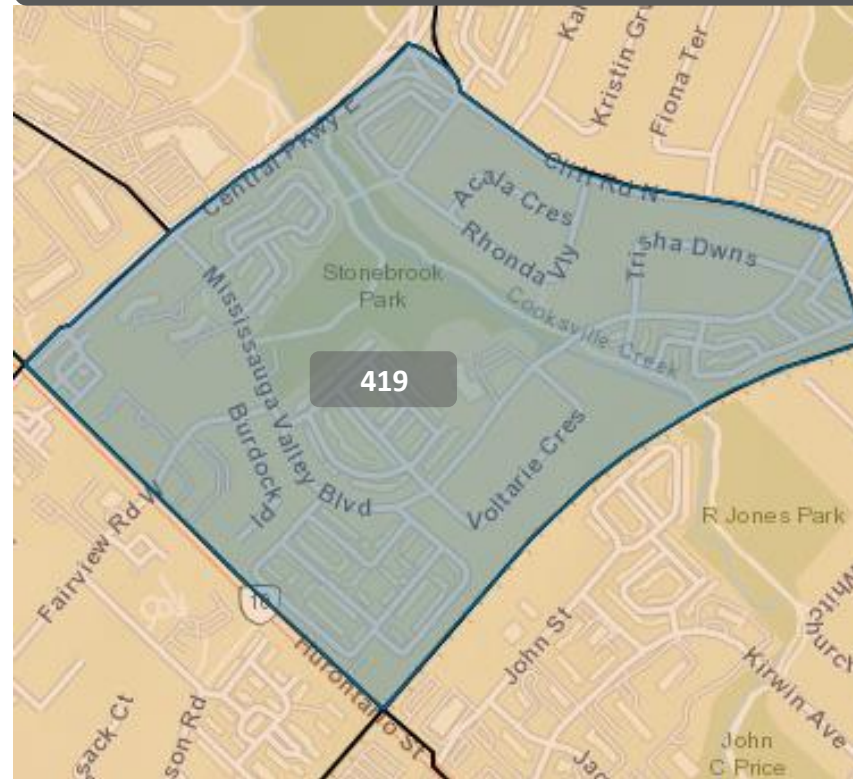
YTD new construction starts concentrated in a few neighbourhoods

January to May 2024 new construction housing starts in Mississauga = 1,819

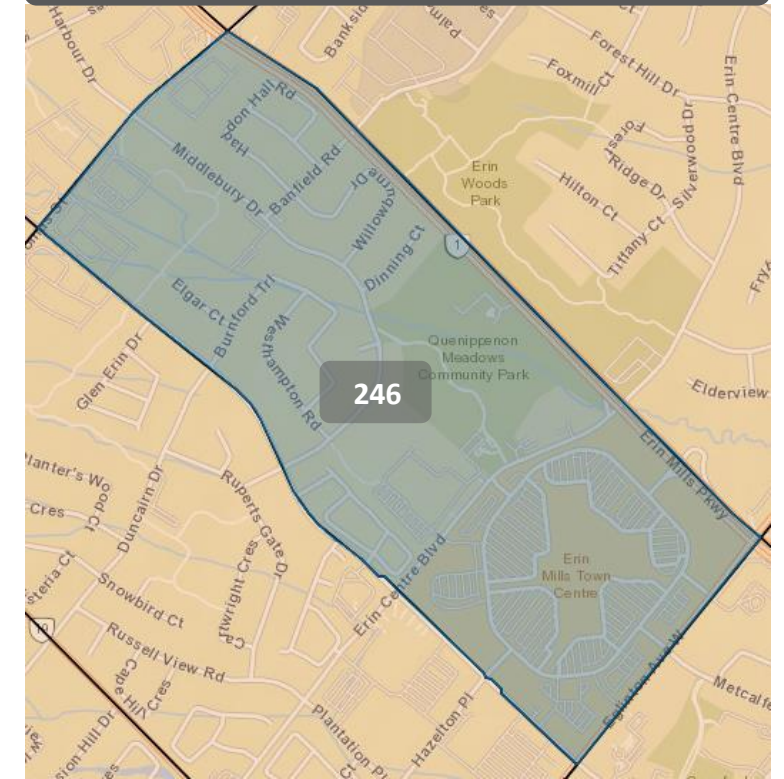
Census tract 527.11



Census tract 521.03

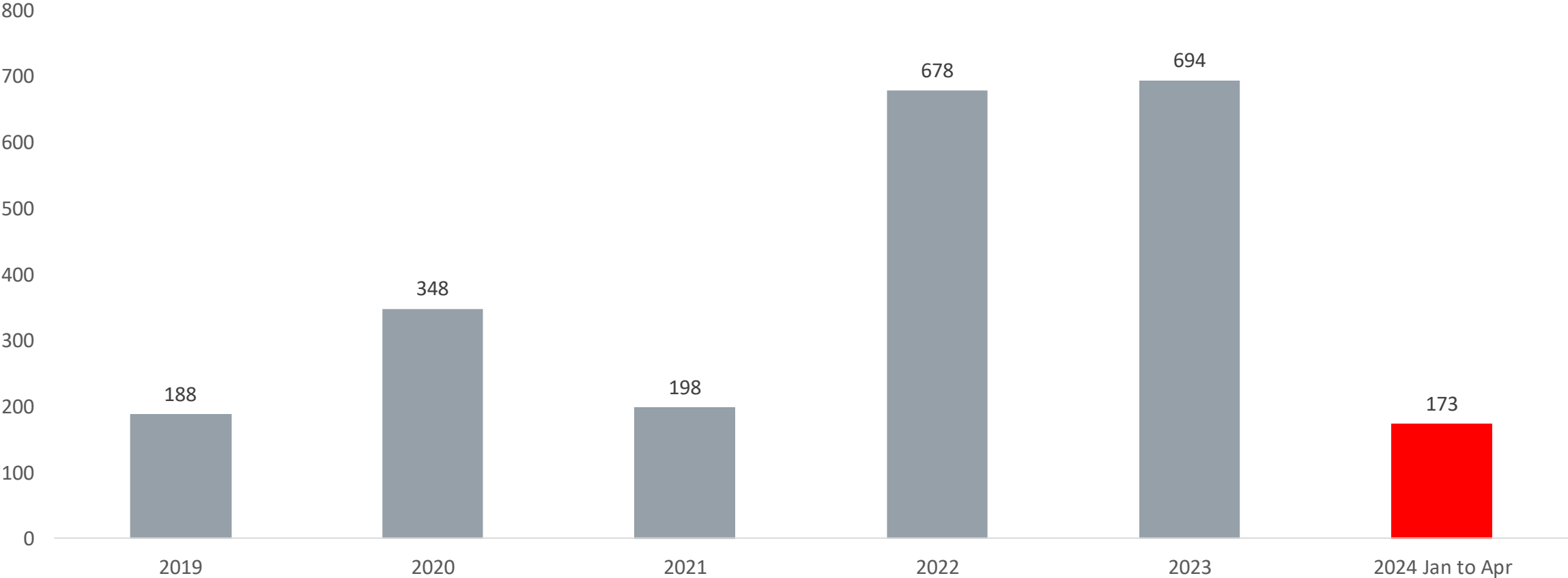


Census tract 516.43
