## WHY INVEST IN DANCE?


- 1. Increase social inclusion, quality of life

## THE ART SHELTER IS THE FUTURE



Sustainable, solar-powered.

Artist run, community led.

Unique model: artists exchange time & talent for space.

Built in response to the lack of creative space for professional dance artists (see the Dance Umbrella of Ontario Needs Assessment Report).

In its first 6 months of operation, the Art Shelter has:

Hosted 20 artists in residence

54 workshops & classes

11 community performances

Paid well over \$85,600 in professional artist fees



- Moving the Art Shelter to a City park


TOGETHER WE COULD BUILD A LEGACY
