

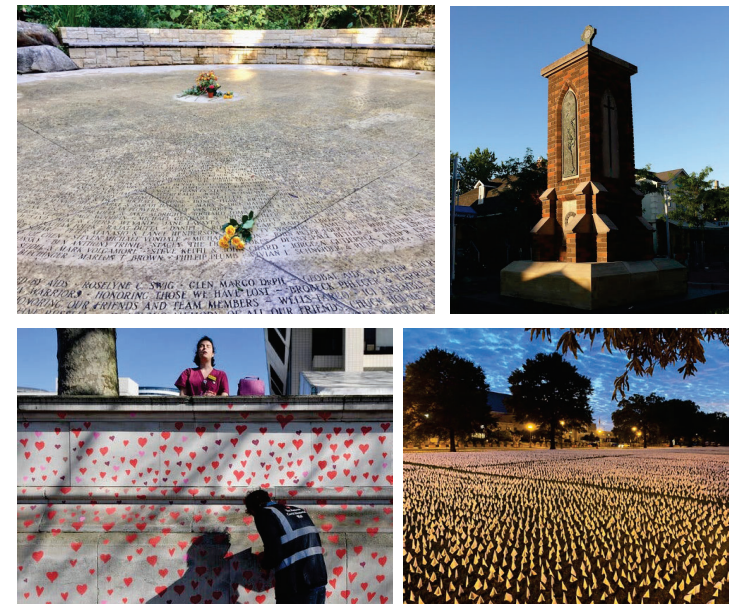
# Vision Zero Memorial

# Background

- The [Transportation Master Plan](#) and [Vision Zero Action Plan](#) recommend and allocate \$100,000 for a Vision Zero memorial for victims of fatal collisions in Mississauga
- The memorial will be designed and built by a professional artist or artist team. The commissioned artist(s) are expected to have experience and interest in working with community
- There will be an accompanying online memorial for people to remember their loved ones
- **We are here today to present our selected location for the memorial**



## Site Selection Process

- We created site selection criteria based on input from Road Safety Committee
- We evaluated parks across the city and shortlisted top candidates, which we presented to Road Safety Committee on September 26, 2023 for feedback
- The shortlisted parks were reviewed against the criteria and the highest scoring park is recommended for the memorial

Criteria	Weight
Accessibility	20%
Integration	15%
Contextual Relevance	20%
Feasibility & Maintenance	15%
Community Support	30%

Aligns with the criteria detailed and approved by Mississauga City Council in the [City Acquired Art Policy](#) and [Public Art Master Plan](#)

## Recommended Site: Streetsville Cemetery

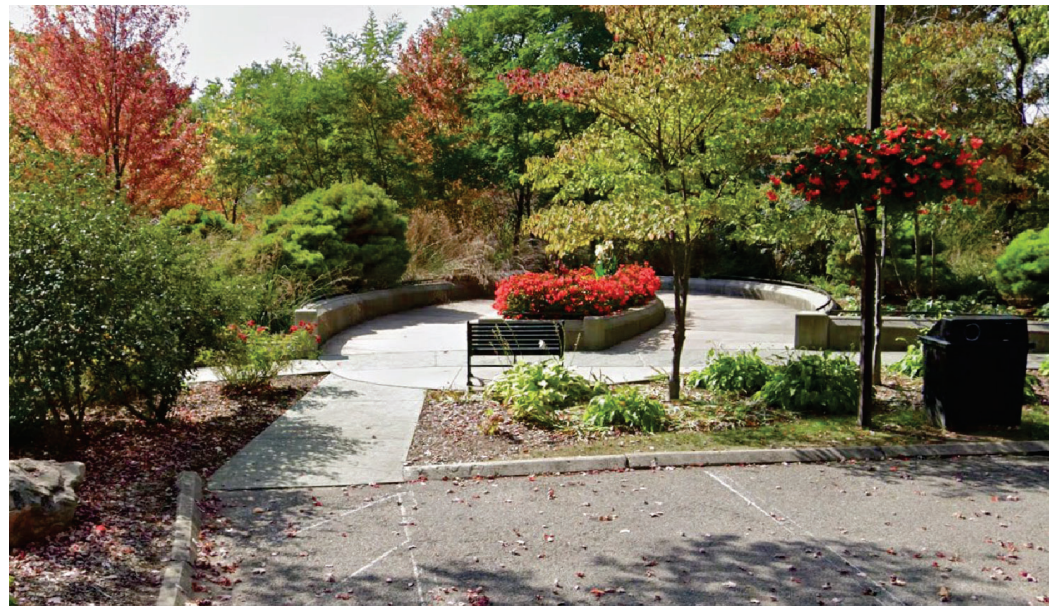
Streetsville Public Cemetery, 1786 Bristol Rd W





## Recommended Site: Streetsville Cemetery

- An accessible round walkway near the entrance can act as a perfect base for the artwork
- The area has parking and is accessible via car, transit, and bike
- It is wheelchair and walker accessible
- There is adequate room and contextual relevance for memorial vigils
- The trees and plants provide a natural soothing environment
