- The petition must be typed or legibly handwritten and printed on letter size paper. (No pencil)
- The petition must be appropriate and respectful in tone, and must not contain any improper or offensive language or information.
- Each petitioner must print and sign his or her own name, original signatures only. During the Covid-19 pandemic, electronic or typed signatures will be accepted.
- Each petitioner must provide his or her full address, including property's roll number for a noise wall petition.
- The petition must clearly disclose on each page that it will be considered a public document at the
 City of Mississauga and that the information contained in it may be subject to the scrutiny of the City
 and other members of the general public.

The following information outlines the purpose of the petition:

Purpose

Report dangerous road violations: 1.) Drivers disobey STOP SIGNS and fail to STOP; 2.) Speeding; 3.) Careless Driving; 4.) Stunt Driving; 5.) Hand-held communication devices used while driving; 6.) Vehicle and motorcycle noise violation; 7.) Bicycles use sidewalks because it is unsafe to use the road which in turn impacts pedestrian safety & movement. All of the above violations are occurring and there is no POLICE presence in our residential community. The nearby intersections are: 1.) Mineola Gardens & Atwater Avenue; 2.) Canterbury Road & Atwater Avenue; 3.) Mineola Gardens & Angelene Street.

Asking Council For

Action to implement a road safety program that includes: 1.) request POLICE monitoring and ticketing violators; 2.) installation of several speed bumps on Atwater Avenue. A reminder the road is a shared space and the rules in place are designed to keep everyone safe. Enforcement of the rules is essential to help ensure the saferty of oneself and everyone else on the road, at intersections and the sidewalks. There are several schools nearby and request action be taken before a tragedy happens.
