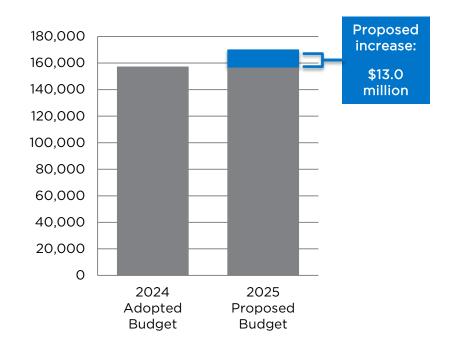
Key Objectives 2025–2028

- Firefighter Training to meet legislative requirements

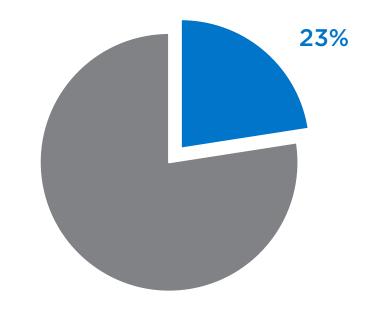




2025 Net Operating Budget \$000s

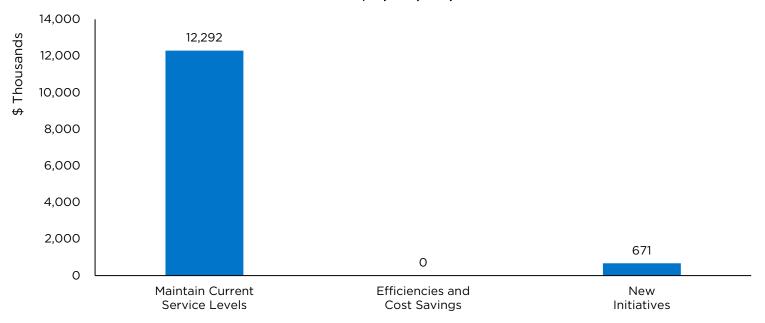


2025 Net 10.1.1 Operating Budget % of City

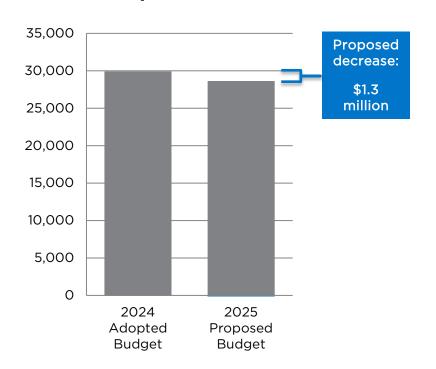




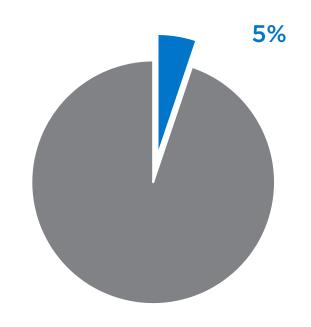

2025 Capital Projects

2025 projects are proposed to be funded at \$28.5 million and include:

- Renovation of five fire stations
- Construction of two new fire stations
- Lifecycle replacement of vehicles
- Replacement of personal protective equipment & equipment



10-Year Capital Plan

2025-2034 projects are proposed to be funded at \$341.7 million and include:

- Fire station renovations
- Design & construction of three new fire stations
- Lifecycle replacement of personal protective equipment
- Fire vehicle replacement
