Program Stabilization & Expanded Mandate

- 365/24/7 service delivery model with no increase to permanent staffing since 2003
 - Emergency calls service standards: 45 min response time service standard met 79% of the time in 2023, down from 93.9% in 2020
- Improved response to animal cruelty and neglect
- Enhanced public safety to respond address community safety concerns
- Promotion of responsible pet ownership
- Expansion of animal licensing programs
- Implementation of a robust pet licensing program
- Wildlife conservation and management (e.g., establishment of Coyote Management Program)
- Expansion of community engagement via the Animal Awareness & Responsibility Campaign

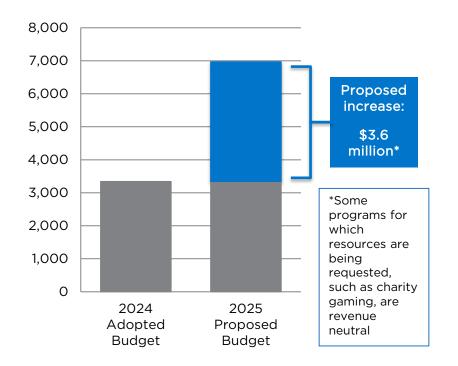

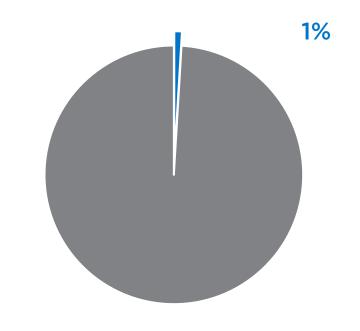
Increasing Volume & Efficient Response

- Additional housing types will require additional parking permits and enhanced enforcement tactics
- Paid parking permits expected to increase significantly with the introduction of New Parking Permit Program
- Community requires attention to safety-related calls compliance with Fire Route By-law, Accessible Parking By-law and the Idling By-law to maintain safe and secure roadways and properties
- Joint operations with enforcement personnel
- Establish permanent fleet to achieve cost savings over time, streamline operations, and ensure consistent and reliable service delivery standards

2025 Net Operating Budget \$000s

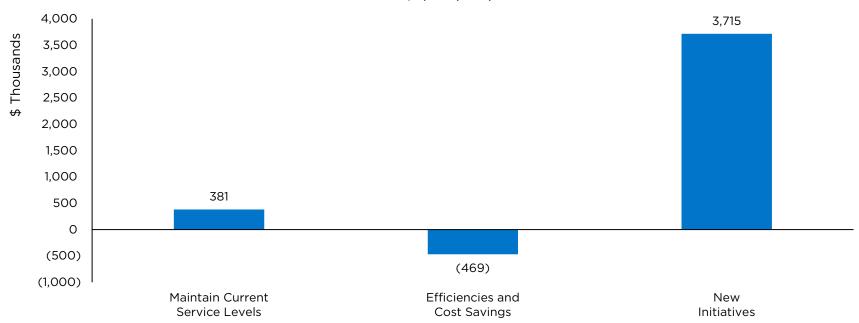
2025 Net Operating Budget % of City





2025 Operating Budget Changes

Net Increase: \$3,626,827, or 108.5%



Note: The New Initiatives value in this chart includes budget impacts from a joint initiative, "New Parking Permit Program and Enhanced Parking Enforcement". This new initiative includes a request for 37 FTEs and 7 vehicles, offset by revenue, and is being proposed by the Roads Service Area. In addition, the new initiatives value also includes charity gaming, which is revenue neutral.

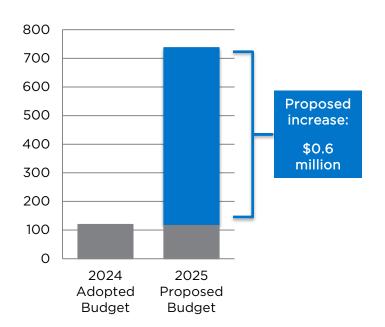
2025 Capital Projects
