The City's stormwater infrastructure helped to mitigate the impact of this near-record rainfall, demonstrating its role in assisting with protecting the city during extreme weather events.






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July and August 2024 Storm Response





- New projects and accelerated Capital Plan to target impacted neighborhoods
 - 6-year acceleration of Dixie-Dundas Flood Mitigation project
- New city program(s) to provide grants and rebates to impacted residents
- Increased inspection, maintenance and operating activities
- Application submitted to Housing-Enabling Water Systems Fund for Dixie-Dundas Project
- Coordinated assessment of impacted neighborhoods under the Disaster Recovery Assistance for Ontarians program



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2025 Net Operating Budget \$000s








2025 Operating Budget Changes

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



2025 Capital Projects

2025 projects are proposed to be funded at \$53.5 million and include:

- Malton Drainage Improvements Etude Dr. to Justine Dr. (\$5.3M)
- Osprey Marsh Dredging and Rehabilitation -Year 1 (\$4.2M)
- Cooksville Creek Erosion Control North and South of Camilla Rd. (\$5.2M)
- Streetsville Area Storm Sewer Capacity Assessment (\$900K)
- New: Storm Sewer Upgrades Malton Village (\$3.75M), Runningbrook Drive Outlet Pipe (\$1.18M), and Winding Trail Inlets (\$485K)





10-Year Capital Plan

2025-2034 projects are proposed to be funded at \$365 million and include:


- 2026 Dundas BRT Storm Sewer Improvements (\$2.5M), Port Credit Storm Drainage Improvements (\$3.5M), Fieldgate Dr. and Hedgestone Court CBs (\$975K)
- 2029 Credit River Erosion Control between Hemus Sq. and Queensway (\$2.8M)
- 2032 SWM Pond Dredging and Rehabilitation - Facility 4303 (\$4.1M), Cooksville Creek Erosion Control from King St. E. to Paisley Blvd. (\$3.7M)



Dixie-Dundas Flood Mitigation

Project completion accelerated at estimated cost of \$80 million:

- Partnerships with TRCA and close collaboration with Dundas BRT
- Single proponent management by City of Mississauga
- Expedited land acquisition at 30% design
- Streamlined utility relocation following 30% design
- Project to be budgeted for 2025 to 2028





Stormwater Reserves

- Capital and Pipe Reserve
 - Fully funding 10-year capital plan
 - Pipe Reserve for long term sewer replacements
- Response to July/Aug storms could result in negative closing balance of Capital Reserve following 2026



- To consider for future years to ensure reserves function as intended
 - Increase the stormwater charge rate beyond 3% annually
 - Redistribute capital projects
 - Adjust contributions to the Pipe Reserve
