

Vision:

Goal 1: Safe and Active Mobility

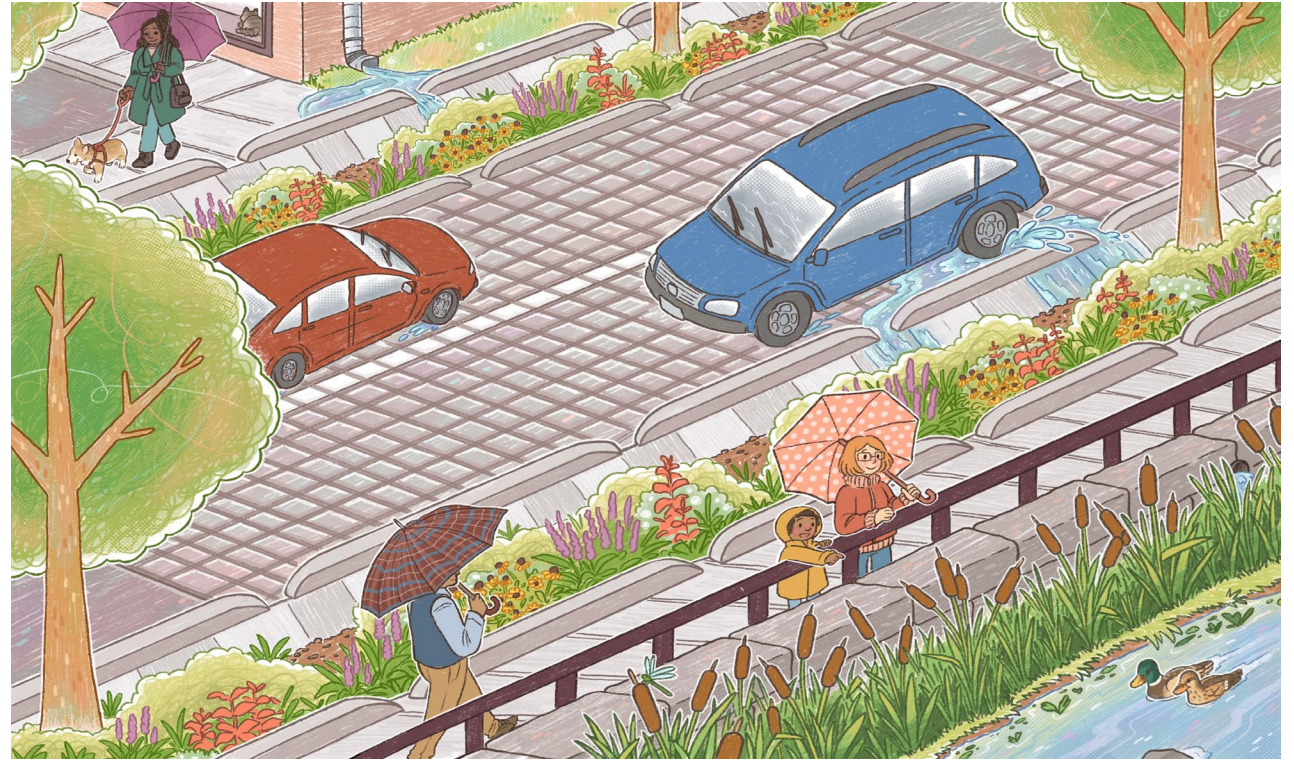


Statement:

Increase safety, accessibility, and comfort for those walking, cycling and using other active modes of transportation to increase ease of movement throughout the neighbourhood and encourage time spent outdoors.

4 Actions

Goal 2: Ready for Rain



Statement:

Improve flood preparedness and manage rain where it falls to control the quantity and quality of stormwater.

5 Actions

Goal 3: Access to Fresh Food



Statement:

Increase access to fresh food and facilitate knowledge-sharing and skill-building around growing and preparing fresh food.
