Choice and Compassion.

Where would you spend your final days?

If you're like most Canadians, you would prefer to pass away at home in comfortable, familiar surroundings with your loved ones by your side.

But say you are at home, and your condition worsens. What are your choices?

Your loved ones now become your round-the-clock caregivers, barely having time to sit with you or even hold your hand. They are not health care professionals, so eventually they have no choice but to bring you to the hospital — the last place any of us wishes to be when we die.

Your Hospice Centre is dedicated to providing *exceptional personalized care that allows individuals to live every remaining moment to its fullest* with their loved ones by their side knowing they are supported as well.

Located at 2176 Speakman Drive (QEW/Erin Mills), Mississauga's new Hospice Centre will be 40,000 sq.ft of specialized care spaces and also our administrative centre for our community programs. Twelve specialized care suites are at the core of the new centre including two specialized suites for isolation and bariatric related needs. Dedicated spaces for our day programs; wellness; and counselling programs along with welcoming gathering spaces including living, dining, and reflective spaces for families and loved ones. The Centre will also consist of several meeting spaces and kitchens for food service.

The Facts Matter

Hospices disproportionately rely on community for support!

- Hospice care is ***equitable care*** as it is provided at no-charge to the individual or family. This is important as ***many clients self-report as being low-income.***
- 70% of those we serve have ***cancer*** related illness and this is projected to ***grow by 120%*** by 2030.
- It is the most cost efficient method of providing end of life care and bereavement supports. Hospice care ***costs 33% less*** than the same care in an acute care setting. ***Yet hospices receive just 60% of funding to deliver care.*** Relying on donations to cover the gap.
- Even more challenging is that approved hospices receive ***just 10% of the capital costs*** to build a hospice centre, hospitals receive 90%.
- It is recommended to have 7 hospice beds for every 100,000 people in a community, ***we currently have zero.***

Your new Hospice Centre is the first, and significant, step in addressing these needs.

Our Services

Hospice Counselling

Professional Hospice Counsellors provide emotional, psychosocial, and spiritual support. Our counsellors help families navigate complex emotions and offer guidance and tools for coping. We help the dying understand the physical and emotional changes that may occur as death approaches.

Spiritual Care

It involves addressing spiritual and existential questions. It begins with respect and understanding, recognizing that each culture has unique values and beliefs about life's purpose. This care includes exploring meaning, prayer, and rituals. We also provide guidance for funerals and celebrations of life.

Bereavement Support

We offer one-to-one counselling, support groups, a bereavement education series, and workshops. Our counsellors help individuals to process their emotions and feelings. We help them adjust to life without their loved ones and help them work through grief and connect with others who are also grieving.

Social Connections

On a weekly basis, those living with a life-limiting illness can gather, connect and socialize through our Social Connections program. We run activities, have conversations, and select entertainment for participants to create a sense of normalcy for them.

Wellness

Through an interactive and integrative experience, clients and caregivers learn new self-care wellness skills and tips. Complementary therapies promote a sense of peacefulness, comfort and relaxation. They include Gentle Aroma Touch; Reiki; and Therapeutic Touch. We offer workshops, guided meditation, restorative yoga, journaling, music therapy and art therapy. Although our programs are not curative in nature, they can be healing.

Help Us Understand Grief (HUUG)

Like adults, children and youth can experience intense grief. Our HUUG counsellors offer age-appropriate support. We help children find ways to communicate and support one another in their grief and to maintain connections with loved ones who have died. We work in collaboration with school boards to inform and educate administrative staff about end of life care and grief support resources.

24/7 Hospice Palliative Care Helpline

Our helpline provides support, guidance, information, and counselling services. Individuals, families, and health care providers can call the Helpline at any time. Helpline support is delivered by clinical Hospice staff and available 24/7.



Rallying Community



We launched a \$28 million campaign to build the first Hospice Centre in the city. Located at 2176 Speakman Drive within the Sheridan Park Corporate Centre. The new Hospice Centre will add a critical new dimension to our current end-of-life care services and will be able to provide appropriate care for Mississauga's culturally diverse community.

We have secured \$17.1 million in funding and commitments. The Region of Peel and City of Mississauga have waived development charges. The City has also donated \$1 million in funding to the project and \$3 million contributed from the Ministry of Health.


Community is rallying to our call with leadership donations from The Welton Family, FDC Foundation, Esther and Keith D'Silva, Gerry Beasley, Lakeview Village, The Calderelli Family, Credit Valley Cares, The Rockett Family, Virgil Pires Foundation and many others.

Completing the Care Continuum

Hospice Mississauga's new 12-bed hospice centre will be co-located with two new long-term care facilities built as part of Partners Community Health's new Seniors' Campus of Care – Wellbrook Place.

We have confirmation from the Ministry of Health for full funding for direct client care for the 12 beds in the centre. This funding represents about 60% of the costs of operating and supporting care for the 250-350 projected individuals that will use these specialized care suites over a year.

Hospice Mississauga will be a hub for integrated palliative care teams, build capacity and knowledge across the continuum of Mississauga's health system, and bring innovative approaches to palliative care and partnerships to long-term care settings. It will support the delivery of more compassionate, culturally aware, human-centred palliative and end-of-life care for our community and the regional health system.

First Floor Layout

The Care Suites area that consists of a Nursing/Team Station, 12 Care Suites of which two are specialized for Bariatric and Isolation needs, and three special spaces including a Quiet Room, Reflection Room and larger Sun Room for gatherings.


Second Floor Layout

Second Floor is accessible by elevator and stairs and has dedicated spaces for our Children and Youth Program (HUUG), Wellness, and Help Line offices.
