

Application of Rebate Calculation Formulas from other Municipalities

Below staff have applied rebate calculation formulas used by two other municipalities to contributions made during Mississauga's 2024 by-election. Staff chose to use Oakville's formula, because the maximum possible rebate payment is the highest next to Toronto's. Toronto's formula is similar to Mississauga's, so it was not chosen.

Additionally, staff applied Ottawa's formula because the maximum possible rebate payout is the lowest except in situations where a candidate has withdrawn.

Assumed Residential Eligibility Requirements	Minimum Contribution	Rebate Calculation Formula	Maximum Allowable Rebate	Estimated payout if used in Mississauga during the 2024 by-election
Eligible electors that are Mississauga residents.	\$100	Based on Oakville's formula: 50% of all eligible contributions up to the maximum.	\$600	\$280k
Eligible electors that are Mississauga residents.	\$25.01	Based on Ottawa's formula: 50% of the total contribution for contributions equal to or greater than \$25.01 and not more than \$100. \$50 plus 25% of the amount by which the contribution exceeds \$100 for contributions greater than \$100.	\$75*	\$80k

**The maximum rebate paid to an individual may not exceed \$75 except for candidates who withdrew their nomination in accordance with the MEA. In such circumstances, the rebate to an individual is 75% up to a maximum of \$900. This part of Ottawa's formula was not used in the calculation above.*
