Dear Mayor Parrish,

On September 25, 2025, Premier Ford announced the government's intention to introduce legislation that would, if passed, repeal municipalities' authority to operate speed cameras. The announcement also highlighted plans to introduce new signage for installation in school zones where municipal speed cameras are currently in place.

To that end, I am requesting the below information by October 17, 2025 in order to allow ministry officials and municipal staff to coordinate effectively and ensure the timely installation of signage by November 14, 2025.

Ministry Information Request

Ministry officials will work closely with municipal staff to coordinate all aspects of this process to ensure school zones are clearly identified.

To ensure a smooth process, we will require information on school zones in your municipality that currently use municipal speed cameras. Please provide the following to Logan Purdy, Regional Director, Central Region with the Ministry of Transportation, Logan.Purdy@ontario.ca by **Friday, October 17, 2025**, pursuant to subsection 206.3(1) of the *Highway Traffic Act*:

- Names of schools, addresses and details of the corresponding school zones
- Posted speed limit for each school zone
- Details on how the speed limit is applied for each school zone (e.g., always reduced, reduced only when flashing or reduced during specific times of day)
- Whether speed cameras are mobile or fixed for each school zone
- Any other relevant information.

Ministry staff will be in touch shortly to begin coordination. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Logan Purdy.

School Zone Signage

The government is committed to ensuring school zones remain clearly marked for drivers. Temporary signs will be installed in school zones where fixed municipal speed cameras are currently in place by **November 14, 2025**.

Permanent signage will follow pending further regulatory changes. This phased approach will ensure drivers remain aware of school zones and give municipalities sufficient time to implement permanent measures.

New Provincial Funding

To support municipalities during this transition, the province plans to establish a time-limited fund to support traffic calming measures, enhanced signage and other local safety measures where municipal speed cameras are discontinued. The ministry will provide information on the application process and timelines as details are finalized.

Thank you for your continued partnership. I look forward to working with you to ensure temporary school zone signs are in place by November 14, 2025, and support an effective transition to traffic calming measures within your community.
