Request to Demolish a Heritage Listed Property: 965 Whittier Crescent (Ward 2)

Recommendation

That the property at 965 Whittier Crescent, which is listed on the City's Heritage Register, is not worthy of heritage designation, and consequently, that the owner's request to demolish proceed through the applicable process, as per the Corporate Report from the Commissioner of Community Services dated January 5, 2021.

Background

Section 27.3 of the *Ontario Heritage Act* states that structures or buildings on property listed on the City's Heritage Register cannot be removed or demolished without at least 60 days' notice to Council. This legislation allows time for Council to review the property's cultural heritage value to determine if the property merits designation.

Comments

The owner of the subject property has submitted a heritage application to demolish the existing detached dwelling. The subject property is listed on the City's Heritage Register as it forms part of the Lorne Park Estates cultural landscape, recognized as a unique mature forest shoreline community that developed as a resort in the 19th century. The Heritage Impact Assessment and Arborist Report are attached as Appendices 1 and 2 respectively. It is the consultant's conclusion that the house at 965 Whittier Crescent is not worthy of heritage designation. Staff concurs with this opinion.

Financial Impact

There is no financial impact resulting from the recommendation in this report.

Conclusion

The owner of 965 Whittier Crescent has requested permission to demolish a structure on a property that is listed on the City's Heritage Register. The applicant has submitted a Heritage

Impact Assessment that provides information, which does not support the building's merit for designation under the Ontario Heritage Act.
