Residents' Petition

Ongoing Sunday Noise, Traffic Safety, and Bylaw Concerns Hurontario Street & Burnhamthorpe Road – Ward 4

To: Councillor John Kovac, Ward 4

Executive Summary

Residents living near the intersection of Hurontario Street and Burnhamthorpe Road have experienced weekly disturbances every Sunday for more than four years due to ongoing protest activities at the intersection. These gatherings typically occur from approximately 12:00 PM until late afternoon or early evening, often lasting between four and six hours.

Observed activities frequently include:

- Amplified music and megaphones
- Encouraged vehicle horn honking
- Large banners and signage attached to public infrastructure
- Inflatable figures and temporary structures
- Distribution of printed materials to motorists

Residents respect the right to peaceful protest and freedom of expression. However, the duration, scale, and noise levels have created persistent disruption for nearby residents, particularly seniors living in surrounding condominium buildings.

Introduction

We, the undersigned residents of Mississauga, respectfully submit this petition regarding ongoing demonstrations taking place at the intersection of Hurontario Street and Burnhamthorpe Road in Ward 4. These gatherings occur almost every Sunday, typically beginning around 12:00 PM and lasting approximately four to six hours. This pattern of activity has now continued for more than four years, beginning in approximately February 2022.

Nature of the Activities

Residents have consistently observed amplified sound systems, megaphones, continuous horn honking, large banners and signs attached to public infrastructure, inflatable figures, temporary structures, and distribution of printed materials to motorists stopped at traffic lights.

Frequency and Duration

Unlike occasional demonstrations, these gatherings occur nearly every Sunday and last approximately four to six hours. The cumulative impact of this weekly disruption over several years has significantly affected nearby residents.

Impact on Residents

Residents report persistent noise disturbance, difficulty enjoying quiet time in their homes, and increased stress due to recurring weekly disruption. Many residents in the area are seniors who are particularly affected by prolonged noise.

Traffic and Public Safety Concerns

Residents have observed demonstrators approaching vehicles stopped at traffic lights, drivers being distracted by large signs and inflatables, and encouragement of horn honking, raising concerns about driver distraction and intersection safety.

Public Safety & Liability Considerations

The intersection of Hurontario Street and Burnhamthorpe Road is one of the busiest in Mississauga. Activities such as large signs near traffic signals, inflatable structures, and demonstrators approaching vehicles may contribute to driver distraction and unpredictable traffic behaviour. Encouragement of excessive horn use and the distribution of materials to motorists stopped at traffic lights may also increase the potential for sudden driver reactions, congestion, or collision risk. Residents believe these circumstances raise broader public safety concerns and may expose the municipality to liability should a preventable traffic incident occur where known safety risks were not addressed. Residents therefore request that the City review the situation from both a traffic safety and municipal risk management perspective.

Requested Actions

Residents respectfully request that the City review this matter, clarify whether permits have been issued for these gatherings, assess noise levels and compliance with the Noise Control By-law, review signage and structures on public infrastructure, evaluate traffic safety concerns associated with distributing materials to motorists, and provide clear guidance on enforcement procedures for recurring demonstrations in residential areas.

Appendix A – Relevant Municipal Regulations

- Noise Control By-law 0360-1979 – regulates excessive noise and amplified sound in residential areas.
- Traffic By-law 0555-2000 – addresses activities that interfere with traffic flow and pedestrian safety.
- Sign and Public Nuisance Regulations – restrict placement of banners or signage on public infrastructure.
- Municipal permit requirements – structures such as tents or inflatables on municipal property may require approval.
- Regulations governing promotional or commercial activity in public spaces.
