 5. That Fireworks Licensing and Use By-law 0182-2023, as amended, be further amended to prohibit individuals from leaving behind debris or casings after setting off fireworks.
 6. That Marina By-law 0187-2005, as amended, be further amended to prohibit the possession and/or use of fireworks in a marina.
 7. That all necessary by-laws be enacted.

 3. That Council approve one permanently funded full-time equivalent (FTE) at a Grade I to be funded from PN 26203 as of May 1, 2026 to prepare for the transition of waste collection services from the Region of Peel to the City of Mississauga. The position will be funded from the operating budget beginning October 1, 2027, subject to budget adoption.
